THE EDITOR'S TRIP.

It is usually expected of one
who travels to write some
account of his trips, especi-
ally if said traveler be an editor.

During our week's absence, we
have visited in the following or-
der the three largest towns in this
section: Snyder, Colorado and
Big Springs. The country we
passed through is a fine farming
region and plowing for the next
crop is well under way. In the
Dunn neighborhood much cotton
is still in the field; caused by the
prevailing scarcity of pickers. A
large portion of Mr. Williams'
fine crop has not even been picked
the first time.

In the triangle between these
three embryo cities is body of as
fine farming land as can be found
anywhere in the State. Add to
this the adjacent fine cattle coun-
try and their large trade and rap-
id growth are easily explained.
Snyder the best inland city in
West Texas, with a population of
2000 is really a trade rival of Col-
orado. Not content with the fine
public school of nearly 400 pupils
they are agitating the building of
a modern university. On ac-
count of its extreme healthfulness
and the wholesome moral atmos-
phere which prevails wherever
the crumhorn is outlawed. Sny-
der is an admirable location for
any kind of a school. In spite of
its previous growth, Snyder just
keeps growing.

Colorado, which we next visited
has some advantage over Snyder,
being a railroad town and well lo-
cated for a wholesale trade. A
branch of Radford Bros. whole-
sale grocery house, the large dry
goods house of Burns & Bell and
many other large concerns make
it unnecessary for the small mer-
chant to send east for goods, since
goods can be bought here at St.
Louis prices plus freight chargee.
Do as you would be done by and
help home enterprises.

Big Springs, our next point en
route is growing faster than any
town west of Fort Worth and the
half-dozen or more brick and
stone business houses recently
completed or now under construc-
tion there would be a credit to
Dallas and even larger cities.
Big Springs is not on a boom: it
grows because it can't help it.
Big Springs merchants carry large
and attractive stocks and
now and then have bargain sales
to make room for newer and more
up-to-date lines of goods. Unlike
most towns, our big sister city
has no dull times between crop
seasons—caused by the monthly
pay-roll of the T&P Ry Co which
has here its roundhouse, machine
shops and division headquarters.
The only steam laundry in this
section is at Big Springs, and
this year an ice factory will be
