In October our class elected a duchess to

represent our class at the Halloween Carnival. Our Duchess was Beth Dean and her escort was Rickey Abernathy. In the second grade Mrs. Maude Harris was our teacher, and we were happy to have Donna Strickland join our class. Our duchess was Beth Dean and her duke was Rickey Abernathy.

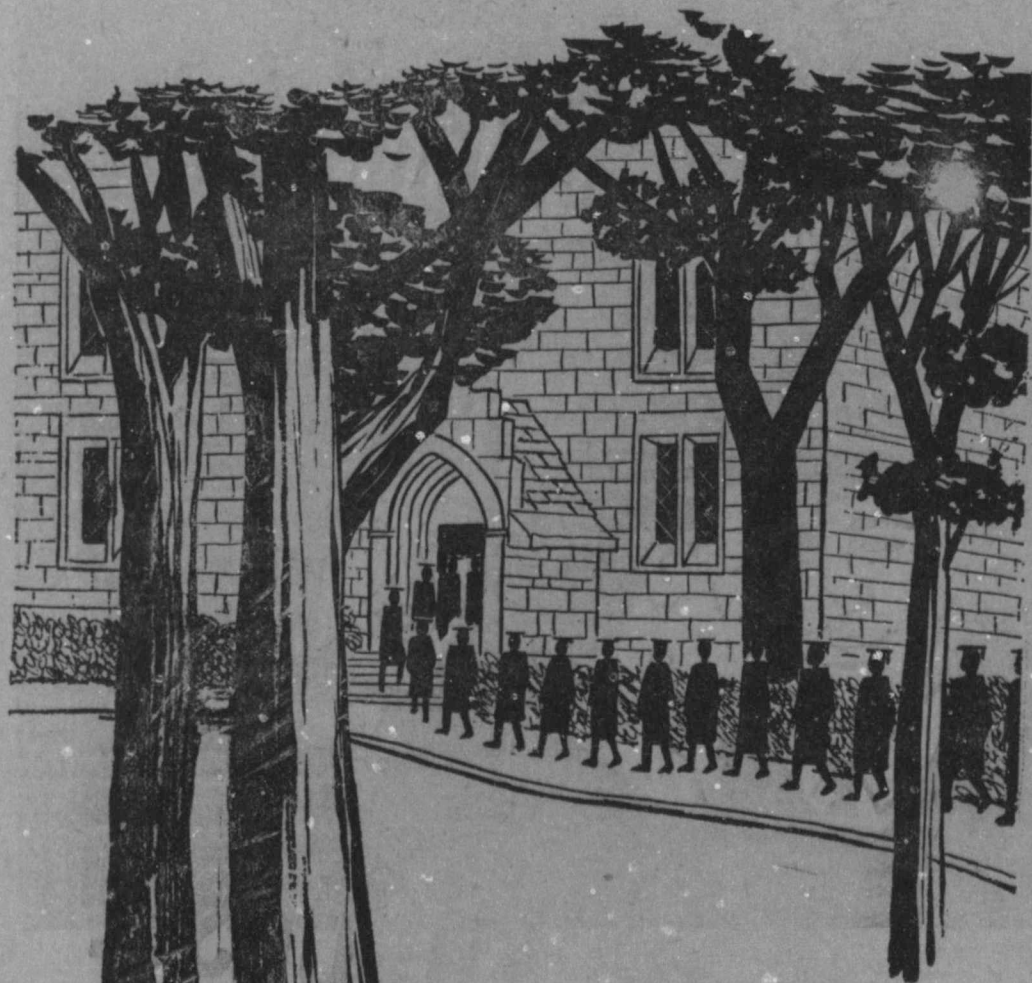

Old Refrigerators Can Trap Children

Simple precautions with a discarded or stored refrigerator or freezer can save a child's life.

Precautions can take several forms. The Association of Home Appliance Manufacture recommended to remove the door, to block it from closing completely, to remove the latch or to chain the door closed.

of the freezer or refrigerator, put either temporarily or permanently out of use, advises Mrs. Doris Myers, Extension home management specialist.

And take preventive action immediately, she warns.

Rubber bumpers or wooden blocks prevent a door from closing completely to trap a child, the specialist at Texas A&M University adds. Secure with contact cement or strong adhesive glue high out of a child's reach.

Make sure the bumpers are thick enough to prevent the

door from closing completely. To chain the door closed, use an ordinary chain and padlock or unbreakable self-adhesive filament tape about an inch wide. Mrs. Myers suggests wrapping tape about several times and overlapping it in back of the refrigerator.

If the appliance's design permits, slip a winged head of a toggle bolt into the latch with a wooden block or metal plates screwed flush into the inner door surface. Or, says the specialist, the latch can be removed.

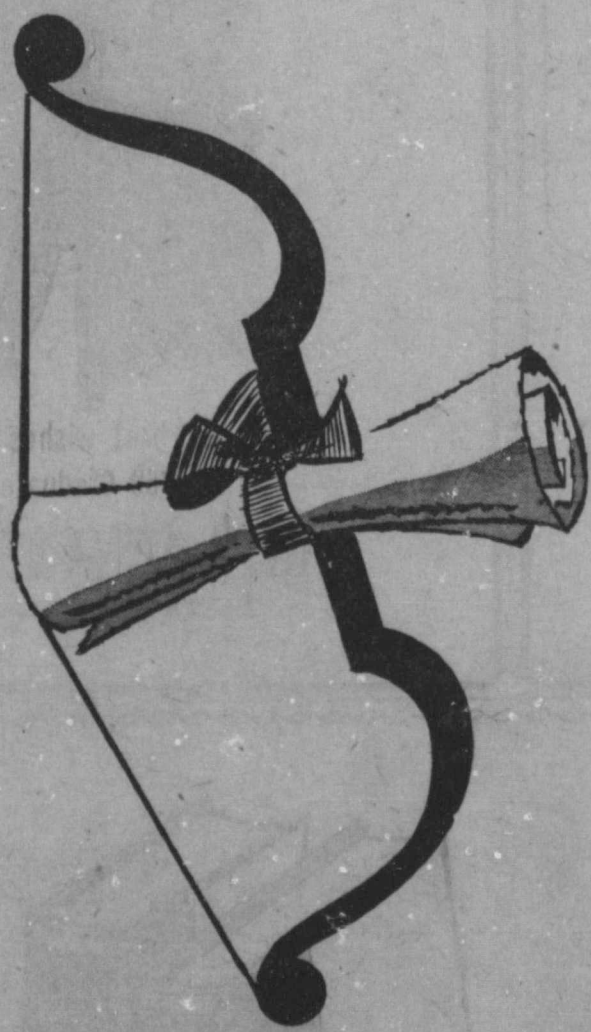

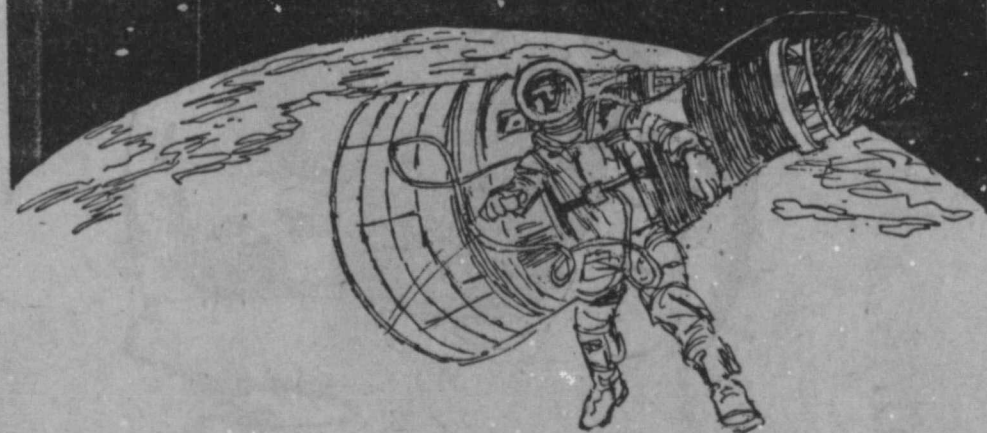



After graduating from Junior high, I entered Santa Anna high school. It was here I participated in a number of organizations and activities and received various honors.

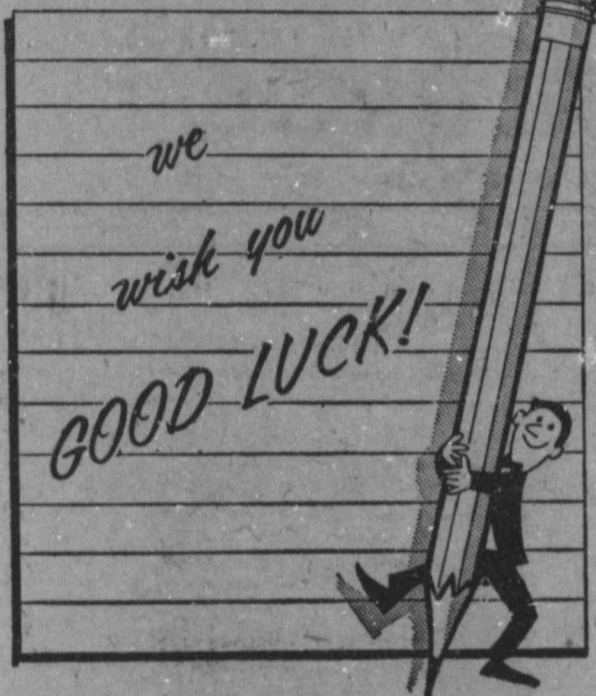
During my first year of high school, I became a member of pep squad, beta club, and FHA. I played on the basketball team and was elected freshman class favorite.

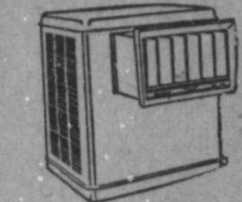


BETH DEAN

PUBLIC NOTICE

Proposed CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT
NUMBER FOUR ON THE BALLOT (SJR6)

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

Section 1. That Section 2, Article VIII, Constitution of the State of Texas, be amended to read as follows:

"Section 2. All occupation taxes shall be equal and uniform upon the same class of subjects within the limits of the authority levying the tax; but the legislature may, by general laws, exempt from taxation public property used for public purposes; all real and personal property owned by a nonprofit water supply corporation which is reasonably necessary for, and is used in, operation of the corporation in the acquisition, storage, transportation and sale of water as authorized as its sole legal purpose; actual places or (of) religious worship, also any property owned by a church or by a strictly religious society for the exclusive use as a dwelling place for the ministry of such church or religious society, and which yield no revenue whatever to

such church or religious society; provided that such exemption shall not extend to more property than is reasonably necessary for a dwelling place and in no event more than one acre of land; places of burial not held for private or corporate profit; all buildings used exclusively and owned by persons or associations of persons for school purposes and the necessary furniture of all schools and property used exclusively and reasonably necessary in conducting any association engaged in promoting the religious, educational and physical development of boys, girls, young men or young women operating under a state or national organization of like character; also the endowment funds of such institutions of learning and religion not used with a view to profit; and when the same are invested in bonds or mortgages, or in land or other property which has been and shall hereafter be bought in by such institutions under foreclosure sales made to satisfy or protect such

bonds or mortgages, that such exemption of such land and property shall continue only for two years after the purchase of the same at such sale by such institutions and no longer, and institutions of purely public charity; and all laws exempting property from taxation other than the property above mentioned shall be null and void."

Sec. 2. The foregoing Constitutional amendment shall be submitted to a vote of the qualified electors of this state at an election to be held on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in August, 1969, at which election all ballots shall have printed on them the following:

"FOR the Constitutional amendment to exempt nonprofit water supply corporations from taxation;" and
"AGAINST the Constitutional amendment to exempt nonprofit water supply corporations from taxation."

Sec. 3. The Governor of the State of Texas shall issue the necessary proclamation for the election, and this amendment shall be published in the manner and for the length of time required by the Constitution and laws of this state.

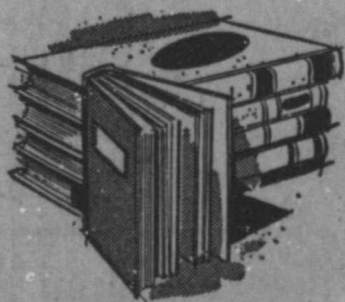
