Agricultural education classes stress hands-on experience in diverse areas of agriculture. FFA activities provide leadership development, career training and award incentives for young people.

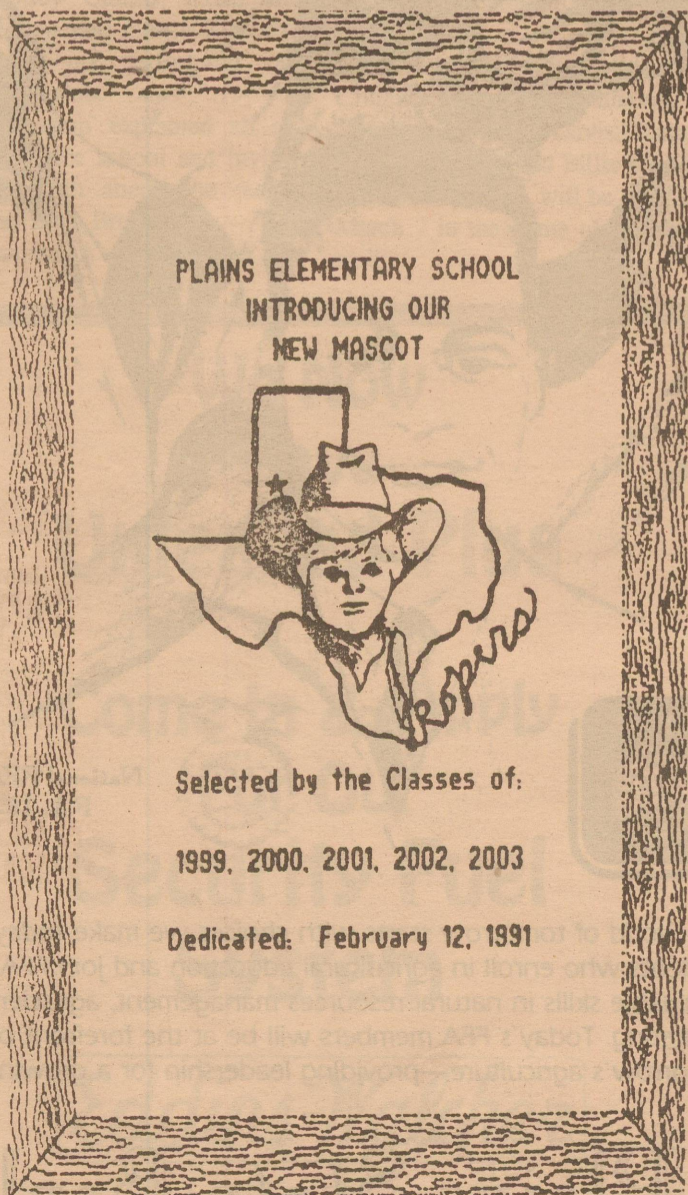
Mark Timm, national FFA president from Fillmore, Ind., said FFA Week is an opportunity for members and communities to recognize

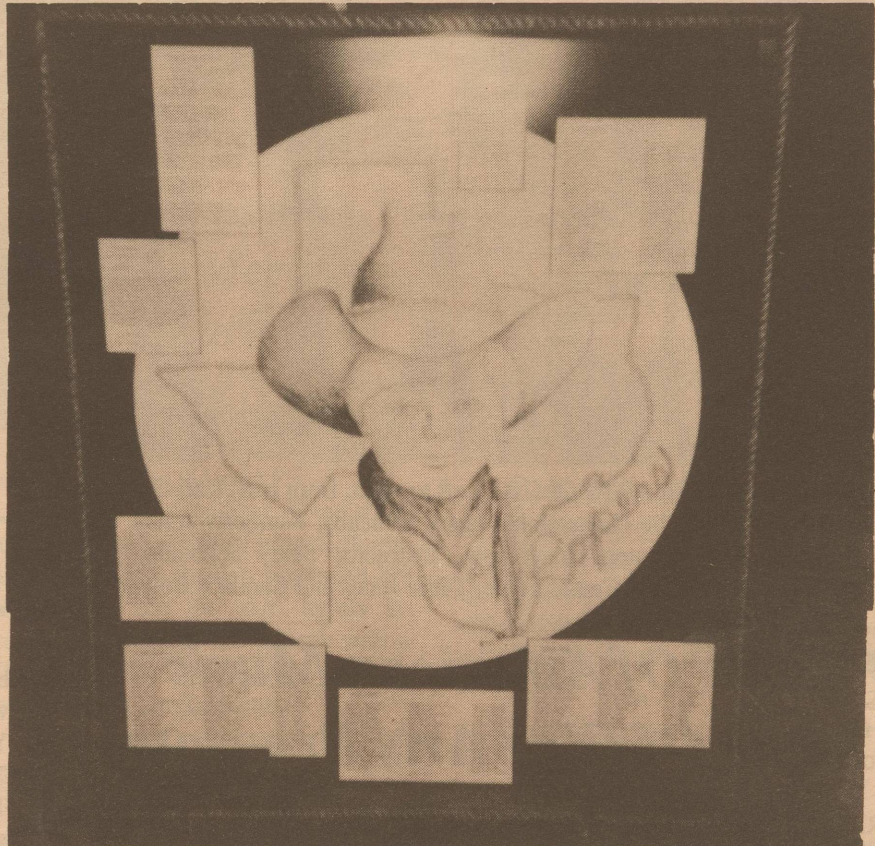

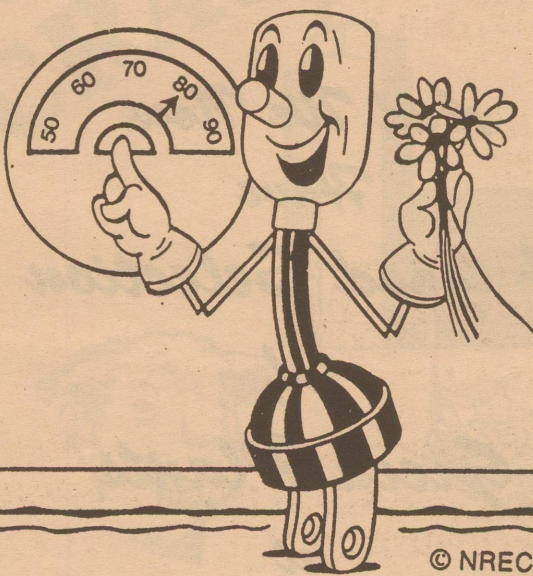

The Newsom family will discuss wine grape industry in Plains at the Feb. 25 meeting.

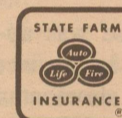

Yoakum County Commissioners Court met in regular session Monday. All members were present.

The Tax Assessor/Collector's report of taxes collected in January was approved. Also approved was the decision to purchase computer equipment from Tell Micro Systems to be leased to Community Supervision and Corrections Department (Adult Probation).

Bids were opened from Plains State Bank and Yoakum County State Bank to act as depository for county funds for two years. Bid of Plains State Bank was accepted. Securities due Feb. 15 were approved for release on due date.

Also approved was a motion to renew insurance coverage with Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Texas Inc. effective March 1 through Feb. 28, 1992 with no increases on health coverage rates. Term life will increase from \$.71 to \$.78 with rates remaining the same at \$.05 for AD&D.

The court voted to add elected officials to Workers Compensation coverage.

A \$50 per month raise was approved for Lemual Austin in precinct one at the completion of a six months probationary period effective Feb. 1.

Purchase of a piece of property north of precinct four barn was ap-

proved for purchase from Wayne House at an agreed price of \$2,100.
