Meeting Called To Close Local Depot

The time has come again for the citizens of Carbon and community to come together and meet with the Railroad Commission of Texas at the court house in Eastland, Texas on July 30, 1953 at 10 a. m. in protest to the closing of the MK&T Depot (the Carbon Station) and Telegraph office. The citizens met a year or so ago in protest when the MK&T tried to close the station.

It is the duty of all patrons to protest against closing the station as everyone knows how it was when the passenger train service was discontinued on the line. The depot will mean a greater disadvantage than the passenger service was. The public can ship and receive freight and send messages, and if the station is closed you cannot do this without going elsewhere.

There is no other service equal to the railroad freight service.

We all know that the country as a whole has not made any crops to snip in the last three years. The railroad should bare some losses, as well as the farmers and merchants of this place have to do. But we don't think the railroad is losing as much in proportion as the people which it serves.

So let's all pull together and make a strong protest to the Railroad Commission of Texas on July 30, at the court house in Eastland.

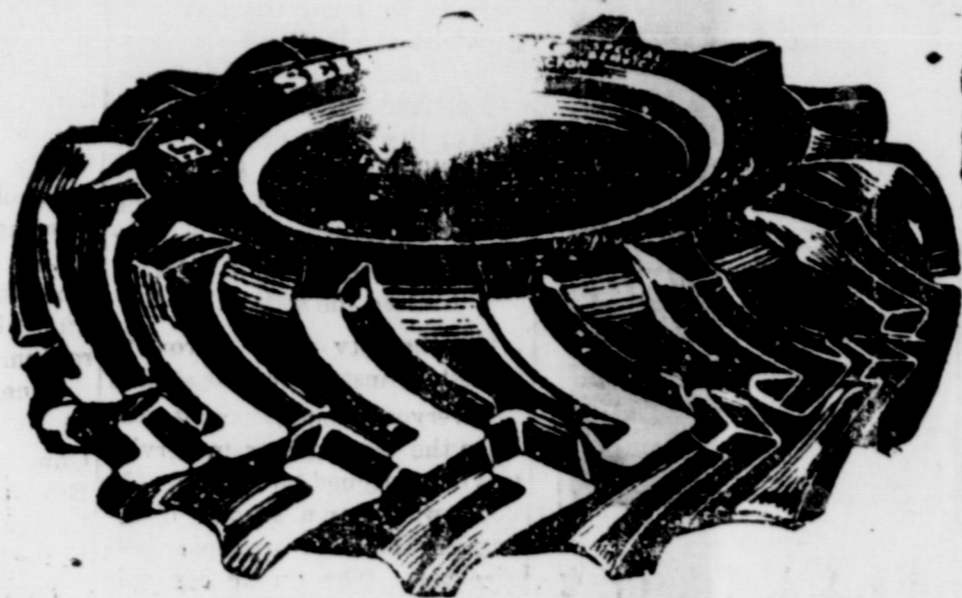

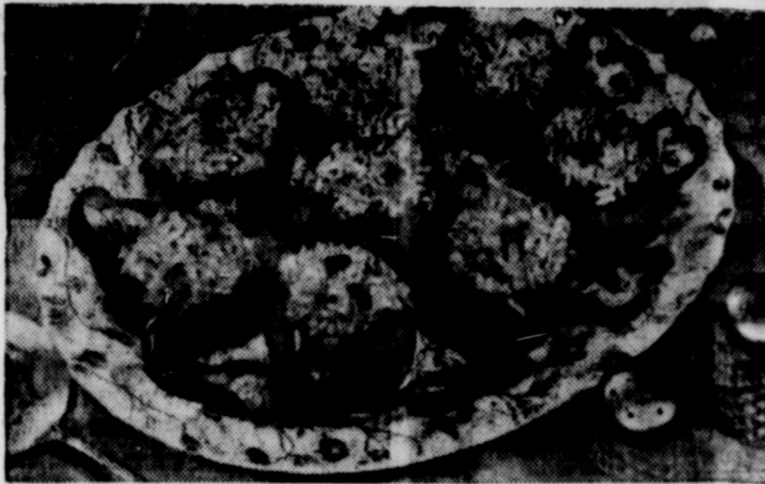

Curried Rice and Tuna Make a Tasty and Thrifty Filling for Luscious Tomatoes

Rice brings together the deep sea goodness of tuna fish and the Oriental excitement of curry in this versatile main dish. The curry powder contributes exotic flavor and intriguing color enhanced by the bits of green pepper and the brilliant red of the tomatoes.

Served piping hot from the oven or cold and refreshing on a bed of greens, this "something special" for the family is also something quick and easy for Mom to fix.

INGREDIENTS:

- 8 medium sized ripe tomatoes
- 4 tablespoons minced onion
- 2 tablespoons minced green pepper
- 4 tablespoons butter or margarine
- 1 7-ounce can tuna fish
- 2 cups cooked rice
- 1 teaspoon curry powder
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 teaspoon pepper
- 1/2 cup water

PREPARING THE FLUFFY WHITE RICE: To make 3 liberal cups of fluffy rice, put 1 cup of uncooked rice, 2 cups of cold water and 1 teaspoon of salt into a 2 quart saucepan and bring to a vigorous boil. Turn the heat as low as possible. Cover saucepan with a lid and leave over this

low heat for 14 minutes. Do not remove lid nor stir rice while it is cooking. Turn off the heat. Use exact measurements of uncooked rice and water. Time the cooking accurately.

For real convenience and economy of time and effort, keep unused rice in the refrigerator in a covered container at all times. Use it for many quick, delicious and inexpensive soups, salads, casserole dishes, hot breads and desserts.

METHOD: Peel tomatoes easily by scalding, plunging into cold water and then peeling. Slice off stem end of tomatoes. Carefully scoop out pulp. Cook onion and green pepper in the butter or margarine until tender. Add the tuna fish, rice, curry powder, salt, pepper and water. Mix thoroughly. Fill the tomatoes with the tuna and rice mixture and bake at 350° F. about 15 minutes or until the tomatoes are tender. Serve hot. Garnish with green pepper rings if desired.

For a cool and refreshing salad, chill the tomatoes after they are stuffed and serve on salad greens. This recipe makes 8 servings or 3 cups of the curried tuna and rice mixture.

Almond Chicken With Rice

Chinese Chicken Almond With Rice, a delightful delicately flavored dish with chicken, celery topping, is sure to please your family. It makes an attractive "one main dish type meal" and is easily served to a crowd.

Fresh or canned mushrooms may be used for making Chinese Almond Chicken.

INGREDIENTS
 1 cup uncooked rice
 1 cup sliced mushrooms (canned or fresh)
 1 cup almonds — blanched
 2 tablespoons salad oil, to be used 1 tablespoon at a time
 1 clove garlic, cut in half
 1 teaspoon salt
 1 cup cubed bamboo shoots (canned)
 1 cup thinly sliced water chestnuts (canned)
 1 cup thinly sliced celery
 1 cup diced, cold chicken (fresh or canned)
 2 tablespoons liquid (1 tablespoon each, from bamboo shoots and water chestnut cans)

INGREDIENTS FOR GRAVY
 2 teaspoons cornstarch
 1 teaspoon sugar
 2 tablespoons water
 4 teaspoons soy sauce

GARNISH
 1 cup sliced green onion

PREPARING THE FLUFFY WHITE RICE—To make 3 cups fluffy rice: Put 1 cup of uncooked rice, 2 cups of cold water and 1 teaspoon of salt in a two-

quart saucepan and cover with a tight-fitting lid. Bring to a vigorous boil. Then reduce the heat as low as possible and steam for 14 minutes or until all the water is absorbed, leaving the separate rice grains with their full nutritional value. This makes very firm rice grains. (If you prefer more tender rice grains, add 1/4 cup more water and increase the slow cooking time 4 or 5 minutes.) Remove the lid, permit the rice to steam dry to the desired consistency and the grains will be separate and fluffy. Never stir rice; lift gently with a fork.

METHOD: Brown almonds in 1 tablespoon oil. Set aside. With table fork, mash garlic into salt in skillet. (Be sure there is a tight-fitting cover, which can be used later.) Add 1 tablespoon oil, then add chicken. Brown lightly. Add 1 tablespoon oil and then bamboo shoots and mushrooms. Brown lightly. Add liquid, drained from canned bamboo shoots and water chestnuts. Cover tightly. Cook over low heat 5 minutes. Add water chestnuts, celery and 1/2 of the almonds. Just heat through. Celery and chestnuts should remain crisp. For gravy . . . shake up in small jar, cornstarch, salt, sugar, water and soy sauce. Stir into mixture. Cook until liquid thickens and is smooth. Sprinkle over dish, green onions and rest of almonds. Serve with hot fluffy cooked rice. This will serve 4.
