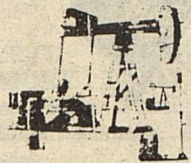

## John Harris, Daniel Canada Qualify For State Tennis Meet

John Harris and Daniel Canada earned the right to participate in the State Tennis Tournament in Austin May 12 and 13 by winning at the regional tournament held in Levelland April 27, 28.

The doubles team began the Regional tournament seeded fourth. They played Bain and Rouser from Sunray in the first round and defeated them by a score of 6-4, 6-3.

In the second round, they met Gutierrez and Esparza of Ft. Hancock and knocked them off with a score of 6-2, 6-3 to advance to semi-finals.

In the semi-finals, they met the number one seed of the tournament, Swanson and Cantu of Anton. The match was a close one with Harris and Canada winning with score of 7-6 (7-4), 7-6 (7-1). With this victory, they were State Bound.

In the finals match for regional championship, they met another team from Ft. Hancock, Galindo and Legarretta, who proved to be a tough opponent. Canada and Harris lost by the score of 6-1, 4-6, 7-5. According to Coach Devitt, the boys played the best tennis of their career in the finals. "These young men have continued to improve throughout the season and with this advancement, are the first Plains tennis players to advance to the State Meet in at least the last 12 years."

Other Plains tennis players competed at the regional meet. Heather McGill was defeated in the first round by Holly Longhofer of Booker with a score of 4-6, 7-6 (7-5), 6-4. Mario Medina was defeated in the first round by Ruben Torres of Lakeview by a score of 6-2, 6-2.

In girls doubles, the team of Melissa Green and Corie Spencer won their first round by defeating Kuehler and Stiles of Wheeler by the score of 6-4, 6-2. In the second round, they met the number one seed in the tourney of Gillis and Gillis of Ft. Hancock and were defeated by the score of 6-2, 7-5.

The other girls doubles team of Lydia and Lynda Jimenez were seeded second in the tourney. In the first round, they defeated Barton and Williams of Matador by the score of 6-1, 6-0. In the second round, the Jimenez twins defeated Blake and Chisholm by the score of 6-1, 3-6, 6-4. In the semi-finals, Lydia and Lynda fell to the team of Ball and Brockman of Nazareth by a score of 6-2, 2-6, 7-5.

## Two Plains High Chemistry Students Take National Test

Chad Guetersloh and Brian Livengood, students at Plains High School, are two of five outstanding high school chemistry students as named by the South Plains Section of the American Chemical Society.

The students will take a national exam that may qualify them to become members of the U.S. National Chemistry Olympiad team that will compete in the 21st International Chemistry Olympiad (ICO) in Halle, German Democratic Republic, July 2-12, 1989.

The IOC involves a series of theoretical exams, laboratory exercises and other activities aimed at identifying the best chemistry students from participating nations around the world. This is the sixth year of U.S. participation. Last year, the U.S. team earned three silver and one bronze medal and placed third out of 26 participating nations.

The local boys are among more than 700 nationwide that took the national qualifying exam April 27-29 to select finalists.

Mrs. P.W. St. Romain gave the GFWC History, entitled "Reaching Out." Mrs. R.B. (Sit) Jones gave the Tsa Mo Ga Study Club History from 1935 organization until the present time.

Special honor went to Mary Jo Luna St. Romain and Wilma Luna Powell, being the only charter members still active in the club. The special presentation was made by Mrs. Vaughn Culwell. Ms. St. Romain and Ms. Powell are the daughters and granddaughters of pioneers, W.J. Luna and Murphy Luna, founder of Plains, Yoakum County in 1905. Mr. Luna then donated the townsite of Plains in 1906 and the local cemetery to the citizens of Plains. The cemetery still bears the family name.

Their mother, Mrs. Murphy (Lillian) Luna was an active charter member of the Tsa Mo Ga Club until her death in 1980. Because the early

members had to meet in each other's homes, Mrs. Luna had a dream of owning their own clubhouse. She then donated cattle and horses for raffling to make money to finance this dream. It became a reality in 1941. The building was purchased from the First Christian Church and the lot was donated by Mr. Stanford, Yoakum County Attorney at that time.

Due to the excellent leadership of Lillian Luna and her daughters, Mary Jo St. Romain and Wilma Powell, the Tsa Mo Ga Club has shown much success and has won many honors in district work. This pioneer heritage of generous spirit has influenced all members of the club in a positive way.

The scripture reading was given by Mrs. Johnnie Brown. Hostesses were Mrs. L.J. Sanders, Mrs. John Nance and Mrs. Jack Hayes. The next meeting will be May 8 in the home of Mary Jo St. Romain.

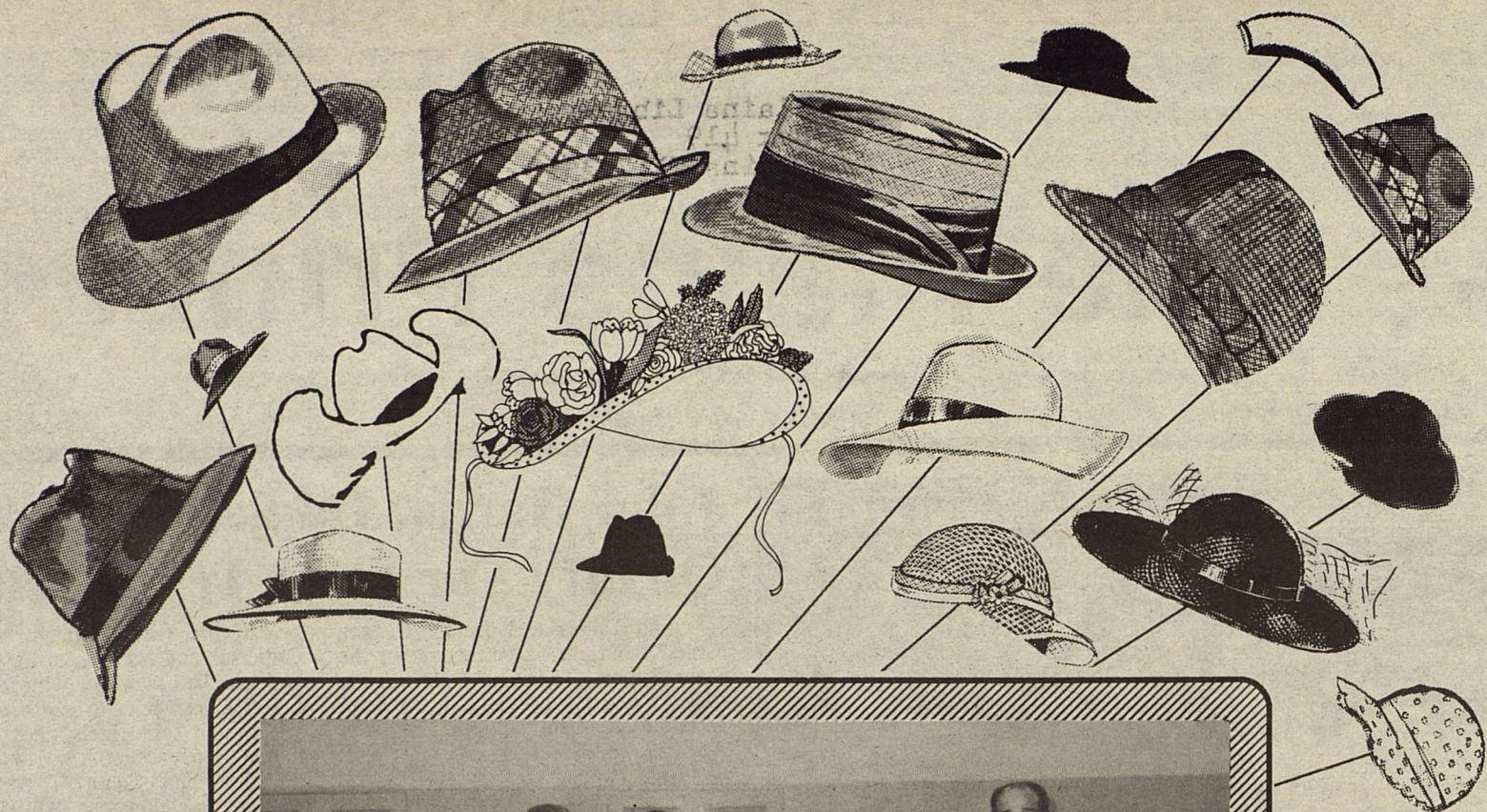
## Band Calendar Sales Underway



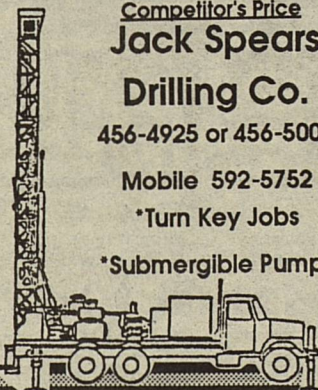
