J. P. Payte Dies At Lubbock

J. P. Payte of Midland, former resident of Carbon for many years, passed away in a Lubbock Hospital Saturday, June 12, after several years of ill health. Funeral services were held Sunday at 3:00 p. m. at Hamner Funeral Chapel in Eastland with Rev. Warde of Abilene officiating. Interment was in the Eastland cemetery.

Born June 5, 1866, he was married to Elizabeth Powell Oct. 10, 1885 in Chapel Hill, Ark. They moved to Carbon in 1897 where Mrs. Payte preceded him in death a number of years ago. Both were members of the Methodist Church.

Fred Walker, range specialist of the Texas A&M College Extension Service, will conduct a range judging contest during the annual field day of the Eastland County Livestock Raisers Association on the Ed Harrison ranch June 18th, according to Boyd Hilley, president of the organization.

The Harrison B&B Hereford ranch is five miles east of Gorman on the Desdemona highway, Hilley said.

Besides Walker others from the A&M College Extension Service scheduled to be on the program include John G. McHancy, agricultural economist, and James A. Gray, animal husbandman. Two Fort Worth men, Walter Rice, field representative of the stockyards company, and E. R. Eudaly, animal nutritionist of Universal Mills, will also be on the all-day program which will get underway at 10 a. m. and last until mid-afternoon.

Lunch will be provided through the courtesy of the Gorman Business Men's Club, Hilley said.

Talks and demonstrations dealing with current livestock management problems are included on the all-day program. Bee cattle on the Harrison ranch as well as live sheep and goats will be used in discussing factors that determine quality in fine wool sheep and Angora goats.

The field day is only one activity of the livestock raisers group that was organized in the county many years ago.

Dangers Of Snake Bite Are Cited By Health Officer

AUSTIN, May 20. - A warning about the dangers of snake bite has just been issued by Dr. Henry A. Holle, State Health Officer. A number of cases of snake bite are reported each year in Texas during the summer and early fall; however, few of these result fatally.

Most of the bites occur on the hands or feet, which indicates that stepping, or falling in the immediate vicinity of an unseen snake or picking up objects under similar conditions are the hazards of contracting snake bite. The pain following the injection of the poison is most intense. Other symptoms are swelling, giddiness, difficult breathing, hemorrhage, weak pulse, and vomiting.

If one is unfortunate enough to be bitten by a poisonous snake, such as the rattlesnake, the following first aid measures should be carried out.

After making proper incisions at the site of the wound, apply suction and continue for at least half an hour.

Apply a tourniquet above the site of the wound, releasing same every ten or fifteen minutes for about 5 seconds at a time.

If the proper antivenom serum is available, apply it according to directions, but most important of all is to remove as much of the poison as is possible so as to prevent its absorption.

Secure the services of a physician at the earliest possible moment. If one is bitten by a poisonous snake DO NOT run or get overheated and DO NOT take any alcoholic stimulants because circulation increased by alcohol or exercise serves to distribute the poison much more rapidly through the body.

DON'T injure the tissues by injecting permanganate of potash, which is known to be of no value as an antidote.

DON'T depend upon home remedies or so-called snake bite cures, for they are of no value.
