Farm Bureau To Sponsor Queen Contest Again

The Eastland County Farm Bureau will sponsor a Queen Contest again this year, according to a decision of the officers and directors at a meeting last week. President A. Z. Myrick presided over the meeting.

The purpose of the contest is to give the county unit an opportunity to select a girl to enter the district contest, a state-wide Farm Bureau project to encourage recognition of farm and ranch girls.

The rules of the contest are the same as last year. The girls must be single, sisters or daughters of Farm Bureau members, excluding county officers, between the ages of 16 and 21 years, who have not previously won the contest.

The girls will be judged on poise, personality and appearance. Each community has been urged to sponsor a girl in the county contest, scheduled for early summer, Mr. Myrick said.

A community meeting, set for June 15, was planned at Gorman. It will be in the form of a picnic supper and talent show at Boss Lake Park. Other community meetings will be held at Okra in July and Olden in August.

Rising Star Area Farms Will Plant Blue Panic Grass

Farmers and ranchers in the Rising Star area will plant about 500 acres of blue panic grass this spring. Two and three year old plantings of this grass have been very successful and as a result its popularity has increased.

Crit Evatt, stock farmer two miles northeast of May, Texas, has a year old planting of blue panic that is looking good. He believes that it is the best pasture grass he has planted. According to Mr. Evatt, it must be planted in rows and cultivated for best results.

Ben H. Moore, livestock farmer four miles northeast of May, said blue panic has been his most successful grass planting. He has a one year old planting that has given good grazing returns. Ben has planted Buffel, Birdwood, K. H. Bluestem and rescue on his farm.

Weldon Roach has about fifty acres of blue panic on his farm two miles east of Rising Star. Thirty of the fifty acres was planted in April of this year. He believes he could have obtained a better stand if he had waited two or three weeks and planted in a little cleaner seed bed.

Homer Smith has fourteen acres of blue panic on his farm in the Amity Community, six miles southeast of Rising Star. A four acre field of this grass was planted in the spring of 1953. Homer used this for temporary pasture in the summer of 1953 and in October 1953 he harvested 120 pounds of clean seed. He has used this field as a night pasture for three cows and nine calves this spring.

Homer has a ten acre field of blue panic that he grazed during the spring of 1953 and in July of the same year cut 150 bales of hay from the ten acres.

Brother Of Mrs. Gilbert Passes Away

Mrs. C. C. Gilbert was called to Big Spring on Tuesday to the bedside of her brother, Owen O. Murray, who was stricken with a heart attack. Mr. Murray passed away on Wednesday, May 19, and burial was at Big Spring.

Leon River Lake Catches Water In Past Two Months

The new Leon River Lake serving Eastland and Ranger has caught some 30 feet of water since the dam was closed in time to catch water from rains in March and April. All work on the project was expected to be completed at an early date.

The dam which forms the lake was built by Ranger and Eastland at a cost of some \$396,000. It is 87 feet high and 1,500 feet in length and will form a lake with a 35 mile shore line when full, it was reported. It was estimated it would impound 28,000 acre feet of water.

Turkey Diseases Are Discussed At Association Meet

LIVESTOCK RAISERS WILL HOLD ANNUAL FIELD DAY ON JUNE 13

The annual field day of the Eastland County Livestock Raisers Association will be held on the Ed Harrison's B&B Ranch, 5 miles east of Gorman on June 13, Boyd Hilley of that city and president of the group reported today.

The all-day program will get underway at 10 o'clock that morning and last until around 3 p. m. with time out at noon for a picnic lunch, Hilley said. The lunch will be furnished through the courtesy of the Gorman Business Men's Club.

Farmers and ranchers not only in Eastland but also in adjoining counties as well are invited to attend the field day. Topics to be either discussed or demonstrated during the meeting in-

clude a range judging contest, grass identification, importance of vitamins and minerals in livestock feeding, the beef and pork price outlook for the next 12 months, factors that determine quality in a fine wool sheep and in Angora goats and factors that determine dressing percentage in a beef animal.

Those to appear on the program from the A&M College Extension Service include Fred Walker, range specialist; John G. McHaney, agricultural economist, and James A. Gray, animal husbandman. Two Fort Worth men, Walter Rice of the Stockyards Co. and E. R. Eudaly, animal nutritionist of the Universal Mills, are also on the program.

The field day is only one of several activities sponsored by the County Livestock Association it was said.

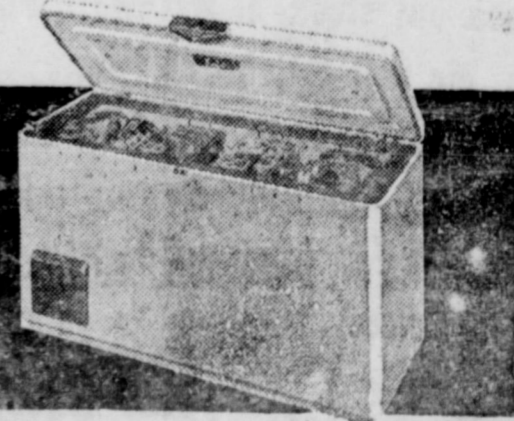
