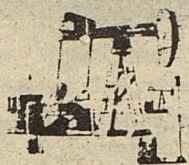

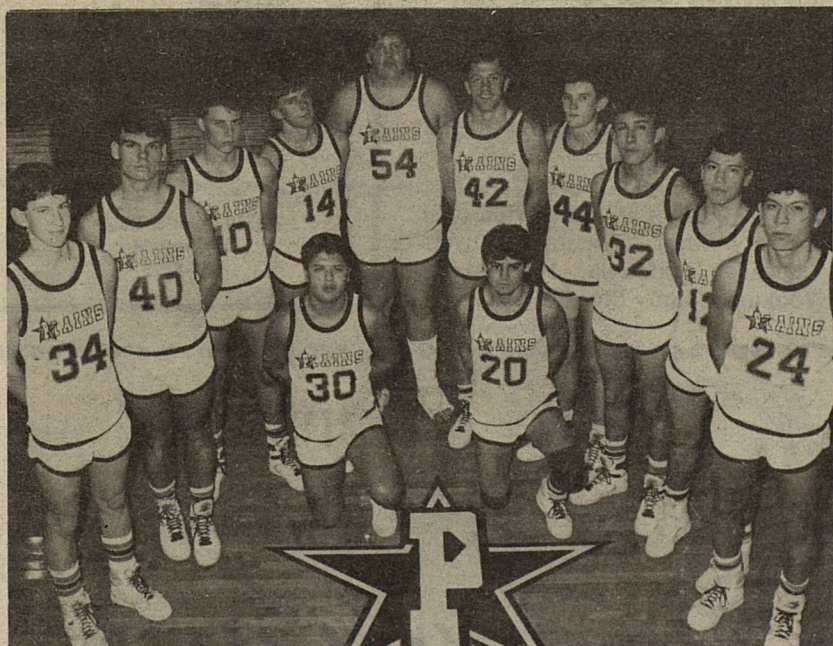

Comptroller's Representative To Be In Plains Feb. 22

A representative from State Comptroller Bob Bullock's agency will be in Plains, Feb. 22 to answer questions about Texas taxes and to assist taxpayers with paperwork and

problems.

"I don't want to see state taxes turn into a burden for folks who can't get to a field office. Our visits are a service we're happy to provide to Texas taxpayers," Bullock said.

Johnny Laceywell, Enforcement Officer, from the Lubbock Field Office, will be at the Yoakum County Courthouse, "Old" Commissioners Courtroom from 10 a.m. to 12 noon. The public is welcome and there is no charge.

"I'm sending my employees out to help people with questions, filling out forms, and working out problems on a local, one-to-one basis. There's some things you just can't do as well over the phone or through the mail," Bullock said.

Plains area taxpayers who can't attend the courthouse visit can still get individual tax assistance by calling the Comptroller's toll-free telephone number, 1-800-252-5555 from anywhere in Texas.

John Deere Tells Of New Mowers

John Deere is building a new line of silver walk-behind mowers, according to Vaughn Culwell, owner of Plains Farm Supply, Inc. in Plains. The new line commemorates the company's 25th silver anniversary of its first homeowner mowing machine.

"They're departing from their traditional green and yellow colors because these mowers are far superior to walk-behinds that they've marketed before," said Culwell.

There are five new models -- three are powered by 4-1/2 hp, 4-cycle overhead valve engines, and two are powered by 4-hp, 2-cycle engines using a fuel mix of gas and oil. All five feature a blade brake clutch system that stops the cutting blade within three seconds when a control lever is released, yet allows the engine to continue operating. All models cut a 21-inch path with an aluminum deck that's contoured for strong suction and uniform mowing.

With a 2.5-bushel bagger that can be lifted with one hand from a rear discharge system, both sides of mowing deck can be used for trimming. Side discharge is optional.

A shift selector on the handlebar of three self-propelled models controls speeds from 1.2 to 4.1 mph. The 5-speed gear transaxle is belt driven for smooth engagement. "This is an exclusive for John Deere," Culwell said.

Easy starting is a feature of all five mowers. Cutting height can be set from 1/2 to 3-1/2 inches.

From The Superintendent's Desk

Many of you may be concerned about the recent measles outbreak in Lubbock. Since many of our community are often in Lubbock attending classes at Texas Tech, or simply shopping, it is natural for this concern to exist. At this point however, we are not aware of any measles in Yoakum County. As far as the students of Plains Schools are concerned, we feel that the majority are protected through immunization.

Parents of school age children realize that immunization requirements for students entering Texas Public Schools are quite specific. One of those requirements is for immunization against measles. We feel that because of this requirement, the majority of Plains I.S.D. students are protected. Any exceptions would be very few in number and then only by reason of a student receiving the immunization before the age of fifteen months. All Plains I.S.D. students have immunization records showing a record of measles immunization or illness.

For your information I am including the following release from Texas Education Agency describing immunization requirements for all students entering Texas schools.

Immunizations Necessary For School

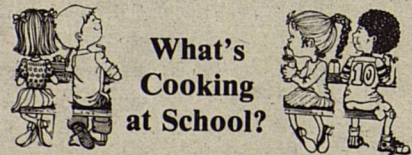
Regardless of whether a child attends public or private school, every student in Texas must have proof of immunization.

Upon enrolling a child in school for the first time or transferring the child to a Texas school from another state, a parent must provide proof that the child has been immunized appropriately for his age against diphtheria, tetanus, poliomyelitis, measles, mumps and rubella.

With rare exceptions, Texas law forbids schools to accept children without proof of immunization. The Texas Department of Health has established minimum requirements for immunization for the admission of school-age children to schools. They are as follows:

Four-year-olds entering pre-school:

- *Three doses of oral polio vaccine
- *Three doses of diphtheria-tetanus-pertussis (DTP) vaccine
- *One dose measles vaccine or a physician-verified history of the illness
- *One dose mumps vaccine or a physician-verified history of the illness

Five years and older:

- *Three doses oral polio vaccine (one dose since the child's fourth birthday). Applies to children through age 17
- *At least three doses of DTP and/or tetanus-diphtheria vaccine (one dose since the child's fourth birthday and within the past 10 years)
- *One dose mumps vaccine or a physician-verified history of the illness (through age 16)
- *one dose rubella vaccine (through age 11)

If a child is on an ideal immunization schedule, he or she will have received five doses of DTP vaccine and either four or five doses of oral polio vaccine by the time he or she enters school.

Children can be immunized by their family doctor or at their local health department. Any validated document of immunization will be accepted by the schools provided it shows at least the month and year when each immunization was given. The Texas Department of Health and local health departments will provide record-keeping cards free of charge for maintaining school immunization files.

For more information about immunizations, parents should contact their local schools or health departments.

Commissioners of Yoakum County met in special session Feb. 6 at which time bids on purchase and hauling of gravel were opened. The only bid received, from R.E. Janes Gravel Co., was accepted.

No bids were received for the crushing of caliche for all four precincts as advertised.

Eddins-Walcher submitted the only bid for gasoline and diesel fuel for Precinct 1 and Yoakum County Park. Bid was accepted. Eddins-Walcher was awarded the bid on gasoline and diesel fuel for Precinct 3.

Elf Asphalt submitted bids on asphalt for Precincts 1, 2 and 3 which were accepted.

No bids were received on seal coating for all four precincts.

U.S. Treasury Notes Series U-1989, par value of \$1,000,000 was released on a motion by Jim Barron and second by Johnnie Fitzgerald.

Motion was approved to advertise for bids for Precinct 1 and 2 on MC-5 asphalt and MC-30 Hot oil with and without latex. Bids will be received until Feb. 17.

Applications were received to serve as County Depository for 1989-90 to be studied for one week. Those submitting applications included Yoakum County State Bank and Plains State Bank.

Extra hire and disbursements as listed on file were read and unanimously approved for payment.

Court determined to advertise for bids to purchase a new self-propelled broom with cab for Precincts 1 and 2 and offer in trade, one used Broce broom. Bids will be received until Feb. 27.

Court recessed until 1:30 p.m. at which time a work session was held to study the county depository applications.

The raffle painting was won by Zurie Overton.

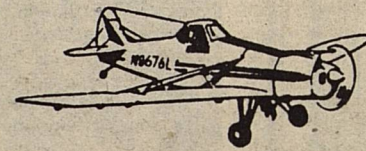
