BEING A POLICE OFFICER is not an easy task. In fact I doubt that I would be a very good one. Officers are subjected to more abuse and criticism today than ever before.

While we certainly cannot condone such unwarranted action, the law enforcement officer must not let hostile public reaction affect the manner in which he performs his duty.

One of the complaints law enforcement officials bear repeatedly is that the personal contact between the public and officers on the streets is decreasing. There are many factors which contribute to this, including the rapid increase in population, especially in urban areas.

Most cities are constantly wooing prospective patrolmen. It is hard to find men who are interested in the profession, and even harder to find those who are qualified.

When we consider the qualities desired in a good policeman, we wonder that there are any available. If an officer is to uphold the ethics of his profession, he cannot let personal feelings or prejudices influence his actions.

Most of us would find this a hard task. It has been said of one member of a law enforcement body whom we know, "he would arrest his own mother, if she disobeyed the law." Not many could stand that reputation, yet that is what is expected of a good officer.

We may complain about our law enforcement officers, but there are few of us who could meet the demands we make on them.
