## \$130,000 Loan To Carbon OK'd

The Farmers Home Administration at Washington has approved a 49-year loan of \$130,000 at five per cent interest for the City of Carbon for the construction of a city water system to serve 110 homes. Cong. Omar Burleson notified The Press Thursday.

## Carbon System Opens Bids for Construction

Bids were open Monday for the construction of the City of Carbon Water Supply System at the apparent low bidder, George M. Anthon of Sanaba on a bid of \$116,680 for installation of the distribution system and plants which will include storage tanks.

Details will likely be completed by July 1 for contract construction to begin at such time. Contract calls for 120 days to completion. Some 110 customers are expected to be in the system by the end of construction.

There is some other bid for the plant and another for distribution system.

## Plant in Area

The 1969 harvest in the area was a good one, belonging to the best Tuesday harvest since 1955. The average yield was 25 bushels per acre.

## Bank Doubles Capital, Surplus

James A. Rutherford President of the First State Bank in Rising Star announced this week that the bank had increased its capital and certified surplus each from \$50,000 to \$100,000.

"We have taken this action in order that our bank can be of greater service to the growing needs of our section," said Mr. Rutherford.

"It is an expression of our faith in the Rising Star community and area," he said.

Mr. Rutherford, who last week was named president of the local bank in a shift of majority stock ownership, said that the policy of the bank would continue to emphasize principals which had proven wise during the long period when W. E. Tyler, late step-father of Mr. Rutherford, headed the bank.

Retiring as president is C. R. Tyler, brother of the late Bill Tyler, who has sold most of his stock in the bank and will retire to the management.

## THE PEANUT REPORT

### CHAPTER I — THE PEANUT INDUSTRY IN THE UNITED STATES

In the United States, peanut production is divided into three geographic areas by the United States Department of Agriculture. This division is based largely on the main type of peanut grown in each area: The Virginia-Carolina area producing Virginia types; the South eastern area producing Runner, Spanish and Virginia types; and the Southwestern area producing Spanish types 1. The states included in each of these areas are as follows: Virginia-Carolina area - Virginia and North Carolina; Southeast area - South Carolina, Georgia, Florida, Alabama, Louisiana, Mississippi, and New Mexico.

Oklahoma, Texas, and New Mexico. crop at 2,435 million pounds - 12 million pounds or 0.5% over 1967 production and the largest crop on record. In 1967, 1,408,000 acres were utilized for the production of peanuts. By areas, 1968 production is estimated at 639 million pounds, 25.7% of total U.S. average annual production of 997 million pounds for 1931-35, production has increased to a record 2,435 million pounds in 1968. The Southwest area has more than doubled its share of total U.S. production during this period, moving from 11.1% of total production for the 1931-35 annual average to 24.8% for 1968.

For 1968, the U.S.D.A. estimates the U. S. peanut Table I shows the substantial growth that has occurred in U.S. peanut production since 1931. From an production, in the Virginia-Carolina area, 1,229 million pounds, 49.5% of total U.S. production, in the Southeast area and 617 million pounds, 24.8% of total U.S. production, in the Southwest area. Late rains in the Virginia-Carolina and Southwest areas resulted in lower production in 1967 than in 1966 for these two areas.

1968. During this period, the Southeast area has remained relatively stable in its share of total production and the Virginia-Carolina area's share has dropped from 39.3% to 25.7%.

The U.S. Department of Agriculture has supported the price of peanuts to growers since 1934 when peanuts were designated as one of the six basic crops under the Agriculture Adjustment Act. Acreage allotments must not be exceeded for a grower to be eligible for price support. Except for the years during and immediately following World War II when allotments were suspended to encourage production for oil use, there has been relative stability in the number of acres under production.

## Seedling Trees Now Available

COLLEGE STATION — Vacation planning, lawn mowing and gardening all signify Spring is here. They also serve to remind landowners that it's time to order tree seedlings for the winter planting season ahead.

Although seedling shipments will not begin until about December 15, tree planters are urged to get their orders in early this year to avoid disappointment.

Only 15 million slash, loblolly and shortleaf pine seedlings will be available from the Texas Forest Service nursery near Alto.

Regular slash, loblolly and shortleaf pine seedlings will sell for \$6.18 per thousand, which includes the state's sales tax.

A limited amount of higher-

quality slash and shortleaf pine from seed production areas will sell for \$7.21 per thousand, tax included. The same price will prevail for drought-hardy loblolly pine seedlings from the Bastrop area.

Slash and loblolly pine seedlings, produced from seed collected from genetically improved seed orchards, are being offered at \$8.76 per thousand seedlings, including sales tax.

All prices quoted are F.O.B. Indian Mound Nursery near Alto.

Seedlings must be ordered in multiples of 100 and no orders for less than 500 can be accepted. Seedlings are not available for resale or for ornamental purposes.

Seedling applications and additional information may be obtained from local Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service and Soil Conservation District offices.
