## Quarter-Final Victory! Coyotes Maul the Mustangs in Rematch Against Sands

The Borden County Coyotes five weeks removed from traveling to Ackerly for their district championship match-up with the Sands Mustangs, traveled to Lubbock to play these same Mustangs on a neutral field for a Quarter-Final championship and a berth in the State Semi-Finals and a guaranteed medal.

The Coyotes struggled with the Mustangs in their first match-up and expectations were to see those same struggles for the Coyotes. The Coyotes did get off to yet another slow start as the Mustangs found the end-zone on a 57 yard run by the Mustangs to take a quick 6 to 0 lead just :52 seconds into the game.

On the ensuing kick-off, a mishandled onside kick resulted in another offensive possession by the Mustangs. The Coyote defense finally flexed their muscles a bit as the rush by John Hensley and RT Shafer forced a quick pass that was intercepted by Michael Cooley. The offense finally got their first opportunity of the game and they wasted no time as a nice Shafer block and Valentine cut block allowed Cooley to travel 66 yards to pay dirt for the Coyotes and after a Flynn

Chapman extra point, with 7:51 left in the first quarter Borden County had an 8 to 6 lead.

On the Mustangs next possession, they were able to convert two 4<sup>th</sup> downs on their way to their 2<sup>nd</sup> touchdown of the evening to regain the lead at 12 to 8.

The Coyotes used only their 2<sup>nd</sup> offensive play to get their 2<sup>nd</sup> offensive touchdown as Quinton Shafer, Chapman, Derek Tatum, RT Shafer and Valentine cleared a path for Cooley to travel 39 yards to regain the lead at 14 to 12 for the Coyotes. After the defense forced a 3 and out, a nice punt return by Cooley set the Coyotes up at the Mustang 6 yard line. The Coyotes ran their 3<sup>rd</sup> play for their 3<sup>rd</sup> score as cooley scampered in from 6 yards out to push the coyote lead to 20 to 6 with 1:14 left in the first quarter. On the last play of the quarter, Karl Lamming, making a habit of scoring defensive touchdowns in the play-offs got another interception and touchdown return from 42 yards out to increase the Borden County lead to 26 to 6.

After another defensive stop, the Coyotes regained possession of the ball and began

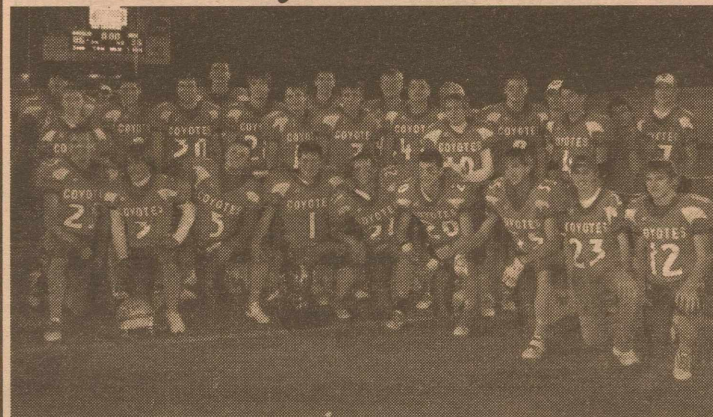
to march toward another score. Miles Valentine and the Coyotes took to the air for this touchdown as Valentine and Cooley connected from 19 yards out for the touchdown and a comfortable 32 to 6 lead. The Mustangs stopped any Coyote momentum that may have been displayed, by returning the ensuing kick-off 72 yards to cut the Coyote lead to 32 to 20 following a successful extra point.

Valentine again took to the air, this time connecting with RT Shafer. This time the connection resulted in a 49 yard touchdown reception. With the kicking game struggling a bit, Helio Rosales stepped in and converted his opportunity to push the Coyote lead by to 20 points as 40 to 20. The Mustangs would not go away easy as they mounted a tremendous drive of their own, converting 2 fourth down plays en route to a touchdown pass with only :16 seconds left in the first half. This touchdown and extra point made the halftime score 40 to 28 in favor of the Coyotes.

Hoping to regain the momentum in the 2<sup>nd</sup> half, Borden County would receive

# BJH One-Act Play Coming to Town Community Performance Set for This Thursday; Contest on Saturday

The curtain is about to open on yet another fine production of the Borden County I.S.D. Theatre Department as the Borden County Junior High readies itself for this week's One-Act Play contest and community performances of Celeste Raspanti's classic *I Never Saw Another Butterfly*.

The community performance of the Holocaust-era play is set for this Thursday, December 3<sup>rd</sup>, at 6:30 p.m. in the B.C.I.S.D. auditorium. All families, friends, and public are invited to this performance, which will serve as the 20-member cast and crew's final dress rehearsal for their district contest.

The District 4-A Junior High One-Act Play Contest is set for this Saturday, December 5<sup>th</sup>, also in the B.C.I.S.D. auditorium. The shows will begin at 10:30 a.m. that morning and run back-to-back. These performances are also open to the public.

Leading off the contest in the first performance slot is O'Donnell Junior High's *Zink: The Myth, the Legend, the Zebra*.

The BJH production of *I Never Saw Another Butterfly* will perform in the second time slot, beginning at approximately 11:15 a.m. Be there early, though, to ensure admittance into the auditorium.

Blackwell JH will be third with an undisclosed play at press time. Sands JH will close the contest with their rendition of *The Rocking Horse Winner*.

The BJH production is in search of their 10<sup>th</sup> district championship in 11 years.

*I Never Saw Another Butterfly* will take audiences back almost 70 years to World War II. The play is set in the Jewish ghetto of Terezin in the former Czechoslovakia and focuses on a young woman, Raja Englanderova, who was one of only about 100 children liber-

ated from the ghetto/ concentration camp following the Holocaust. Her story of survival and hope are sure to inspire all in attendance.

Starring in the show is eighth grade Mollie McMeans as "Raja Englanderova." Along with many other children, she is taught in the ghetto by "Irena Synkova," a teacher played by fellow eighth grader Taylor Gass. Raja finds a close friend in the ghetto in "Honza Kosek," played by eighth grader Zach McMeans. He also doubles as a "Loud-speaker/Nazi Guard."

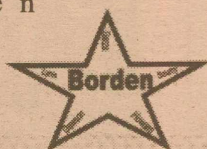
Raja's family is played by eighth grader Brady Dowds ("Papa"), seventh graders Tye Basquez ("Mama") & Cayden Vaughn ("Pavel," her brother), and sixth graders Channing Miller ("Aunt Vera") & Zoie Key ("Irca," her sister-in-law).

The children of Terezin who are taught by Irena are played by eighth grader Maeghan Herridge ("Child I"), seventh grader Bessie Rhodes ("Child II), and sixth graders Tatum Richey ("Child III") & Samuel Raborn ("Child IV").

Completing the cast are eighth grade Kassaundra Gaines ("Renka") and sixth graders Taylor Roberts ("Erika") & Thomas Harrison ("Rabbi").

The BJH crew is complemented by eighth graders Mallory McMeans ("Stage Manager"), Matthew Ham ("Light Technician"), and Kalyn Massingill ("Sound Technician"). Seventh grader Clair Shafer ("Stagehand") and sixth grader Lexi Monette ("Props & Costumes") also serve as crew members.

Come enjoy a fantastic theatrical performance by the young people of Borden County!

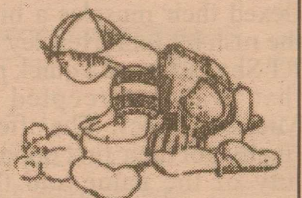

# Victory for Coyotes in Rematch...

the 2<sup>nd</sup> half kick-off. But, on their first play from scrimmage, the Mustangs stripped the ball from a Coyote runner to take over possession of the ball. The Coyote defense, which allowed only 8 points in the half forced the Mustangs to turn the ball over on downs.

The Coyotes used another 1 play drive to regain control of this quarter-final match up. Michael Cooley sprinted 52 yards for the score, Chapman got his kicking going again and started a new streak connecting on the final 5 kicks of the game. After a nice interception by Tony Soto, Cooley set sail on another nice 52 yard touchdown untouched again to push lead to 56 to 28 after the Chapman extra-point.

After yet another nice defensive stand, Valentine and Cooley connected again on a 40 yard scoring strike to push the lead to 64 to 28. The Mustangs put together one last ditch effort to stay in the game as they mounted a nice drive to score their final touchdown of the game to cut the Borden County lead to 64 to 36.

The Coyotes regained control of the game as Valentine and Cooley connected for the third and final time early in the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter to stretch the lead to 70 to 36 lead and after another Chapman kick, the Coyotes had the Mustangs doubled up at 72 to 36 with 8:37 left in the game. Lamming did his magic act again on the Coyotes next defensive possession as he intercepted his 2<sup>nd</sup> pass, but more impressively turned it into his 2<sup>nd</sup> touchdown of the game from 29 yards out and following another Chapman kick, the Coyotes had a very comfortable 80 to 36 lead with 7:40 left in the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter.

The Coyote defensive forced yet another turnover as Cooley stripped the ball from a Mustang runner and then fell on the loose pig skin to give the Coyotes possession of the ball one last time. The 2<sup>nd</sup> team offense got into the act during this possession. Lamming connected with Brendan Tarleton to keep the drive alive on a 4<sup>th</sup> down connection. The same two connected again on a 3<sup>rd</sup> and goal from the 7 yard line and this time Borden County had their 12<sup>th</sup> touchdown of the game, but ended the game via

the 45 point mercy rule with 4:14 left in the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter.

The Coyotes with the victory, had two solid wins on the season over a very well coached and hard nosed Mustang football team. The victory also propelled the Coyotes into the Semi-finals for the 2<sup>nd</sup> straight year. The Coyotes will be the home team in their Semi-Final match-up with the 2007 State Champion Motley County Matadors.

Miles Valentine was 5 of 6 passing for 145 yards and 4 scores, and also in on 4 tackles, Austin Cope had a tackle, Brent Davis got a kick-off play, and just missed a tackle. David Rodriguez was in on 2 tackles and had two carries for 3 yards. Michael Cooley had 13 carries for 304 yards and 5 touchdowns and also had 3 catches for 87 yards and 3 touchdowns and was in on 10 tackles, had an interception, 3 passes deflected, a caused fumble and fumble recovery. Quint Shafer had some awesome blocks and was in on 6 tackles and a pressure. Zach Telchik was in on 9 tackles, had a tackle for loss. Skyler Dear had a tackle and a blocked extra point. RT Shafer had one catch for 49 yards and a touchdown and had 2 carries for 11 yards and was in on 9 tackles, a sack, tackle for loss and 4 pressures. Brendan had several good kicks, 2 receptions for 23 yards and a score. John Hensley had 16 tackles, 2 sacks, 3 tackles for loss and 4 pressures. Tanner Richey returned to hold for extra points. Tony Soto had one carry for 3 yards and was in on 9 tackles with an interception, and a tackle for loss. Austin Fields had 3 tackles and a caused fumble and played some fullback. Derek Tatum had 3 tackles and blocked extremely well from his center position. Flynn Chapman had a carry for 2 yards and a reception for 9 yards and blocked well playing fullback in this game. Flynn also had 21 tackles, 3 tackles for loss, a sack and a pressure and was 7 of 10 on extra points. Helio Rosales had an extra point kick. Kobie Benham had a 3 yard run. Also suiting up was Michael Froman, Matt Roberson, Collin Telchik, and Steven Howard.



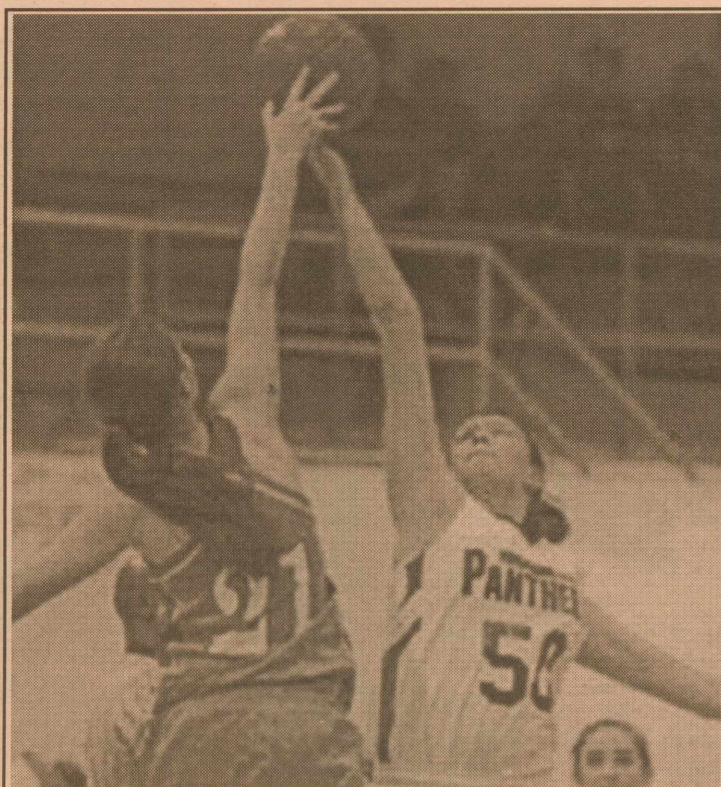

## Prepare Your Home to Reduce Holiday Stress

It seems like appliances and plumbing problems always occur before or while a house full of guests is present! This year, prepare for the unexpected before the holiday season kicks off.

If the holidays seem stressful to you, imagine what they can do to your home. Thinking ahead and stocking up on emergency supplies can save you frustration later. Here are some suggestions:

\* Batteries, fuses, surge protectors and extension cords. You'll likely use more electricity than usual, so keep extras on hand. Remember not to overload outlets - it is a fire hazard waiting to happen.

\* Major appliances. Check household appliances that can affect your holiday plans, and make sure they're in good working order. For most people, these include the oven, dishwasher, refrigerator, heating system, washer/dryer—even your blender or mixer. Make sure they are clean and ready to use. Refrigerators often get a real workout during this season with an overabundance of food. Remember that to work efficiently, air needs to be able to circulate around

in the refrigerator. The freezer on the other hand loves to be packed.

\* Drain Prevention. Don't let unexpected clogs ruin your holiday spirit. \* Fire extinguisher. Have one readily available in the kitchen and in rooms that have fireplaces or lots of decorations. Then make sure everyone in your family knows where the extinguishers are stored and how to use them.

\* Have a plan for emergencies. Have a first aid kit on hand and accessible for all family members and guests. Also, keep the numbers for emergency services near each phone (remember that out of town guests won't know the local numbers). For Borden County EMS, call 806-759-5111.

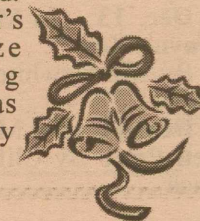

thieves are so they need to take better safety measures to secure their valuables.

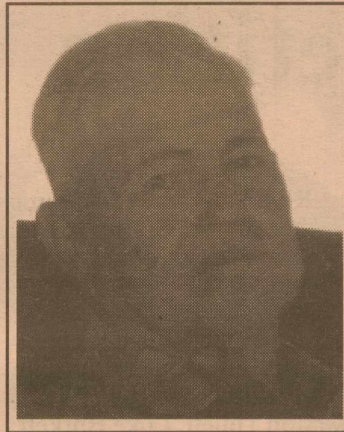

The family greeted friends on Friday, November 20, 2009, from 6 to 8 pm, at White Memorial Chapel in O'Donnell.

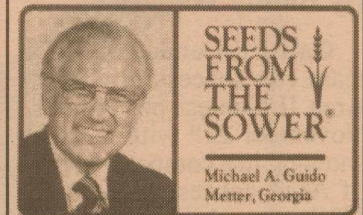

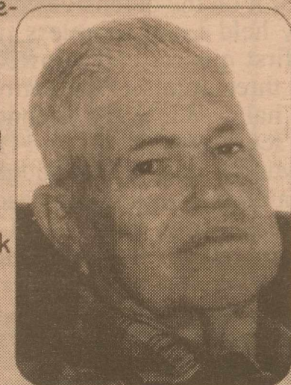

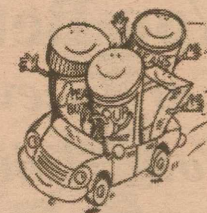
