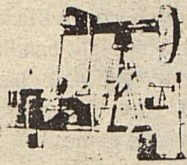

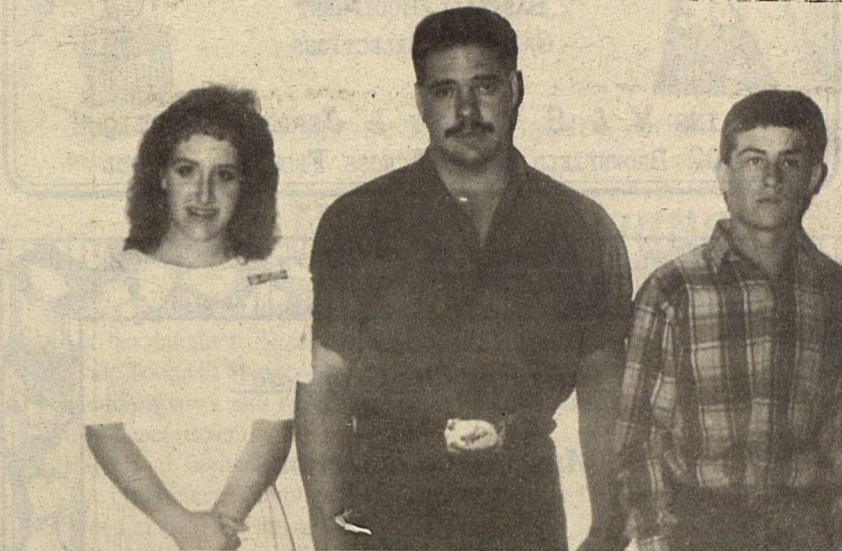

Nine County 4-H Members Qualify For State Contest

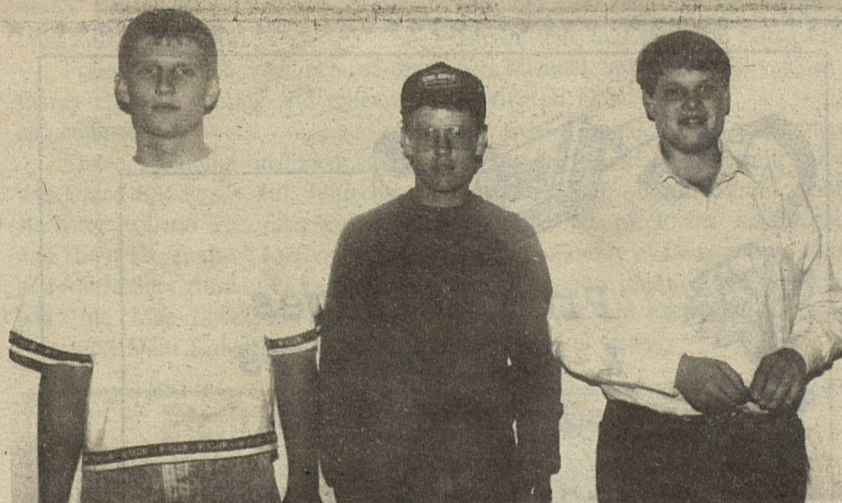

Student Participation Required To Ensure Bilingual Program

Plains Independent School District will offer a special bilingual program this summer for children who do not speak and/or understand English as well as they should -- if there are enough students eligible.

The program will be available to those students who will be in kindergarten in the Fall of 1989. Parents are not required to send their children but participation is encouraged.

Students will be given a language test before being accepted into the program. Parents of all eligible students will be notified of the test results before students are admitted to the program.

The school will be eight weeks in length starting June 26 and ending

Aug. 18. Classes will meet in the mornings from 9 a.m. until 12 noon. There will be no meals or snacks served and no transportation will be furnished by the school. Each family will be responsible for providing transportation to and from school for their children.

There will be no charge for this program. Certified teachers will be employed by the school district. Participating students should maintain regular attendance in order to ensure the success of the program.

of calcium in the diet, stating that according to nutrition experts, the best way to obtain the calcium needed is through a balanced diet. This should include dairy products, green leafy vegetables and also exercise.

One function of calcium is that it helps to clot the blood, besides strengthening bones and teeth. If the body isn't provided enough calcium, it will be taken from the bones, which could lead to osteoporosis. A combination of calcium and phosphorous give strength to bones and teeth and vitamin A aids in the absorption of calcium.

Some medications, such as anti-acids, cortizone and laxatives, may interfere with the absorption of calcium. Persons with high calcium need should take a calcium supplement.
