Borden County Livestock Show Proves To Be Successful

The annual Borden County Junior Livestock Show was held January 19, 20 & 21, 1995. On hand in Gail were a large crowd of participants, parents, grandparents and friends to take part in this annual agricultural activity. 41 lambs, 119 swine and 38 steers were entered and exhibited.

Thursday, the 19th, at 6:00 p.m. was the time set for the lamb show. Anticipation was high as the first call for the Finewool Lambs came, starting the competition.

Everybody working together; the kids, the

teachers, the parents, the officials and the judges is what the Junior Livestock Association mainly focuses on. The ability of the exhibitors to handle their animals, the knowledgeable way they answer the judges questions, the condition of the show animals and the kids neat appearance are all part of the learning experience of being in the 4-H and FFA organizations.

Richard Laverty, First Baptist Church pastor, was once again behind the microphone to announce that the exhibitors and their animals were ready to

enter the turf floored ring. The artificial turf, which is in its seventh year of use, is not only easier than dirt to handle, it helps keep allergies down to a minimum and the animals seem to show up better on the grass-like green color. Next to Richard at the announcer table was Van York, County Judge. In his capacity as record keeper for the show, one of his duties is to make sure that each exhibitor is placed correctly for tabulation of the records.

Lisa Ludecke working in the capacity as clerk, organized the distribution of ribbons, banners, belt badges and buckets which was handed to each winning exhibitor by Nicole Lawrence, FFA Sweetheart.

John Farris, CEA-Ag, Lamesa did another fine job as Classifier for this year's show.

Monty Paxton returned as auctioneer for the premium sale. He always does a great job making all the hard work the kids have put in on their animals pay off for them. The BCJLA appreciates his enthusiasm when he comes to Gail.

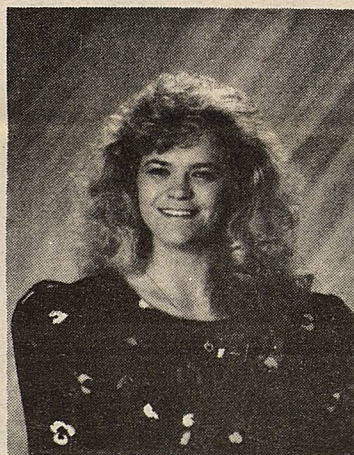
COACH'S COMMENTS: By Coach Dyess

LAMB SHOW

Denny Belew, Ag Teacher, Tahoka, judged the lamb show Thursday evening. Denny did not do a hurry-up job, but took ample time looking, studying and comparing each animal. He said that he did not want to rush into making a decision that would not reflect his opinion on the merit of each lamb.

After long consideration of each animal, Mr. Belew chose a Medium Weight Cross shown by Jill Voss for Grand Champion and a Finewool shown by Tanner Poole as Reserve Grand Champion. This is another win for Jill and her family.

SWINE SHOW

Early Friday morning, things got underway as each contestant came to the show barn to feed, water and groom their animal. At 8:30 a.m., show announcer, Richard Laverty called for the Light Weight Black OPB's to enter the ring and get the show underway.

Returning judge Dirk Aaron, CEA-Ag, from Brownfield, made careful progress in the elimination of swine among the 119 shown, on his way to choosing the Grand Champion.

He did a fine job examining each exhibitor's animal and took his time on his choices. He also commented on the fine quality of kids that he saw in Borden County.

Dirk commented on how well the exhibitors did

in showing their animals and what a good class of swine they had to show.

Mr. Aaron chose a Heavy Weight Cross shown by Reagan Smith as Grand Champion and Faith Farmer's Light Weight White OPB as the Reserve Champion.

STEER SHOW

Although the sun was shining, the air was crispy cold when everyone gathered at the show barn early Saturday morning for the finale. The kids were anxious to get into the show ring with their animals.

Sam Field, CEA-Ag, Morton, served as judge for this last event. He was last in Gail as an ag teacher and had not been back for fifteen years, but he said he would always have fond memories of this fine community.

One of the traditions he said he was glad was still going on was the awarding of a feed bucket to breed champions. He always wanted to win one himself.

He did a fine job deciding on the best of the classes out of the 38 steers he judged. After much deliberation, he chose a Heavy Weight Euro-Euro Cross shown by Kurt Hess as Grand Champion and a Heavy Weight British-British Cross shown by Grant Key as Reserve Grand.

Again serving as Showmanship judge was Greg Hogg, Ag. Teacher-Brownfield. The exhibitors made Mr. Hogg's job very hard as each one of them did an extra fine job of showing their animals. But because of his interest in the kids and their projects, he did a fine job with this difficult task.

Asthma Management: An Expert's Perspective

(DM)—Dr. Miles M. Weinberger, Professor of Pediatrics and Director, Allergy and Pulmonary Division at The University of Iowa Hospitals and Clinics, Iowa City, is a nationally-recognized authority on the treatment of childhood asthma. To provide asthma control while minimizing the risk of toxicity, Dr. Weinberger and other physicians prefer to prescribe a theophylline preparation that provides more consistent serum levels, with minimal fluctuation throughout the day. Some theophyllines, such as Slo-bidTM Gyrocaps[®], are effective over 24 hours with convenient once- or twice-daily dosing. This is especially helpful during the night to increase patient comfort. "I find it useful that Slo-bid can be taken either intact or



opened and sprinkled on food for patients who have difficulty in swallowing," continued Dr. Weinberger.

There are 15 different sustained-release theophylline formulations distributed under more than 25 brand names. Even with so many theophylline formulations available, physicians can carefully select the most appropriate agent based on the needs of the individual patient.

Some sustained-release theophyllines have a lower level of substitution than others, increasing the likelihood of a patient receiving the exact medication prescribed by the physician. For example, an average of 99 percent of prescriptions written for Slo-bidTM are dispensed precisely as written by the physician.

"With appropriate medical measures," concluded Dr. Weinberger, "the vast majority of asthma episodes and complications is preventable." Dr. Weinberger is the author of *Managing ASTHMA* (Williams &

Wilkins, 1990), as well as numerous journal articles and publications on the treatment of asthma.
