

Scurry County, From the Stockman Journal.

Moore Bros. & Shannon will ship from Colorado today 1,000 head of cattle, 700 head of two year old steers and 300 head of dry cows. These cattle will go to Kansas to be pastured during the spring and summer and will be prepared for the fall market.

W. Fuller, of Memphis, Tenn., who recently purchased approximately 100 sections of Scurry country land, has purchased the ranches of T. J. Clegg and Ira Kutch; terms not made public.

Bush & Tiller received yesterday 700 head of steers, coming twos, which they had been wintering with Scurry Co. farmers at \$1.75 per head. They were well pleased with their experiment, their loss on this bunch being four head; less than one per cent.

From the Midland Reporter.

R. & Dell Dublin last week sold to Williams & O'Connor, of Iowa, 1400 steers. There were 700 twos and 700 ones, and the price was \$13.50 and \$14 for yearlings and \$17 for twos. They are to be shipped to Sioux City for feeders.

Scott & Robertson recently shipped 200 head of cattle from Stanton to Kansas City. It is reported that cattle in the country tributary to Stanton are in fine shape, considering the long continued dry weather and shortage of grass.

Wolves are getting bad in some sections of the state and are killing many young calves. Last week in Hartley county one stockman killed nine lobos on his ranch. The bounty on these is \$10 per head for grown ones.

Quincy Cooper got in this week from his ranch twenty-five miles south of Monument, N. M. He says absolutely all the grass in that country has disappeared, and that the cattle are merely existing on what mesquite and shinery leaves that can be had.

J. E. Crossett returned the first of the week from his ranch south of Monahans. He gave a very adverse report from that section, stating that there is hardly any grass, and if rain don't come soon the loss there will be appaling.


