Vetch Seed For Distribution

Local Soil Conservation District Supervisors, in a meeting held August 21 stated that the Districts would buy hairy vetch seed for resale in the Rising Star area.

B. B. Hickman, member of the Board of Supervisors, Upper Leon SCD, in expressing concern over a vetch seed shortage in the area said that the Upper Leon SCD would buy 25,000 pounds of seed if available to be resold to farmers in the Rising Star area.

G. G. Goss, Chairman of the Board of Supervisors, Brown-Mills SCD shared Hickman's concern and said that his District would buy 15,000 lbs. of seed for resale in the May area.

"I anticipate a big demand for seed vetch this fall if moisture is favorable but as things look now the seed will be scarce. Not many farmers in the area have seed and since other areas in the state will be planting vetch, I doubt whether there will be enough seed to meet our needs," Goss said.

It is recalled that Hickman was instrumental in organizing the Rising Star Hairy Vetch and Abruzzi Rye Association and at one time planted as much as 500 acres of vetch on his farms in the Blake area.

Q — I am receiving a VA disability pension. I have just sold my house, but at a price less than what I paid for it. Must I figure the proceeds as income for pension purposes?

A — No. So long as the house was sold at less than the purchase price, no part of the proceeds of the sale need be considered as income.

Q — I'm drawing compensation for a service-connected disability I received in Korea. I was on active duty for two years. Am I automatically entitled to vocational rehabilitation training at Government expense?

A — Not necessarily. One requirement of the law is that you must need the training to overcome the handicap of your disability.

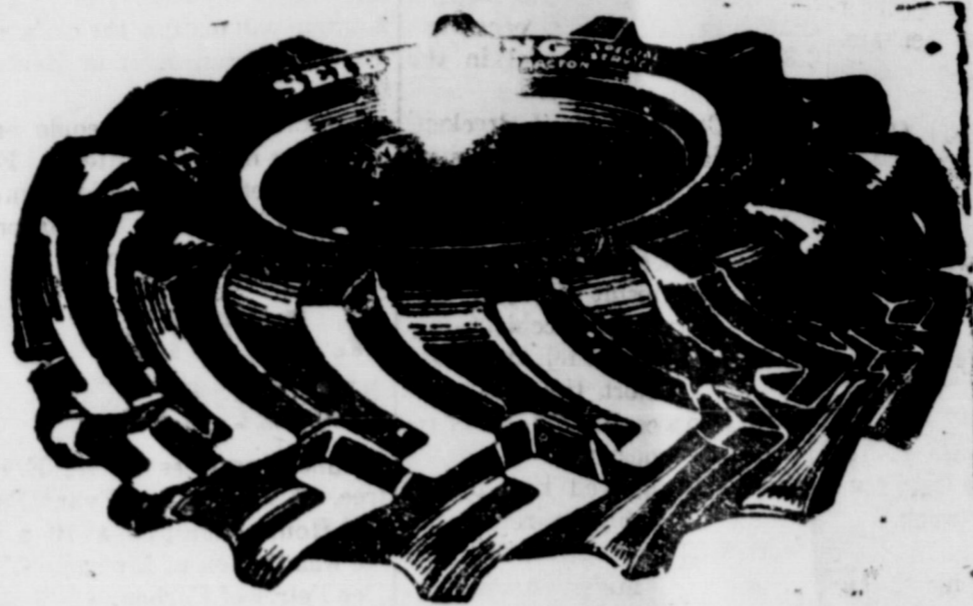

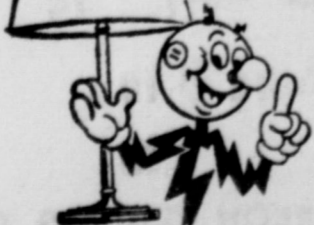

Seed Treating Value Stressed

The value of treating pasture and hay crop seeds with a chemical disinfectant before planting has been confirmed in a series of tests on Southern farms. W. K. Bailey reports the "surprising results" in September Farm and Ranch.

One farmer, Charles Alexander of Prattville, Alabama, planted chemically treated seed on 15 of the 32 acres he was sowing to rescue grass. Besides producing healthier, larger plants, seed treatment caused a 23 per cent increase in stand, Bailey says.

When the seed crop was harvested, according to Bailey, 90 per cent of it came from the area where seeds were treated. Similar experiences of farmers in other Southern states are reported in Bailey's article.

1953 TURKEY CROP IS EXPECTED TO BE SMALLER THAN IN 1952

Texas turkey growers are raising 3,407,000 turkeys this year as compared with 3,703,000 last year, according to a report released this week by the U. S. Department of Agriculture. The 1953 crop is eight per cent smaller than a year ago, but 15 per cent larger than the 5-year average. Turkey growers of the state kept about 10 per cent more breeding hens than a year ago, although commercial hatchery poult production was about nine per cent less than last year.

Texas growers reported their intentions to market about 48 percent of the 1953 crop before November 1 compared with about 43 percent of the 1952 crop mar-

keted prior to that date. If growers carry out their reported intentions, about 93 percent of the marketable birds will be sold prior to January 1 next year. This compares with 90 percent of the 1952 crop sold by January 1 the following year. The August survey indicates that about 5 percent of the 1953 crop are Beitsville whites and other light breeds compared with about 18 percent a year ago.

Vets Questions And Answers

Q — The son of a friend of mine was killed in an automobile accident on his way to report to his draft board. Would he be covered by the free automatic indemnity paid to survivors of Korean servicemen?

A — No. Indemnity coverage of selectees is limited to those who died as a result of disabilities incurred while en route from the draft board to the induction station, or who die within 120 days after the incurrence of such disabilities. The coverage does not extend to travel to the draft board.

J — I'm planning to sell the house I bought with a GI loan. What can I do to make sure I won't be liable, in case the person who buys the house fails to make his payments?

A — Generally, you should see to it that the GI loan is repaid in full at the time of the sale. In that way, you will be released from all personal liability. Consult your lender or your VA office for full details.
