## Judge Collie To Name Woman On Jury Commission

Judge T. M. Collie has announced that the jury commission for the selection of grand and petit jurors for the December term of the 91st District Court will have at least one woman on it, thereby recognizing and putting into effect the recent constitutional amendment providing for women to sit on juries in Texas.

The Jury Commission will be appointed by Judge Collie in the near future and will meet the latter part of November. He has not determined yet who the woman will be to sit on the commission.

In making the announcement, Judge Collie stated:

"The Constitutional Amendment providing for service of women on juries will become effective on November 19, 1954. The amendment will be put into effect in this court at the December term, which convenes on December 6th. Juries for the October and November term were selected in September so it will not be possible for women to serve before the December term.

"Under the provisions of the amendment, women are to serve on both Grand and Petit Juries.

"I am looking forward to the operation of this amendment with a great deal of interest, and I believe it will prove effective in the administration of justice in jury trials."

### Stockmen Invited To Join Agency

Walter Kurklin, Cisco, R. W. Drake of Strawn and C. M. McCain of Eastland were elected to the Board of Directors of the West Texas Ranchers Association recently. Sam Kimmell, Cisco, was re-named president, and Dr. R. L. Rogers, Gordon, and T. C. Fambro of Strawn and Breckenridge, vice president. Sutton P. Crofts and Charles A. Clark was retained as secretary and treasurer.

Mr. Kimmell said that the association has increased its membership and is in better financial condition than any time since its organization. Organized as an anti-theft association, it has expanded its services to include sponsorship of many activities beneficial to the livestock industry in the five county area which it serves.

President Kimmell pointed out that the greater the membership of the association, the more services it can render its members. Anyone interested in becoming a member of this Association is requested to contact any of the officers or directors.

### Production Of Fords Is At All-Time High

DALLAS, Nov. 20. — Car and truck production at the Dallas Ford Assembly Plant has reached an all-time high of 654 units a day, C. F. Jesse, plant manager, announced today.

Previous daily high was 584 units, a production rate which was maintained throughout the summer and early autumn.

The first power-producing public utility was built in New York City in 1882.

The application of conservation practices has increased considerably the past two weeks in that portion of the ULSCD served by the Soil Conservation Service work unit in Eastland. Cover crop planting has been responsible for the greatest activity with approximately 12,500 acres already planted (largely vetch and rye on peanut land).

Several thousand acres more will be planted when peanut harvesting is completed. In addition to its value in preventing loss of soil by wind erosion the cover crops add valuable organic matter and nutrients to the soil to replace in part the nutrients removed by the preceding peanut crop.

Vetch and rye and vetch and oats also provide valuable grazing for livestock. Upper Leon Soil Conservation District supervisor F. M. Spurlen of Eastland stated that he is greatly encouraged by the amount of cover crops being planted.

Terraces were completed recently on the H. A. Lovell farm southeast of Carbon and on the Mack Carr farm near Dothan. Both sets of terraces have already proved their value by holding additional water on the fields during the recent rain.

Stock ponds for storage of water to provide more uniform distribution of grazing have recently been completed on the E. H. Cook farm east of Carbon, on the H. E. Fox farm northwest of Eastland, and on the M. S. James farm at Bullock. On the Idus Echols farm near Staff a diversion terrace was constructed along with his pond in order to provide a larger watershed to insure filling of his pond.

A large pond on the Joe Coats ranch northwest of Cisco completed just prior to the recent rain filled and ran around the spillway. Several other ponds are now in the process of being constructed.

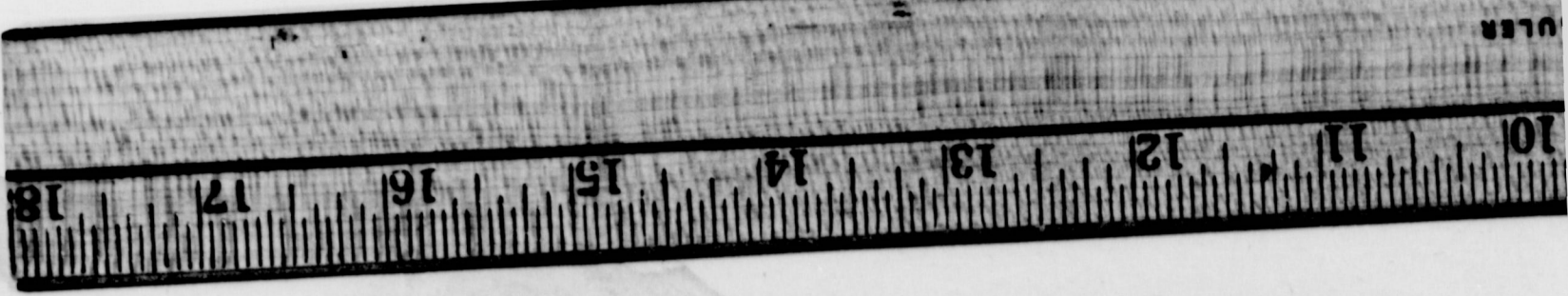

### Livestock Sales In County To Be Shown In Report

Livestock auction ring sales in Eastland County are a feature of a new state-wide market report now issued by the Texas Department of Agriculture, according to word from Austin.

Agriculture Commissioner John C. White selected 16 auction sales in eight West Texas counties for the experimental news project. Data from the sales will be distributed by radio and newspapers. Daily bulletins are available to interested persons.

West Texas points covered in the report, besides Eastland Co., include Lubbock, San Angelo, Abilene, Brownwood, Wichita Falls, Vernon and Goldthwaite. Reports will include sale information on cattle, hogs, sheep and goats.

This new service resulted from a demand by the livestock trade for a more complete coverage of stock movement in auction rings. Previously, only marketing data from such major points as Fort Worth, San Antonio, Amarillo, and Houston was collected by marketing agencies for state distribution.

Mail bulletins are available to those persons who request the service. Inquiries should be addressed to: Market News, Texas Dept. of Agriculture, Austin, Texas. There is no charge for the bulletins.

Livestock auction reporting is only one of the many services offered by the Market News branch of the Department. Price reports are available on poultry and eggs, fruits and vegetables, rice, pecans and turkeys.
