HD Club Project Will Test Water Wells For Purity

As a service to the people in Eastland County the Home Demonstration Clubs have joined together and made it possible for any interested person to have their drinking water tested.

Few people realize the danger of disease which is found in water. Besides Typhoid Fever and intestinal infections, water, also plays a part in the communication of cholera, dracontiasis, dysentery, echinococcosis, infectious hepatitis, herpangina, leptospirosis, and paratyphoid fever. One never knows when one of these diseases might be in their drinking water until one of the family is stricken with it, unless they have their water tested and analyzed.

Sterile bottles for the project have been furnished by the County Health Unit in Abilene. The procedure for obtaining the sample is simple. Flame your hydrant, or other device that you might have to use to put the water in the bottle. Remove the cap from the bottle leaving the paper hood on the cap. Be very careful not to touch either the cap or the bottle top with your hand. Fill the bottle. Replace the cap and paper hood. Fill out the three cards which come with the bottle, placing a two cent stamp on one of them. Wrap the bottle with the card around it, and place it back in the paper wrapper. Mail your sample, as soon as it is collected, to County Health Unit, 125 1/2 Chestnut St.; Abilene, Texas.

"Since the only cost for this water testing is a few cents postage we feel sure that everyone in the county who has a water supply will want to take advantage of this opportunity. Bottles may be obtained from the home demonstration club members, or from my office here in Eastland. We would like to stress that this is not just for non demonstration club members, but for anyone in the county who is interested. Our chief goal as home demonstration women in this worthwhile project is to help make Eastland County have a safe drinking water supply free of infectious diseases," stated Minnie Mae Billingsley, Eastland County Home Demonstration Agent.

Toasted Rice Turkey Stuffing

This stuffing is a "must" for that turkey you're roasting. Toasted grains of rice have a delicious nutty flavor that's just right with turkey. This stuffing is so good and easy to make, you'll use it with chicken, too.

INGREDIENTS:

- 1 cup uncooked white rice
- 2 cups water
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 3 tablespoons butter or margarine
- 1/2 cup chopped onion
- 1 cup fine dry bread crumbs
- 1 egg
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 teaspoon poultry seasoning
- 1 cup chopped celery
- Dash of black pepper
- 1/4 cup water or turkey broth

METHOD: Spread rice in a shallow pan and place in a 400° F. oven. When the grains turn slightly yellow, stir well. Continue to toast, stirring occasionally, until rice grains are a light

golden color. This takes 15 to 20 minutes. Put the toasted rice in a saucepan. Add the water and salt. Bring to a vigorous boil. Turn the heat as low as possible. Cover the saucepan with a lid and leave over this low heat 14 minutes. Remove from heat, but leave lid on 10 minutes.

While the rice is cooking, melt the butter or margarine in a saucepan. Add the onion and celery. Cook until tender, stirring occasionally. Add onion and celery mixture to the rice and mix in the bread crumbs, egg, salt, poultry seasoning, pepper and broth or water. Stuff lightly into the bird. Do not pack as the stuffing expands during the cooking. Stuff the bird just before it is placed in the oven. Do not stuff and refrigerate. This stuffing, however, may be prepared ahead of time so long as the liquids are not mixed with the dry ingredients until the turkey is to be stuffed and cooked. Extra stuffing can be baked in a separate pan or made into balls. The recipe makes about 6 cups of stuffing.

Allow 1/4 cup of stuffing for each pound of poultry, dressed weight, or 1 cup for each pound ready-to-cook weight.

Frosted grapes are a lovely inexpensive and eatable garnish for turkey. Just dip grapes in slightly beaten egg whites and then into beet or cane sugar.

TO SAID HONORABLE COURT:

Now come S. I. Stoker, Samuel Dale Stoker and Wayne F. Stoker, all of McLennan County, Texas; Zella Jo Stoker Stubblefield, a feme sole, of Dallas County, Texas; and Robert Allen Stoker, of Alameda County, California, and respectfully show to the Court:

That they are the owners of fifty acres of land in Eastland County, Texas, out of Section 27, Block 4, H. & T. C. Railway Company Survey, located about one and one-fourth miles West of the town of Eastland and described by metes and bounds as follows:

Beginning at a point 608 yds. North and 431-1-2 yds. Accidents Cause 4th Of Deaths In Texas Each Year

AUSTIN, June 23. — Accidents rank fourth as a cause of death in Texas. According to Dr. Henry A. Holle, Commissioner of Health, 5,372 Texans died last year of this one cause, while thousands more were crippled. There are no figures available on the number of days lost because of accidents, there can be no doubt but that it is tremendous.

Automobiles caused 2,519 deaths or 47% of the total. The dangerous curves and intersections on the highways in Texas are well marked and drivers can assist greatly in reducing accidents by carefully observing them.

Many accidents could be avoided if motorists would drive below the legal speed limits when tired, sleepy, in rainy weather and when other hazards exist. One should adhere closely to the law regarding the dimming of lights for approaching cars. It is an old saying, but true, that those who drink should not drive.

Many deaths are caused by accidents in the home. A total of 650 deaths were caused last year by falls. In the homes most of these fatal accidents occur on either outside or inside stairways. Of course, there are many other locations in the home where accidents can and do happen.

Disorderly housekeeping, poor furniture arrangement, slippery waxed floors, worn floor coverings, unanchored rugs, neglected repairs and dark or obstructed passageways are other fall hazards found in many homes. Short cuts and so-called time savers frequently lead to accidents. The time saved is insignificant compared to the cost and time lost from an accident. When everybody develops safety habits, accidents will not be "fourth" as a cause of deaths.

CATTLEMEN DECIDE TO STAGE REGISTERED SHOW NEXT SPRING

The Cisco Livestock Show Association will hold another registered calf show here next spring, it was decided Monday night at a meeting of area breeders of registered cattle held at the First National Bank's community conference room.

Plans call for the 1956 show to be held in mid-May on the same date as the annual Cisco Junior College Ranch Day. Holding the two events simultaneously will be advantageous to both the show and the college program, it was decided.

Show officials also plan to add several classes and to change up the program from what it has been the past two years. A committee composed of County Agent J. M. Cooper, Vocational Agriculture Instructor Tommy Toland and Rancher T. G. Caudle will make recommendations for the

new program at another association meeting.

Gene Abbott and Paul Brashear attended as representatives of the Cisco Chamber of Commerce. They pledged the organization's cooperation in making the show a big success.

Sutton Crofts, president of the show association, reported that the ranchers were pleased with the prospects for next year's show.

Schedule Given For Local Visits Of SS Official

Traveling service is rendered throughout the Abilene district of the Social Security Administration, according to R. R. Tuley,

Jr., district manager.

"Interviewers talk personally with each applicant for old-age and survivors insurance benefits, to avoid misunderstandings on the part of beneficiaries as to their rights as well as their duties and responsibilities," he added.

Tuley explained that field personnel assist applicants to secure evidence or information to put their claims in order for prompt payments, since payments are generally needed soon after earnings are reduced or cut off in older years or by death.

"We gather the names of persons desiring social security information in a special holding file, and by making periodic trips are able to talk with many people in their own neighborhoods with no cost to the inquirer and a very small average cost to the government for such service," Tuley continued.

Almond Chicken With Rice

Chinese Chicken Almond With Rice, a delightful delicately flavored dish with chicken, celery topping, is sure to please your family. It makes an attractive "one main dish type meal" and is easily served to a crowd. Fresh or canned mushrooms may be used for making Chinese Almond Chicken.

INGREDIENTS
 1 cup uncooked rice
 1 cup sliced mushrooms (canned or fresh)
 1 cup almonds - blanched
 1/2 cup oil, to be used in a frying pan at a time
 1/2 cup salt
 1/2 cup bamboo shoots
 1/2 cup water chestnuts
 1/2 cup celery
 1/2 cup cold chicken (fresh or canned)

INGREDIENTS FOR GRAVY
 1/2 cup cornstarch
 1/2 cup sugar
 1/2 cup water
 1/2 cup soy sauce
CASHEW
 1 cup sliced green onion
PREPARING THE FLUFFY WHITE RICE-To make 3 cups fluffy rice: Put 1 cup of uncooked rice, 3 cups of cold water and 1/2 teaspoon of salt in a two-

quart saucepan and cover with a tight-fitting lid. Bring to a vigorous boil. Then reduce the heat as low as possible and steam for 14 minutes or until all the water is absorbed, leaving the separate rice grains with their full nutritional value. This makes very firm rice grains. (If you prefer more tender rice grains, add 1/4 cup more water and increase the slow cooking time 4 or 5 minutes.) Remove the lid, permit the rice to steam dry to the desired consistency and the grains will be separate and fluffy. Never stir rice; lift gently with a fork.

METHOD: Brown almonds in 1 tablespoon oil. Set aside. With table fork, mash garlic into salt in skillet. (Be sure there is a tight-fitting cover, which can be used later.) Add 1 tablespoon oil, then add chicken. Brown lightly. Add 1 tablespoon oil and then bamboo shoots and mushrooms. Brown lightly. Add liquid, drained from canned bamboo shoots and water chestnuts. Cover tightly. Cook over low heat 8 minutes. Add water chestnuts, celery and 1/2 of the almonds. Just heat through. Celery and chestnuts should remain crisp. For gravy... shake up in small jar, cornstarch, salt, sugar, water and soy sauce. Stir into mixture. Cook until liquid thickens and is smooth. Sprinkle over dish, green onions and rest of almonds. Serve with hot fluffy cooked rice. This will serve 4.
