ANNUAL COUNTY PECAN SHOW IS PLANNED HERE FOR DECEMBER

The third annual Eastland County Pecan Show will be held in Cisco on Friday and Saturday, Dec. 9 and 10, according to an announcement by County Agent J. M. Cooper. The Cisco Chamber of Commerce will again sponsor the show as they have done for the past two years.

Plans call for the pecans to be judged on Saturday, Dec. 10. Complete details of the show will be announced in the near future.

"We are greatly indebted to the Cisco Chamber of Commerce for their interest and we thank them for their fine cooperation," Mr. Cooper wrote in a letter to all county pecan growers.

"As you begin to harvest your nuts in the next few weeks, please keep the pecan show in mind and save back some of your best paper shell pecans and native seedlings to exhibit.

"Eastland County has some of the best pecan soil to be found anywhere and pecans in the years ahead could become one of the most important crops. It is up to

F.H.A. Discusses Improvements In Credit Services

Further improvements in credit service to farmers are being made by the Farmers Home Administration, Walter T. McKay, the agency's Texas state director, said today.

Improvements in the management of the agency's operations were discussed at a training meeting held in St. Louis, Missouri, last week which Mr. McKay attended. A new employees training program, careful calendaring of state and county office work, public information responsibilities of agency employees, and how to get maximum use from administrative funds were discussed.

Farmers Home Administration officials attending the meeting were urged to take every step possible to further increase the participation by private lenders in the Insured Lending Program. These funds advanced by private lenders and insured by the agency along with funds appropriated by Congress are used by farmers to buy, develop and operate family-type farms.

"With the expansion in our activities that has taken place in the last two years it is more important than ever before that we place our operations in high gear and give prompt and careful attention to every loan application," McKay said.

During the past year the agricultural loans made and insured by the agency reached a record total of \$293,190,000 throughout the United States. Loans in Texas totaled \$47,480,000.

The increased cost of develop-

Trainees Exam Is Planned By Civil Service Agency

A civil service examination for Veterinarian Trainee has been announced for filling positions paying \$3,670 a year. Jobs to be filled are with the Agricultural Service of the Department of Agriculture and are located throughout the United States.

Appointments to these trainee positions will be made to junior students of veterinary medicine for on-the-job training during their summer vacation period. When the student trainee is graduated from a veterinary college, he will be eligible for a position with the Agricultural Research Service as veterinarian, \$4,390 a year.

To qualify, applicants must have completed 4 years of veterinary medicine, one year of which may have been in preveterinary medicine. Competitors also be required to take a written test.

Applications must be filed not later than Nov. 1, 1935, with the Executive Secretary, Board of Civil Service Examiners, U. S. Department of Agriculture, Washington 25, D. C.

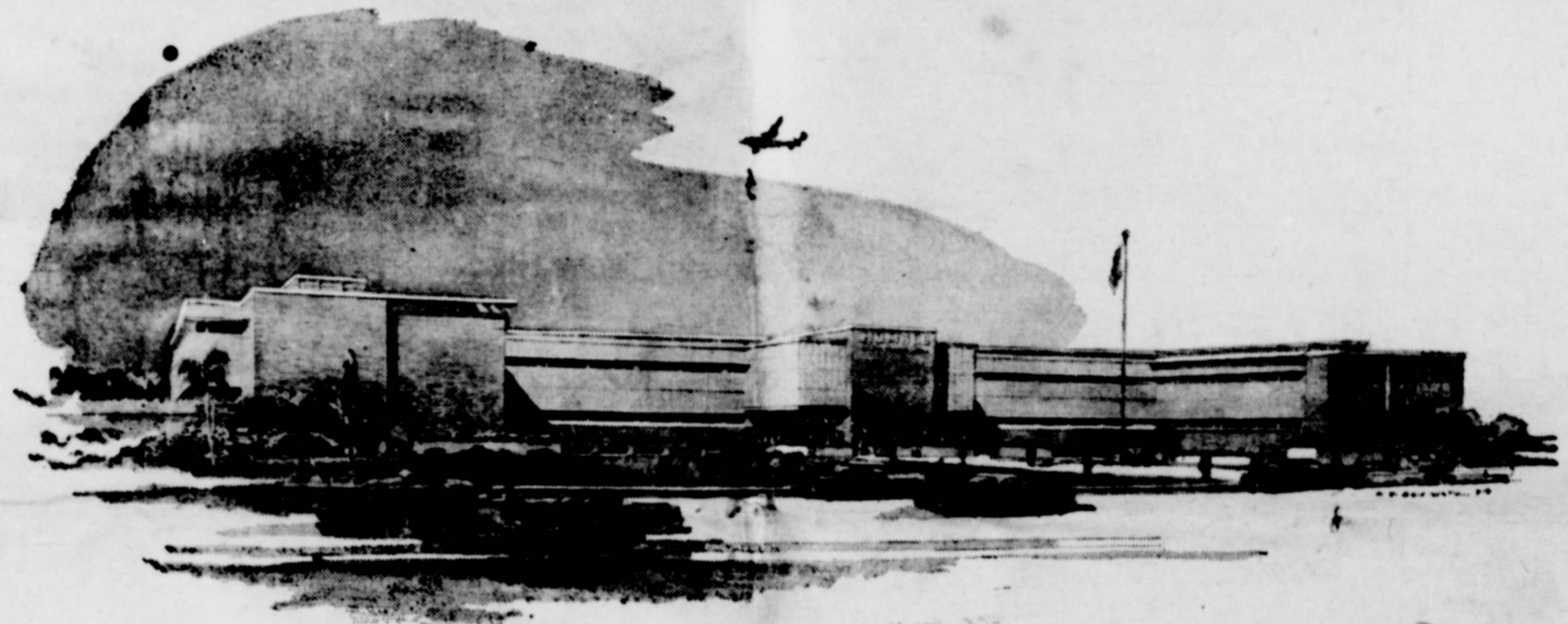

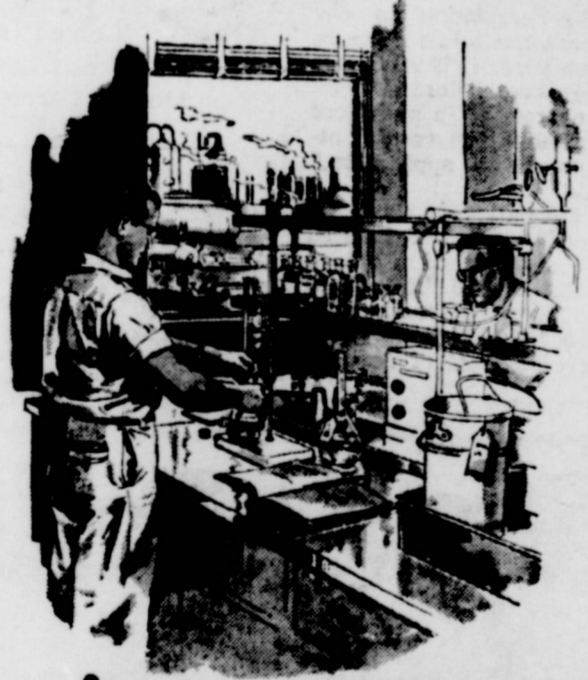

Christmas Mail Data In Pamphlet At Post Office

Helpful facts about wrapping and shipping packages are contained in a well illustrated pamphlet entitled "Packaging and Wrapping Parcels for Mailing" available free at the Cisco Post Office after October 15, Postmaster W. J. Foxworth announced Saturday.

A new publication excerpted from the Postal Manual, this pamphlet describes the types and sizes of cartons best suited for outer and inner shipping containers; gives details for the internal protection for goods being shipped; lists hints on wrapping china-ware, stemware, framed pictures, books, and other goods; and gives instructions for marking various types of parcels to insure the quickest possible delivery.

Written instructions are highlighted by numerous illustrations showing how to wrap and tie packages securely. Drawings of various types of containers and

boxes and the best way to use protective material to guard goods against breakage are also used.

"If used in conjunction with the free pamphlet, 'Domestic Postage Rates and Fees,' issued a few months ago, this pamphlet should answer practically all questions any user of the mails might have on fees, rates, special services, and protection of parcels in transit," Mr. Foxworth commented.

The postmaster emphasized that much of the delay in delivery of parcels, particularly at Christmas, and most of the damage en route is due to lack of knowledge of basic rules to follow in mailing packages.

"I hope patrons of the Cisco Post Office will avail themselves of these two free pamphlets: 'Packaging and Wrapping Parcels for Mailing,' Post Office Department Publication No. 2; and 'Domestic Postage Rates and Fees,' Publication No. 3; which will answer most of their mailing questions, demonstrate the best methods of packing goods, and help the postal employees throughout the nation in their important work of moving the huge volume of Christmas parcels."
