## Campus Rodeo To Highlight Western Week Activities

April 24, 25, and 26 have been designated by Mr. Van Rigby and the Rodeo Club as the dates for the 1969 version of the Ranger Junior College Rodeo. This will bring to a rousing conclusion Western Week, which begins on April 21. During this time, students are urged to dress western and support the rodeo.

One of the feature attractions of the rodeo will be—you will not believe it—a buzzard! Yes, you read it right, a buzzard! However, this is no means a common, West Texas buzzard. It is "Oscar"—the only bullfighting buzzard in the world. "Oscar" is owned by Mr. Ralph "Fizzie" Fisher of Houston, Texas. Mr. Fisher is an excellent rodeo clown and will clown the RJC Rodeo. Besides being a professional rodeo clown, "Fizzie" is a top-notch bullfighter. Along with Oscar, Mr. Fisher will have many other surprises.

Events of the spring production will include: saddle bronc riding, bareback bronc riding, tie-down calf roping, ribbon roping, barrel racing, steer wrestling, and bull riding. All events are open to all high school and college students who are not registered with the NIRA or RCA. Barrel racing is open to any girl who can ride a horse whether they are 8 or 80. The rodeo

will be run under RCA rules. At the present time, contests are being planned for the faculty of Ranger Junior College. Each night there will be different contests. Any and all slack will be run on Saturday beginning at 9 a.m. Everyone is invited to attend

the slack without charge.

Entry fees for all events will be \$15.00 with \$12.50 being returned in the form of prize money. The first five places will be paid either in the form of buckles, trophies, money, or a combination of the preceding.

## Clyde W. Graham Is Appointed Head of USDA SCS in Texas

Appointment of Clyde W. Graham to head the work of the United States Department of Agriculture Soil Conservation Service, Texas, was announced today by Administrator Kenneth E. Grant.

Graham, a career employee currently Director of its Watershed Planning Division, succeeds H. N. Smith as State Conservationist of the Agency at Temple, Texas April 20. Smith died March 13.

From 1964 to 1966, Graham, 49, served under Smith at Temple as Deputy State Conservationist.

He will transfer from Washington, D.C. to Temple April 20. Graham, a 1943 Texas A&M graduate in Agricultural Engineering, was in the U. S.

Army Air Force from January 1943 to September 1946 when he joined the SCS as a field engineer in Rotan, Texas. He holds a Masters Degree in Public Administration from Harvard University awarded in 1958. He is a native of Knox City, Texas.

He held Texas field jobs in Brady, San Saba, and Brownwood before coming to Washington in 1954, where he was an SCS Budget Analyst until he received a Littauer Fellowship for graduate study at Harvard. He returned to Texas after completing his work at Harvard. He was Assistant State Conservationist for Watersheds until his promotion to Deputy State Conservationist in 1964.

## Pecan Trees Behind Schedule Due to Late Spring Season

More than 150 persons from throughout this West Central Texas region attended sessions of the annual Eastland County Pecan School Friday at Cisco Junior College.

The program began with Anton White of Cisco, president of the Eastland County Pecan Growers Association, presiding. Pecan men were welcomed in talks by Manager Jim Smothers of the Cisco Chamber of Commerce and President Leland Willis of CJC.

Miss Mary Letha Hubbard of Rising Star, the current pecan queen of Eastland County, assisted in registering guests.

County Agent Dee Gordon opened the program with a report on orchard conditions. He noted that area pecan trees are behind their usual spring schedule due to a late spring and cold weather.

Most area pecan trees are beginning to bloom and a good crop outlook will depend on whether a big rain falls in the next two weeks or so, it was pointed out.

Dr. J. W. Worthington, area

extension horticulturist at the Tarleton Station, used the morning school session to discuss "Propagating Pecans by Inlay Grafting." He used picture slides to illustrate his talk. He answered numerous questions from the floor.

Dr. Worthington covered all phases of grafting, noting that this work should not start before April 1 to 15. It can continue as long as the bark slips freely on tree limbs. He recommended the inlay of graft as the best technique to use on pecan trees.

The visitors ate lunch at the CJC cafeteria.

After lunch, the pecan growers gathered at the orchard of Dr. Bill Cardwell, Cisco veterinarian, just west of Cisco to practice budding and grafting under the supervision of Dr. Worthington and Mr. Gordon.

Supplies of bud wood from several improved varieties were on hand for sale to visitors.

County Agent Gordon described the school as "a good success from all standpoints."

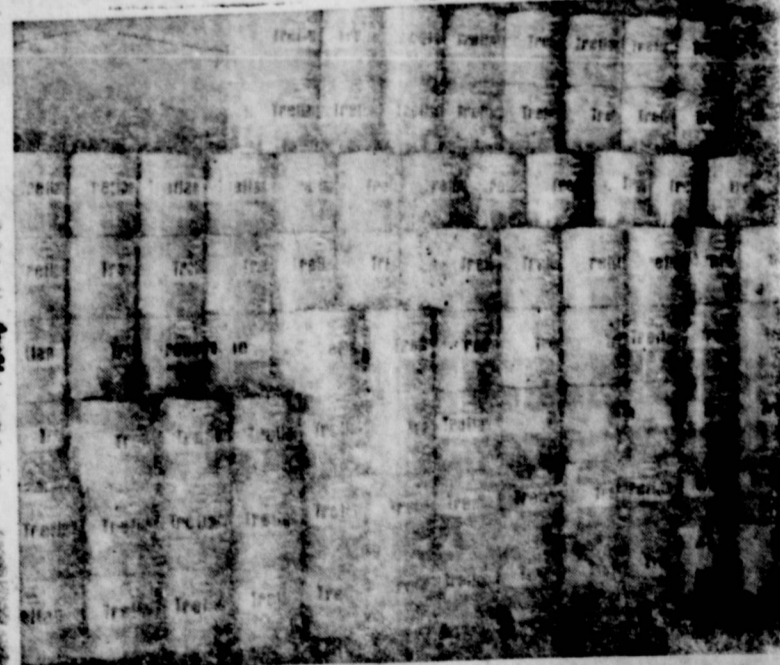

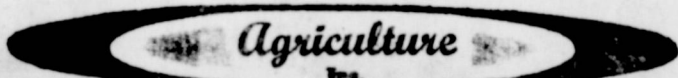

**Jamie Fry Heads County Chief for Brush Control**

Jamie Fry, rancher at Cisco, has been named Eastland County chairman of the Brush Control and Range Improvement Association.

The association was formed last November by a group of Texas ranchers and producers. The immediate goal of the association is to raise from the landowners of Texas one cent an acre per year for five years. Business, foundations, city, state or federal governing bodies interested in the control of brush & land improvement will be contacted for donations and assistance.

The funds will be used to support research and education on brush control and range improvement.

Officials of the association say that nearly 80 per cent of the rangeland in Texas is infested with brush and weeds. The carrying capacity of nearly 100 million acres of land is being reduced by 50 per cent or more the association officials say.

John Matthews, an Abilene rancher, is state chairman of the association. Joe Fambro of Huckabee is chairman for this twenty county district.

Fry said a drive to raise funds in Eastland County will be undertaken in the near future.

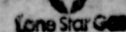
