Bobby Gene Koonce, son of Mr. and Mrs. R. C. Koonce, Desdemona, showed his Duroc Jersey gilt to first place over pigs from Stephens, Palo Pinto, Young, Jack, and Throckmorton Counties, it was reported.

Frozen Lemon Pie A Toothsome Dish

FROZEN lemon pie is a toothsome dinner dessert for the family that's been working hard all day, says the Country Cooking editor of Capper's Farmer.

Graham cracker crumbs are crust and topping for the chilled yellow filling, she writes in the nationally circulated farm magazine. Pie-shaped pieces are made by cutting diagonally across the refrigerator tray in which pie is frozen.

The dessert which will be an ever-popular family favorite, serves 8, the Capper's Farmer expert advises.



FROZEN LEMON PIE

2 eggs, separated	1 c. evaporated milk, whipped
1/2 c. lemon juice	1/2 c. graham cracker crumbs
1/2 c. sugar	1/2 c. sugar

Beat egg yolks; add lemon juice and piece of rind sliced on lemon and all but 2 tablespoons of the sugar. Cook over low heat 15 minutes, stirring constantly. Remove rind and cool. Beat egg whites until stiff; add remaining sugar and fold into cooked mixture. Add whipped evaporated milk. Pour into refrigerator tray with waffle paper. Sprinkle with 1/4 cup of the remaining sugar. Pour in lemon mixture. Bake at 350° F. until remaining crumbs are brown. Temperature set at 350° F. Serves 8.

Examinations have been announced by the U. S. Civil Service Commission for Clinical Psychologist for filling positions paying \$5,940 to \$10,800 a year in Veterans Administration hospitals and offices throughout the country; and for Medical Officer, for filling the following trainee positions in St. Elizabeths Hospital in Washington, D. C.: Rotating Intern, \$2,800 a year, Psychiatric Resident, \$3,400 to \$4,200 a year, and Neurologic Resident, \$3,400 to \$4,200 a year. Written tests are not required for these examinations. To qual-

ify, applicants must have had appropriate education and training or experience. Applications will be accepted until further notice.
