ROBBED A CRIPPLE.

Mr. Sid Garrett was in Big Springs last week to get supplies for the U. S. Ranch, and while there employed two men to work for Mr. Slaughter. When they started home Tuesday evening, two other young men coming this way, asked for and were given a seat in the wagon. One of them had but one arm.

Being obliged to wait for the bills for the goods, Mr. Garrett sent the boys on with the wagon, telling them to camp a few miles out. When he started out, he made inquiries for the wagon on the Gail road, but failing to hear anything of it, started out on the Colorado road, thinking they had missed their way. He soon met two of the boys who were watering their horses, and together they rode over to the wagon, which turned out to be on the right road. On their way they met a man wearing a slicker and carrying two grips. When stopped and questioned, he denied knowing anything about the U. S. Ranch, its wagon or any of its employees.

Going on to the wagon, Mr. Garrett found one of the boys gone and the other one, who was crippled, was minus his watch, his grip and \$11.45 in money. Beyond a doubt, the man was the thief in disguise, and so Mr. Garrett returned at once to Big Springs and with the assistance of Sheriff Mobley, spent most of the night looking for the degenerate, but at last accounts he had not been apprehended.

A reward of \$5 is offered for his arrest, and the following description will be of service to officers and others: Age 22 or 23, height 5 ft 11, inches, slender build and awkward in appearance, red hair, blue eyes and freckle-faced. He is lacking in education and appears to be country-raised and claimed to have come from Coleman County. When last seen, he wore a narrow brimmed soft hat, overalls and plain home-made gingham shirt with narrow collar.

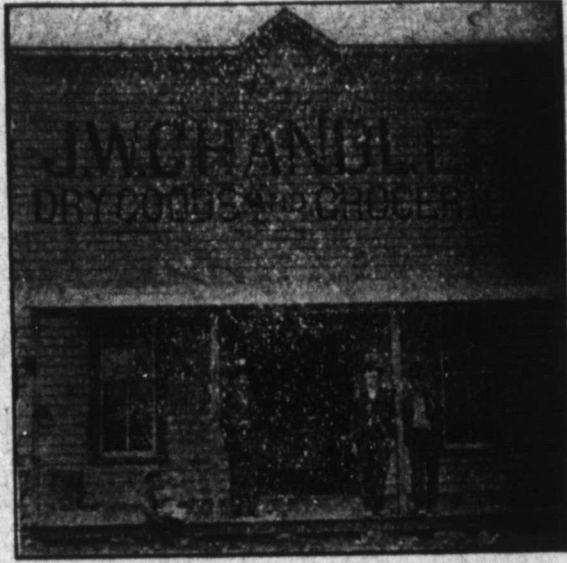
