## JUDGE HART IS MADE HONORARY MEMBER OF COUNTY 4-H CLUBS

The Honorable John S. Hart, county judge of Eastland County, was presented with a certificate making him an honorary 4-H Club member in ceremonies at the American Legion Building in Eastland on Saturday, April 23.

The presentation was made by Don Jobe, Eastland County 4-H Council president, after Judge Hart had presented medals to county winners in various 4-H award contests. The award was sponsored by the 4-H Council and was given to the Judge because of his interest in, and support of, the 4-H Clubs in the county. He has shown an interest in youth and believes that the 4-H Clubs help keep young people out of his courtroom.

Judge Hart is the head of the County Commissioners Court which makes it possible for outstanding 4-H'ers to attend the Texas 4-H Round-Up at Texas A. & M. in June of each year. The Judge has honored the 4-H Clubs of the county for several years by presenting the county winners with their medals.

In receiving the award, Judge Hart told the 4-H members, "Today's American youth is profiting from the sacrifices and labor of previous generations of Americans. Yours is a great heritage, and with it comes the responsibility to preserve, protect and pass it on to your children for succeeding generations. The decision that you make toward your responsibilities of citizenship will largely determine whether you will become a useful citizen, or one who shirks the duties which your society places upon you."

The morning program consisted of tractor maintenance and safety demonstrations by Dan Jobe and Robert Bell of Scranton and Nimrod, respectively, a dairy foods demonstration by Nancy Norris and Corynne Benton of Carbon, the presentation of awards, and entertainment by Bill Park's Western Band, the county Share-The-Fun winners.

The 4-H members brought sack lunches which were eaten in the Eastland City Park. Drinks were furnished by the First National Bank of Eastland.

The afternoon program was composed of games with the winning group being presented prizes.

The Gold Star awards which are presented to the outstanding 4-H boy and outstanding 4-H girl each year went to Robert Bell of Nimrod and Martha Walker of Rising Star. The county agents and home demonstration agents select the recipients of this award and it is the highest award available to a 4-H member in the county.

### Rules Are Given For Calf Show To Be Held May 21

Calves to be shown at the annual registered beef calf show to be held in Cisco on Saturday, May 21, must have been dropped on or after last September to be eligible for competition, according to T. G. Caudle, general show superintendent.

All calves entered in the show will be purebred and eligible for registration. They will be shown in pens of three calves of the same sex to compete with others for competition, he said.

The Cisco Livestock Show Association is sponsoring the one day show. Only a few of the 35 breeders of registered beef cattle in Eastland County have entered animals. The animals will be in their places by 9 a. m. They can be released and taken home by 4 p. m. of the same day.

According to Ed Huestis, Cisco grounds superintendent, each breeder is responsible for his own panels for his pens of calves. It is suggested that the panels be brought in the day before the show and set up.

Breeders are eligible to exhibit individual animals of either sex for show purposes only, it was explained. They will not compete against each other and will not be judged. Only pens of calves will be shown in competition. No cash prizes are being offered. Only ribbons will be given.

Only calves of the Hereford and Angus breeds will be shown at the one day affair.
