## EMS Completes Training

Five members of the Plains Voluntary EMS recently completed a class which raises their certification level to Emergency Medical Technician. These members, Neal Bearden, Cathy Dowgar, Alice Garcia, Debbie Smith and Hershel Smith, had to complete 120 hours of classroom work, 56 hours of in-hospital and ambulance rotations and also had to pass several skills accomplishment exams.

The Plains Voluntary EMS now has eight members with seven being certified EMT and one being certified as an Emergency Care Attendant. Neal Bearden and Debbie Smith also recently completed a cardiac module and are now qualified to monitor and read ECG equipment.

Plains Voluntary EMS is constantly improving and updating its equipment and the training of its personnel.

A spokesman for the group

stated, "We are always in need of volunteers to work with us. It is often a thankless job but we do receive rewards in the knowledge that we have helped someone."

The group would like to sponsor an ECA Class and a CPR class in Plains providing there is enough community interest. Those who would like to participate in either of these classes are asked to contact Neal Bearden or Hershel Smith. There is no obligation to do volunteer work on the ambulance service if a person decides to take the courses, but it would qualify that person to do so.

## For Emergencies, Call 456-2200

Residents are reminded of the 24-hour emergency phone number for reporting fires or requesting ambulance service. That number is 456-2200.

The siren is sounded with two blasts for fires out of town and one blast for fires inside the city limits.

Siren rings every day at 12 noon and at 7:30 p.m. on Monday nights for fire practice. This is to ensure that sirens are in working order.

**The tornado warning signal is one long blast.**

Residents are asked not to call City Hall to inquire where a fire truck or ambulance is en route. These calls could prevent employees from contacting firemen or ambulance workers needed in emergencies.

Information cannot be given out concerning ambulance calls. Family members are notified as soon as possible.

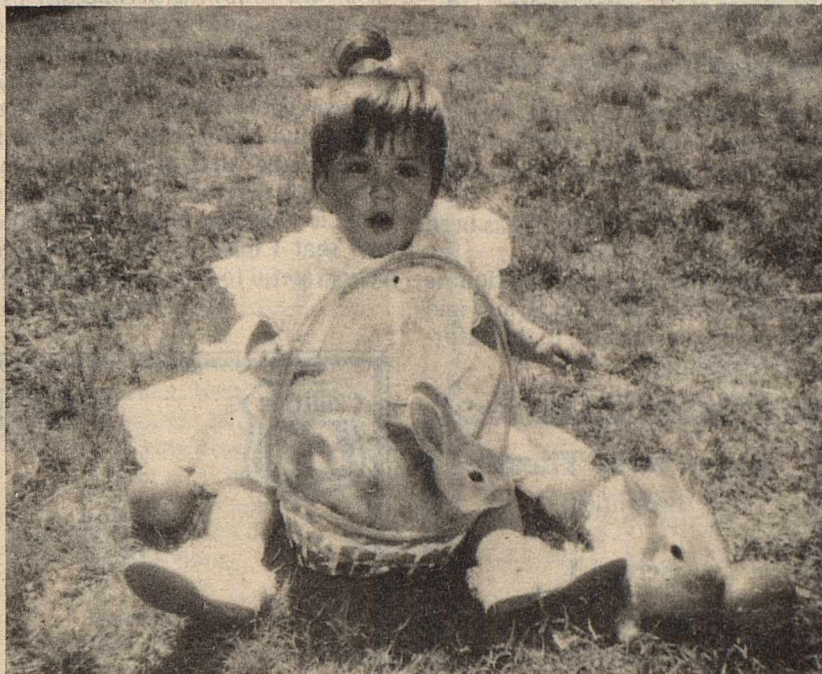

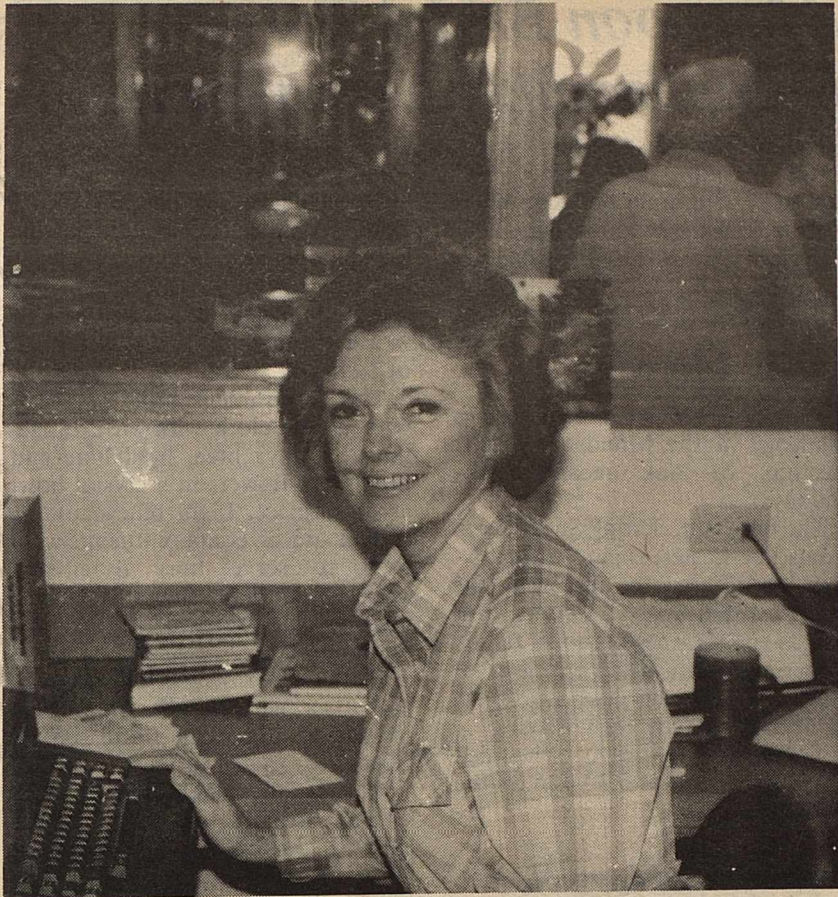

Dolores, who lost her husband in January 1984, began her job in June 1984. "Working at the library is a very interesting and challenging job and I enjoy the contact with the people of the community."

Some of Dolores' favorite recipes

are shared with the readers this week.

### CHICKEN MACARONI CASSEROLE

- 1½ c cooked macaroni (drained)
- 2 c grated cheddar cheese
- 1 can boned chicken
- 1 can cream of chicken soup
- 1 can sliced mushrooms (drained)
- ¼ c chopped pimento

### LEMON BARS

- 2 c flour
- ½ c sifted powdered sugar
- 1 c margarine
- 4 eggs, beaten
- 2 c sugar
- ½ c lemon juice
- ¼ c flour
- ½ tsp. baking powder

Sift together 2 c flour and powdered sugar. Cut in margarine until mixture clings. Press into a 13x9x12 baking pan. Bake in 350° oven for 20 to 25 minutes or until lightly browned. Beat together eggs, sugar and lemon juice. Sift together flour and baking powder; stir in egg mixture. Pour over baked crust and bake at 350° for 25 minutes longer. Sprinkle with powdered sugar. Cool. Cut into bars.

### FROZEN SALAD

- 2 c sour cream
- ¾ c sugar
- 2 Tbs. lemon juice
- 1 small can pineapple tidbits (drained)
- 2 Tbs. chopped maraschino cherries
- 2 lg. bananas (diced)
- ½ c chopped pecans

Mix sour cream and sugar. Add all other ingredients and mix well. Freeze in a large mold or individual molds.

### BROWNIES

- Melt together:
- 2 stks margarine
- 2 sq. unsweetened chocolate

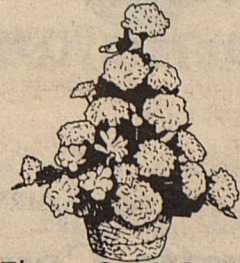
Add to the above ingredients:

- 2 c sugar
- 1 c flour
- 4 eggs
- 1 tsp. vanilla
- 1 c chopped pecans

Beat well with mixer after each addition. Bake in a large greased Pyrex dish at 350° for 30 to 35 minutes.

Gently fold ingredients all together, reserving ½ cup cheese. Place in a greased casserole dish. Sprinkle the ½ cup cheese over top. Bake at 350 for 1 hour.

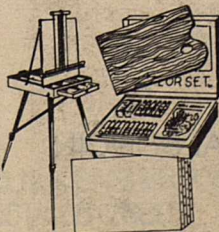

Hostesses presented the little one with a high chair and car seat. Her mother was presented a baby sock corsage.

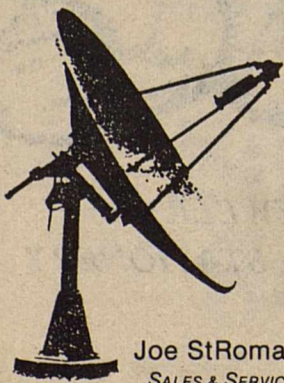

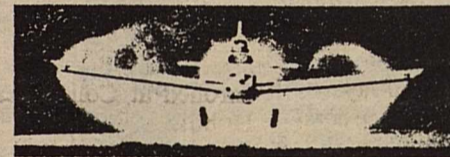
In the running events, the Cowboys scored 83 points, winning all the distance races. Joe Rivera
