Area Ranchers To Exhibit Animals

Ribbons for the winners at the one-day creep fed registered beef calf show to be held at the show grounds on the Albany Highway in Cisco on Friday, June 25, will be awarded through the courtesy of the Cisco Chamber of Commerce, according to members of the Cisco Livestock Show Association sponsors of the affair.

The show will be unusual in that the calves to be shown will be exhibited direct from the pasture and will not be broken to lead or to a halter, it was explained, making as practical as possible.

All ranchers who expect to show stock in the creep fed registered beef calf show on June 25 have been asked to meet at the Cisco Livestock Show barn on the Moran Highway at 8 a. m. Wednesday, June 9, to help cleanup the property and make preparations for the event.

Ed Huestis of Cisco is in charge of the show building and grounds and he has asked for the cooperation of the ranchers in making the preparations.

There will be no sale or auction of the one-day show but breeders who exhibit may sell animals by private treaty at any time during the one-day affair.

Breeders not only from Eastland but also from adjoining counties are eligible to show their calves. The animals to be entered for competition must have been dropped after September 23, 1953, and must be of the same sex. However, it was explained that calves of opposite sex or even individual animals may be exhibited simply for show but not in competition. Breeders are expected to furnish panels for penning the calves. The panels are to be eight feet by ten feet and four foot high made out of six inch rough boards.

There are no entry fees and animals are not required to be entered prior to the show date. Show officials would like to have the panels put up the day before however.

Send heifers will be turned over to club members in Cisco at 9 a. m. on August 5.

Successful applicants for the heifer calves will be selected by the committee at a meeting on July 15. Youngsters interested in the program were asked to contact Assistant County Agent Bob Williams for details.

Attending the meeting were County Agent J. M. Cooper, Assistant Williams, T. D. Wheat of Eastland, J. D. Lauderdale, James Starr and B. A. Butler of Cisco.

Mr. Butler, who is secretary of the committee, reported that there are now about 50 registered Jersey cows and heifer calves in the county as a result of the program.

Farmers and ranchers not only
from Eastland but also from ad-
joining counties are invited to at-
tend the annual Livestock Field
Day sponsored by the Eastland
County Livestock Raisers Associa-
tion at Harrison's G. & B.
Ranch, 5 miles East of Gorman,
on June 18, according to Boyd
Hilley, president.

Plans are complete for the all-
day program that gets underway
at 10 a. m. that morning and lasts
until mid-afternoon with time out
for a picnic lunch at noon through
the courtesy of the Gorman Busi-
ness Men's Club, Hilley said.

Various management problems
of the livestock industry will be
discussed or demonstrated during
the meeting. One feature that
will start the program off will be
a range judging contest by Fred
Walker, range specialist of the
Texas A&M College Extension
Service. Others from A&M who
will be on the program will be
John G. McHaney, agricultural

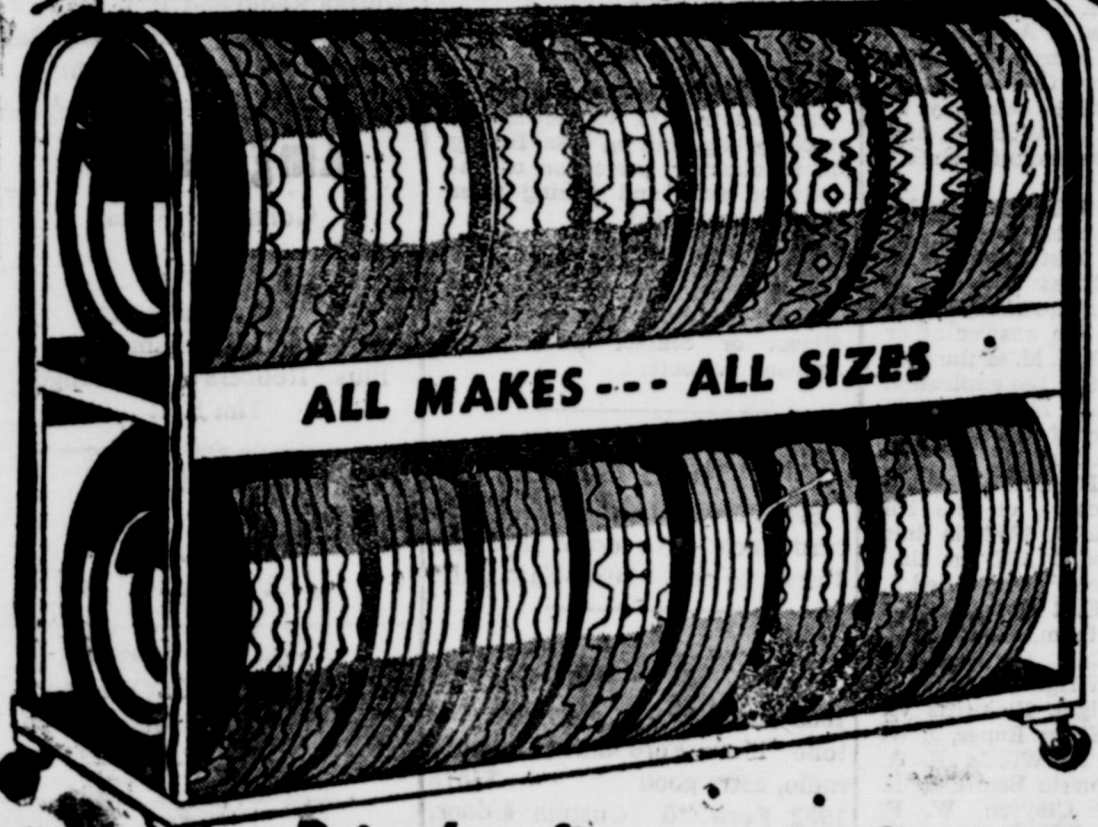

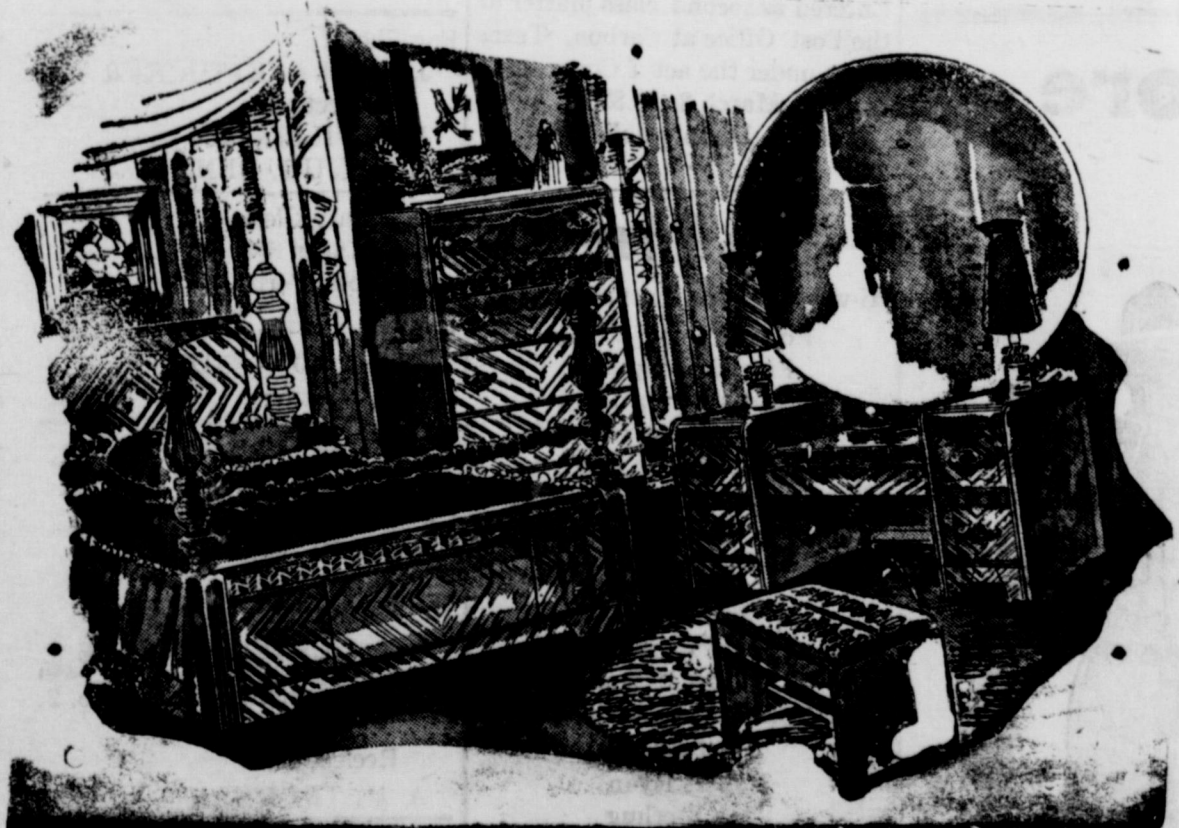

Surge Of Texans To Fishing Holes Shown In Report

AUSTIN, May 29. — The surge of Texans to the state's far-flung fishing places is reflected in the latest monthly arrest report, showing that all but 48 of the 229 cases listed involved angling violations.

The Director of Law Enforcement for the Game and Fish Commission said, "Seventy-eight prosecutions were based on lack of licenses, mainly individual fishing permits. Forty of the 171 fishing cases were for taking fish illegally."

This latter category included such as poisoning water to take fish; using electrical device to shock fish; and taking fish with seines or nets.

Other charges included illegal transportation of minnows; exceeding bag limit on bass; fishing in sanctuaries; possession of undersized fish; and fishing after license suspended.

The Director suggested fishermen in doubt about the more than 600 separate state fishing laws should consult a game and fish digest or contact their game warden or both.
