From The Superintendent's Desk

A week or so ago, I mentioned that one of our tasks during the summer months is to employ qualified persons to fill positions created by employee retirements and resignations. I would like to talk more about that this week.

There are definite policies and procedures to be followed as we look at prospective employees. The Texas Education Agency sets forth many requirements in placing a teacher in a certain teaching position. To become qualified to teach in Texas schools, an applicant must have a college degree with a minimum of 126 college credit hours, a valid Texas Teacher Certificate, and at least twenty-four college credit hours in the field of specialization (teaching field). For example, a teacher holding a bachelor's degree with certification in English could not teach math, science, history, or any other subject, unless an emergency permit is secured. An emergency permit can only be issued by the Texas Education Agency.

In addition to meeting all of the stated requirements, it is also very important that an applicant's personality be adaptable to the desired assignment. All applicants are screened by the principal of the school in which they will be employed, and by the Superintendent. Initially a reference check is secured, then an interview with the principal is scheduled, followed by an interview with the Superintendent. After the interviews, administrative recommendations are presented to the Board of Trustees for final approval.

Teacher aides and secretaries are required to have a high school diploma or a graduate equivalency diploma as a minimum requirement. We also ask for, and check, previous work references. Any reported college credits are also checked.

Cafeteria workers are not subject to academic requirements (high school diploma), but must have the ability to read recipes and to perform duties as specified in the job description for cafeteria workers. Our cafeteria manager arranges and conducts interviews with prospective employees, and makes recommendations for the Superintendent's approval.

In the maintenance, transportation, and grounds areas, applicants must possess the qualifications and abilities to carry out duties as specified in the job description. These employees are selected by the immediate supervisor with the approval of the Superintendent.

Our Board of Trustees, administrative team, and supervisors strive to obtain the best possible employees for our district. I feel very fortunate in the fact that we have good people working for Plains I.S.D. and our employees complete their duties in a conscientious and responsible manner.



About GATT: Negotiations are in their second year concerning a wide range of agricultural and other trade issues. The negotiations are called the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade and are taking place in Geneva, Switzerland. The United States negotiating team, led by U.S. Trade Representative Carla Hills and her predecessor, current U.S. Agriculture Secretary, Clayton Yeutter, has proposed the elimination of any farm programs that are linked to production or price, as U.S. programs have been historically. Many American producers, believing that our agricultural policy should be drafted in Washington by our elected representatives, with significant input from American farmers, are concerned that trade negotiators might sacrifice the best interests of the agricultural sector for other sectors of the U.S. economy. It has been suggested that guidelines for the GATT negotiators should be made a part of the 1990 Farm Bill.






