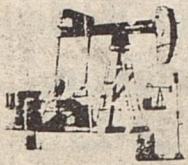

We welcome these qualified teachers to our district and encourage each of you to get to know them personally.

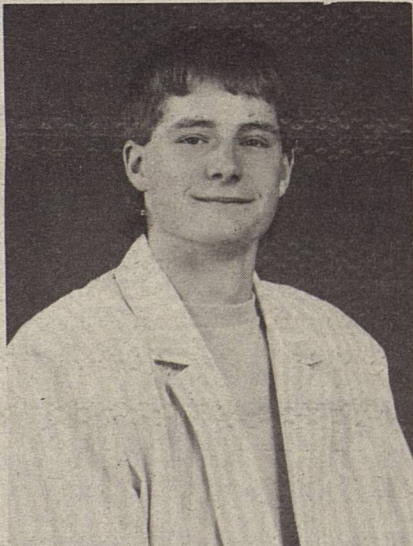

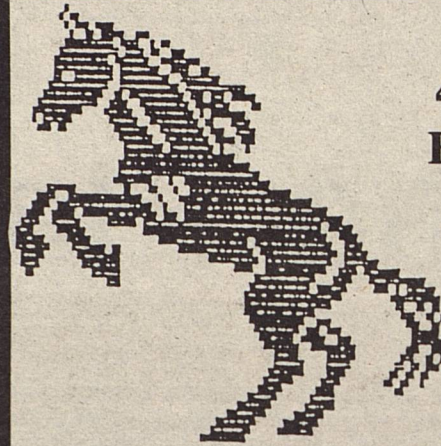

Yoakum County Commissioners Court met Monday in regular session.

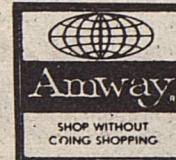
Wanda Smith presented the tax assessor/collector's report of taxes collected in May. Extra hire and disbursements were approved for payment including a transfer of \$65,000 to the hospital fund and hospital bills totaling \$70,693.17.

A computer services agreement with the 121st Judicial District Adult Probation Department was approved with payments of \$73.56 per month or \$220.68 quarterly beginning Sept. 18, 1987 and continuing for a period of five years.

The court also approved a motion to advertise for bids for four or more miles of seal coating in precinct four with bids to extend

through Dec. 31, 1988. Bids are to be received July 11 at 10 a.m.

The June 27 session of court was postponed until Tuesday, June 28 to allow members to attend a SPAG seminar in Lubbock on purchasing, court costs and cash management.

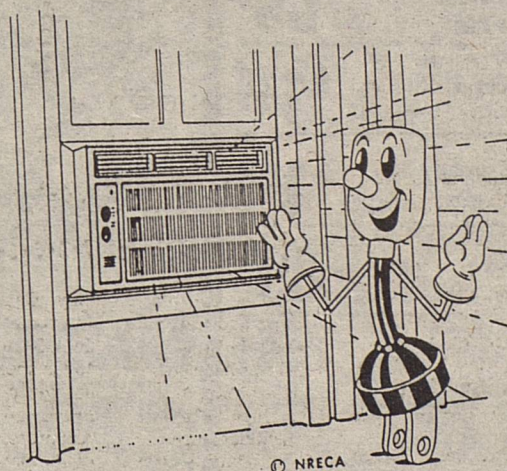
