Local photographer studies at Sam Houston State University

completed a week long concentrated workshop in Studio Photography From A to Z conducted by the Texas School of Professional Photography at Sam Houston State University.

Earnest studied with Bill Weaks, a nationally recognized specialist in portrait photography. Completion of this workshop earns Mrs. Earnest one achievement merit toward the Master of Photography Degree awarded by the Professional Photographers of America, the 112 year old international organization which is the oldest and largest association of professional photographers in the world.

This is the 18th annual Texas School of Professional Photography, and the 11th school co-sponsored by Sam Houston State University. Dr. Emmette Jackson, SHSU photography program coordinator, reported 200 professional photographers from throughout the United States took part in this year's program.

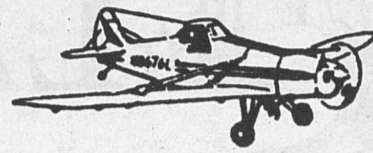

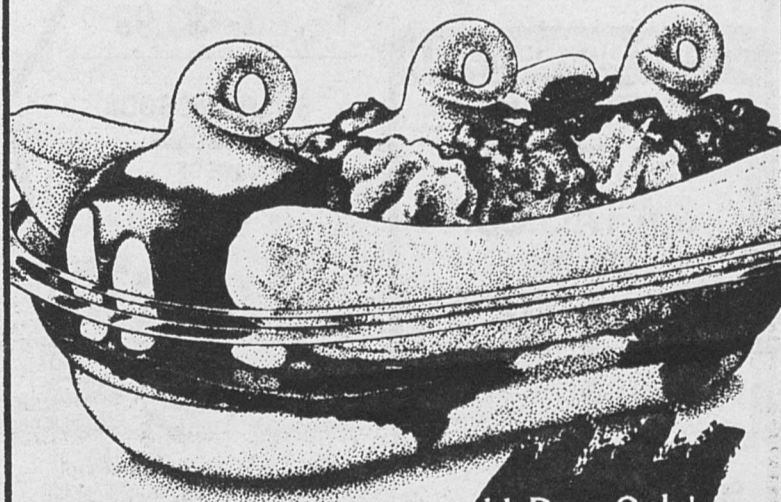
