Rice is the source of excellent vegetable or incomplete protein, so toss it with meat or other animal foods in order to get its full nutritional value.

Breakfast dishes that team these foods together are rice pancakes, rice cooked in milk, rice muffins, or plain rice served with an egg or meat.

For dinner or supper, there are dishes such as oriental chicken pilaf, meat sauce and rice, pork chop casserole, rice pudding, rice and fish soup, and many others that combine the cereal and animal proteins.

For a "meal in a soup bowl" we tried this rice and fish dish in a large saucepan or soup kettle mixed together 1 cup uncooked rice; 1 8-ounce can tomato sauce, 1 1/2 cups uncooked fresh, frozen or canned minced vegetable, 1 pound unthawed frozen fish fillets cut into inch long pieces, 3 teaspoons salt, 1/4 teaspoon black pepper, and 3 cups water. Bring the mixture to a vigorous boil. Turn the heat as low as possible. Cover with a lid and leave over this low heat 20 minutes. Add water if thinner soup is desired.

PROGRAM FOR ANNUAL COUNTY PECAN FIELD DAY ANNOUNCED

The annual Eastland County Pecan Field Day will be held April 23 at the C. D. Simmons orchard, near Gorman, according to information from the County Agent's office.

Pecan growers from Eastland and adjoining counties are invited to attend the all day affair which starts at 10 o'clock and lasts until mid afternoon, the agent said.

Cover crops, fertilizers, crow control, new pecan varieties, insects, sprays and other topics will be discussed at the meeting by top pecan men from over the state.

Those who have been asked to appear on the program include B. G. Hancock, extension horticulturist, A&M College; W. L. Rainey, pecan nurseryman and grower, Richland Springs; L. G. Romberg, U. S. Pecan Experiment Station, Brownwood, and J. W. Foster, Jr., entomologist, Weatherford.
 Several round table discussions

will be held on several topics in order to give those in attendance a chance to express their opinion. Those who attend are asked to bring their own picnic lunch. Coffee and cold drinks are to be furnished.

The annual field day in 1954 was held on the Lee Leiske farm in the Nimrod Community.

The place for the annual county pecan show will also be selected during the day. The pecan show has been held at Cisco the past two years. It has been the only county show of its kind in the state.
