Game Protection Work Ranchers Praise State

AUSTIN, 16. — The Executive Secretary of the Game and Fish Commission reported a "growing tendency" among land owners to protect wildlife species hard hit by drought.

"One of the natural benefits from the traditional land ownership-game management cooperation," he said, "is the authority retained by landowners and others to control hunting game from their areas."

"This franchise has many times approached advantages that would accrue if Texas had sufficient public land holdings for the state to carry the wildlife harvest."

"This fall there is an increasing trend toward limiting the take of species that are below normal for one reason or another. From the reports of our field men and from the landowners direct, the endeavor is to reach maximum effect this fall."

"Indications are that one major objective of many ranchers and farmers is to be protecting quail which have suffered from the drought and from that recurring slump when wildlife biologists term the cycle."

"Thus it is interesting to anticipate that the precious seed stock of the quail population will be preserved. Our biologists agree that the consideration for the quail at this time can easily set up a rapid recovery from the present quail depletion."

The Executive Secretary pointed out that the General Law on quail, as on deer and other species, is controlled exclusively by the Legislature. He added that, while the harvest under such laws cannot exceed the legal limitations, there is no restriction on curbing the harvest.

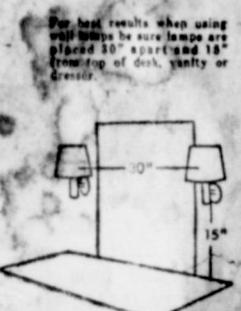

Second Well In New Field 4 Miles West Of Carbon

Considerable interest was being shown Saturday in a deep oil test offsetting production in a Ranger sand discovery well near Mangum, and the outcome of the test was expected to be known by Monday, according to information received.

The Cliver, Chandler et al., San Angelo Co. 2 Ethel Hittson Coats was drilling at 3,200 feet Saturday morning—about 100 feet above the pay horizon in every well. The operation was expected to begin covering the night and were scheduled to reach the Ranger sand sometime Sunday.

No. 1 Coats, seven miles west of Cisco, was still in the early stages and was making a gain from 3,309 to 3,027 feet. Tests have indicated a substantial producer with a relatively high oil ratio.

The No. 2 Coats is 1,500 feet due east of the No. 1 well in the southwest quarter of Section 9, Block 3, H&TC Survey. Several other locations have been staked in the area, operations awaiting the outcome of the No. 1 well.
