The lash of necessity It is generally conceded that increased production stabilizes credits and tends to lasting prosperity if rightly used and as "No man liveth street to somebody who doesn't to himself alone" and "all are his brother's keepers" let us direct our thoughts to just how increased production may be accomplished. Since returns of production in its last analysis is net returns-after all expenses are paid-the expense account then should be the item of paramount concern in the curriculum of every well regulated farm. From my observation of nineteen years in the handling of credits, I have learned that the farmer who has a bunch of chickens, and cares for them; a few good cows, with a little cream or butter to sell now and then; and a few hogs always gets through the lean years with more ease and grace than do those who follow any other course. Cows-hogs-and chickens you know cut expenses and the cotton and grain revenue is clear at harvest time. If I were farming there are three rules I would follow: First, plant lots of feed. Second, harvest lots of feed; and third, keep all the feed I made. Feed is the very foundation of the farm. Without feed in abundance the whole structure crumbles and being happy.
