Texas One of Top Vacation States

Texas was one of the twelve top vacation states during the year ending March, 1953, according to the fourth nationwide vacation travel survey recently completed by the Research Department of the Curtis Publishing Company.

Vacationers named Texas as the destination of 4.6 percent of all trips taken during the year. New York state accounted for 10.9 per cent, California 8.4 per cent, Florida 7 per cent, Pennsylvania 5.7 per cent, Michigan 5.2 per cent, New Jersey 4.8 per cent, and Ohio 4.8 per cent of all the destinations mentioned by vacationers. Illinois, Wisconsin, Virginia and Massachusetts, in that order, accounted for the other four states receiving the most destination mentions by the millions of families taking vacation trips.

\$1,000 Alloted To Gorman For Storm Aid

The American Red Cross has announced that it has alloted the sum of \$1,000 for the aid of victims of a tornado which struck Gorman in February.

Mrs. Kenneth Jamison, Eastland County field worker, made the announcement and said that \$208.48 had already been spent and that another \$475 is expected to be spent in the next few days. She said that most families who suffered loss were able to cover their own losses.

Superintendents of the various divisions of the Eastland County Livestock Show to be held at the old airport in Eastland on March 26 and 27 have been named, according to C. M. McCain, Eastland, general superintendent of the show.

This will make the third year that McCain has served in that capacity. Assisting him will be Bob Lavender and Luther Wilson, both of Eastland.

P. C. Spenny, Rising Star, was named superintendent of the dairy division. Marshal Berry was named to assist him. Entries in this division have grown in recent years, it was reported.

Ed Harrison, Gorman, and R. E. Harrell, Ranger, both prominent Hereford cattle breeders, were selected as superintendent and assistant superintendent of the beef cattle division.

Superintendent of the sheep and goat division will be Homer Boyd, Cisco, and H. C. Wilkinson, Ranger. Boyd ranches north of Cisco. Wilkinson is well known for his registered Rambouillet sheep. His sheep have won honors in various state shows in the past it was said.

N. B. Eaves, Carbon, will be swine superintendent again. Boyd Hilley, Gorman, and T. G. Caudle, Cisco, will direct the boys and girls fat animal division of fat steers, fat lambs and fat barrows. These animals are to be sold at the regular auction at Faircloth's Sales Barn in Eastland on March 30.

Job Exams Slated By Civil Service

Civil Service examinations have been announced for engineer, chemist, physicist, metallurgist, mathematician, and electronic scientist for filling positions paying from \$3,410 to \$10,800 a year in various installations of the Potomac River Naval Command in Washington, D. C., and vicinity.

These installations include the Naval Research Laboratory, Naval Ordnance Laboratory, Naval Gun Factory, David Taylor Model Basin, Naval Proving Ground, Naval Air Test Center, Naval Powder Factory, Navy Hydrographic Office, and the Army Engineer Center, Fort Belvoir, Virginia.

No written test is required. To qualify, applicants must have had appropriate education or experience or a combination of both.

Applications for these positions will be accepted until further notice and must be filed with the Board of Civil Service Examiners for Scientific and Technical Personnel of the Potomac River Naval Command, Building 37, Naval Research Laboratory, Washington 25, D. C.

Desdemona Dairymen List Benefits Of Trench Silo For Dairy Feeding

"Hay is higher in price and not near so good for our milk cows as silage," report F. F. and Jim Sparks, Desdemona dairymen, who are milking 23 cows, largely Holsteins, at the present time.

The father, F. F. Sparks, and son, Jim, are partners, and have been in the dairy business since January, 1951. Their milk goes into the Dallas and Fort Worth milkshed.

They put down their first trench silo in June last year when they bought some "burned out" corn crops from some of their neighbors, chopped it up and packed it down in a long trench. They later grew some honey drip cane and African millet. They started feeding it at once because of the need for roughage and the cows have never been off it, they said.

A total of 102 acres of the corn, honey drip cane and African millet was put down. The corn and honey drip ran from 3 to 4 tons per acre while the Millet did not produce as much. The

entire cost ran to about \$10 per ton.

At the present time the silage is being fed to 26 cows, ten heifers and ten goats. Around 1,000 lbs. of the material is fed per day.

"It has cut our roughage feed bill in half. Every man who raises cattle should have one," said Jim. "If I cut off silage and feed only hay for a few days it dries up my milk production just like a well going dry," he continued.

The cows on the Sparks farm eat only 2 to 3 bales of dry peanut hay at night. That's all the entire herd will eat. They need some dry hay as a conditioner, it was revealed.

"We only wish that we had been making and feeding silage for many years," say the Sparks.

A bulletin on making and feeding silage is free and is available by calling or writing at the county agent's office in Eastland.

There were more silos put down in Eastland County in 1953 than for many years.



Sombrero Tamales— Quick and Flavorful Oven Dish

Really fine eating, pardner, is this wonderfully delicious casserole of satisfying food which all the "cow punchers" in your family will praise and praise.

This quick oven dish is put together in a matter of minutes. It is almost an "out-of-the-can affair" because the rice cooks while you get out the cheese, the tamales and chili con carne and light the oven. This "savory favorite" from the southwest is different enough to make a big hit with company, too, and you'll find you won't need to "lasso" any compliments for it.

INGREDIENTS:

1— 15 ounce can or jar of tamales and sauce
3 cups cooked rice

1— 15½ ounce can chili con carne with beans
¾ cup water

¼ lb. American cheese, sliced

PREPARING THE FLUFFY WHITE RICE: To make 3 heaping cups of white, fluffy, perfectly cooked rice:

1. Put 1 cup uncooked rice, 2 cups of cold water and 1 teaspoon of salt into a 2-quart saucepan and bring to a vigorous boil.

2. Turn the heat as low as possible. Cover the saucepan with a lid. Do not remove lid nor stir rice while it is cooking.

3. Leave saucepan over this low heat for 14 minutes. Remove from the heat. The rice is now ready to use.

For extra fluffy, tender, separate grains allow the rice to steam for an additional 10 minutes— with heat off, but without removing lid.

For extra convenience and economy of time and effort, cook 2 cups of rice, 4 cups of water and 2 teaspoons of salt— keeping the extra cups of unused ready-cooked rice in the refrigerator in a covered container.

Use this rice as needed in quick, delicious and inexpensive soups, salads, casserole dishes, hot breads and desserts.

METHOD: Place the tamales and sauce in the bottom of a greased 2-quart baking dish. Top with the cooked rice. Pour the chili con carne over the rice.

Add the water. Place the cheese slices over the top of the chili con carne. Place in a 350°F. oven for 30 minutes or until the cheese has melted and the tamales, rice and chili con carne mixture is heated through.

If desired, save out three of the tamales and arrange them on the top of the cheese in the shape of a sombrero. Do this about 10 minutes before the cooking time is over in order that these tamales may become hot.

This recipe makes 8 servings.

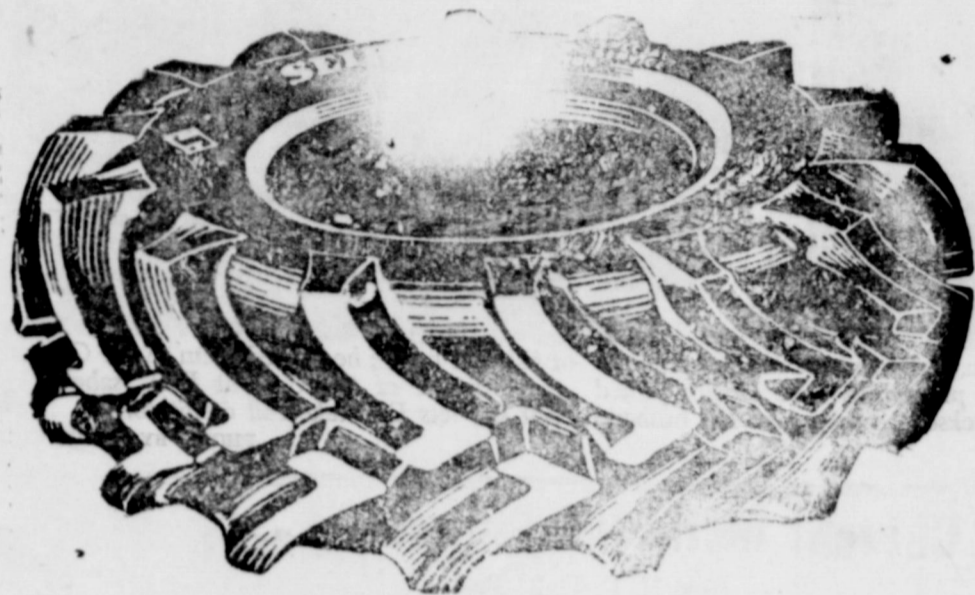

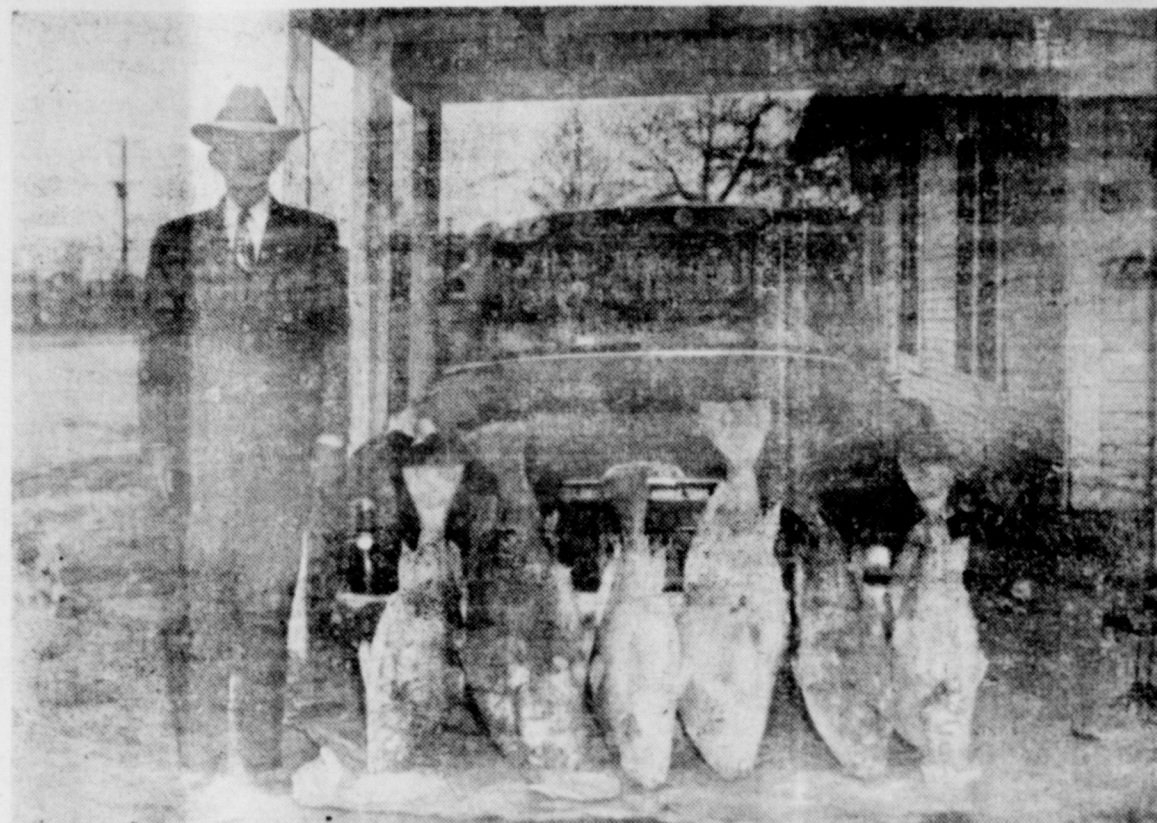
