There are 35 breeders of registered beef cattle of the Hereford and Angus breeds in Eastland County.

There will be no public sale or auction at the one day registered beef calf show in Cisco on May 21, it was announced today by Sutton Crofts President of the Cisco Livestock Show Association, sponsoring organization.

Calves entered for competition in the show may have been fed any way the breeder desired so long as the calf suckled its own dam and was not on a nurse cow, it was said. All calves shown in pens of three of the same sex must have been dropped on or after September 1, 1954.

Breeders may enter individual animals of any age or sex for show purposes only and not for competition. Several have announced their intention of doing so.

It will be the second annual show of registered beef cattle sponsored by the Cisco Livestock Show Association. T. G. Caudle and E. D. Huestis is ground superintendent.

The first one day registered beef calf show held last June attracted wide attention with 15 pens of animals entered for competition. Breeders showing animals last year included A. V. Clark, T. G. Caudle, Jeep Mitcham, Bill Mitcham, Cisco; Ed Harrison and Dr. D. V. Rodgers, Gorman; C. B. Pruett, Ranger; Ed Huestis, Garland Pharr, J. W. Sitton, Dr. N. A. Brown and Joe Coats, Cisco.

There was no public sale at last year's show and there will not be any at this year's it was explained. Breeders may sell at private treaty any time during the day.


