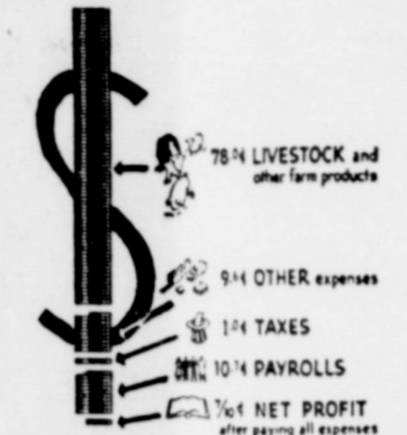
**Most of Packers' Sale Dollar Goes to Farmer**

**Industry Expects Near Record Production in '51**

The meat industry—from farmer to consumer—is an important part of this country's economy. Of every dollar exchanging hands in the industry, 78 cents goes to the country's farmers.

Profits in 1949, as reported by companies producing the bulk of the nation's meat supply, averaged 7/10 cents out of each dollar of sales, or about 1/3 of a cent per pound of meat sold.

As shown by the above chart, pay-rolls got next to the largest share of



Of every packer's sales dollar, 78 cents goes to the country's farmers.

the packer's dollar—10.7 cents; other expenses totaled 9.6 cents and taxes got 1 cent of the dollar.

Profits included those made on the sale of meat and all other products, including by-products and non-meat items, such as soap, cleansers, medicinal glands, and dairy and poultry products.

The meat industry expects a near record production during 1951. Consumption will remain high due to defense buying and record employment, industry spokesmen believe.

**Egg Production Depends On Well Balanced Ration**

Poultry experts report it requires about one pound of balanced feed for every seven eggs produced. To make a well balanced ration the vocational agricultural service of the University of Illinois advises:

Use at least three feeds from the cereal grains and by-products to make up 75 to 90 per cent of the ration.

Five to 10 per cent of the ration should comprise an animal-protein feed.

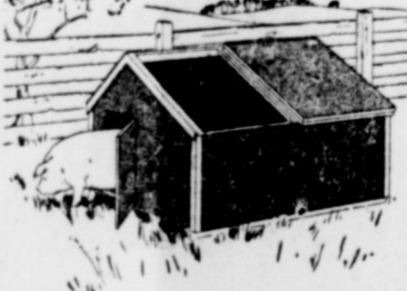
Use one or more plant-protein feeds, if available at reasonable cost. Not more than 15 per cent of the ration should come from this group.

Include at least one legume roughage, to make up 5 to 10 per cent.

Some carrier of calcium should be included if the ration contains no meat scrap, fishmeal or tankage.

One pound of common salt should be added for each 100 pounds of total ration.

**Hog House**



Scientific hog raising for highest profits calls for warm, dry, inexpensive housing. The sunlit hog house above is simply constructed. Its dimensions are 7 feet by 6 feet, and 4 feet 10 inches high. Built on skids, it has a one inch rough floor laid on 2 by 4-inch sills. Studing of 2 by three inch lumber supports the masonite quarter-inch tempered hardboard used for siding and roof. This material is durable and weather resistant. Four-inch light strap hinges are used for turning back the roof door. Plans are available by writing Farm Service Bureau, Suite 2037, 111 West Washington St., Chicago 2, Ill. The plan number is AFB-196 and are free.

**Plan Hog Pasture**—Farmers planning next year's crops should include an alfalfa pasture for hogs to save grain and protein feeds.

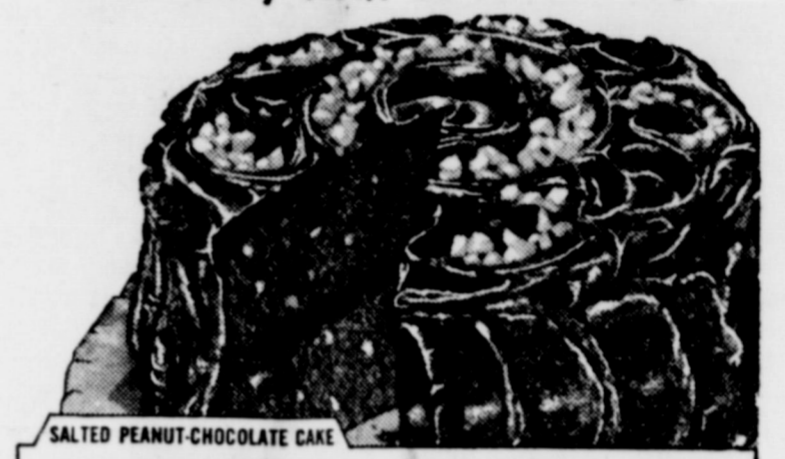

### Wire Rural Home With Room to Grow



FARM folks should consider electricity that "extra hired hand" necessary to do a job, according to an article in nationally circulated Capper's Farmer by E. W. Smith of Kansas State College.

"Electricity is an efficient worker that operates milking machines, runs ventilating fans, heats hotbeds, supplies power for electric clippers, dries the women's hair, delivers water to the stanchion cups, water tanks, sinks and bathtubs and runs the corn sheller and drill press—all at an amazingly low cost," says the article in the magazine read by 1,250,000 farm families.

"The future holds a hundred other uses for electricity on the farm. So the smart owner, when he puts in electric service, will insist on a wir-

ing job that will not only take care of present needs but will serve equipment and appliances he is likely to have 5 or 10 years from now.

"Nowhere in the house is the need for convenience outlets so great as in the kitchen. Shown above is a double convenience outlet at counter or working height—an important item from the standpoint of use. Locate the outlets in the work areas and have plenty so it will not be necessary to take the electric clock plug to use the electric mixer, coffee maker or waffle irons. Some homemakers like an outlet near the breakfast or dining table for the toaster. Conveniently located outlets should be provided for the home freezer and refrigerator."

### Raise Some Vegetables You Can't Buy

The only way you can be sure of having certain delicious vegetables on your table is to raise them in your own garden.

Take Swiss chard, for example. Those appetizing greens have been widely grown in Victory Gardens these war years. The reason you don't see them in the markets is because the delicate foliage wilts quickly after picking. To enjoy Swiss chard at its best, you should use it shortly after cutting. The same planting will furnish many a "mess of greens" over a long period if only the outside stalks are cut each time, allowing the center leaves to go on growing. (See illustration).

Savoy is a type of cabbage not at all improved by being hauled from place to place . . . the crinkly brittle leaves bruise so easily. By growing a few heads in the garden, you can have this tender, delicately flavored, nearly odorless variety at its finest. It takes no more exertion and care than raising plain cabbage. Chieftain is the variety which has become a universal favorite.

Friends who come to dinner will exclaim over edible pod peas from your garden vines. This is a type of pea which is cooked and eaten like snap beans, pod and all, when the young peas have barely begun to form. This is the best for this mouth-watering dish.

may have originated in France or Holland. Folks of Dutch ancestry are the ones most familiar with edible pod peas in our own land. Once grown in anyone's garden, they are likely to be on the repeater list year after year.

Do you know that odd shaped vegetable, kohlrabi? Plant a row of it and give the family something out of the ordinary. Although related to cabbage, it is milder and more delicate in flavor. It looks like a turnip growing above ground. Kohlrabi matures quite rapidly and should be eaten when about two inches in diameter.

Anybody can have common cucumber pickles. You can add that extra touch to your list of appetizers by raising West India gherkins. The prickly little oval fruits, picked when fairly small, make unusually good sweet pickles . . . nearly impossible to get these days for love or money.

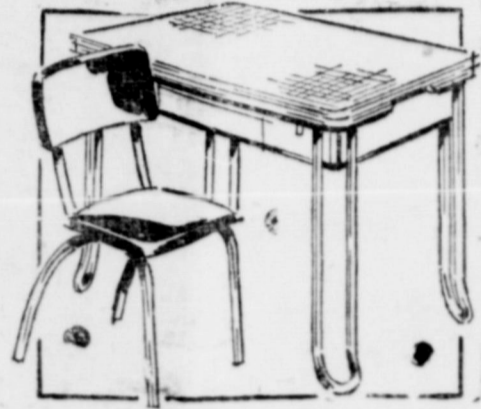

## Frozen Lemon Pie Is Toothsome Dish

FROZEN lemon pie is a toothsome dinner dessert for the family that's been working hard all day, says the Country Cooking editor of Capper's Farmer.

Graham cracker crumbs are crust and topping for the chilled yellow filling, she writes in the nationally circulated farm magazine. Pie-shaped pieces are made by cutting diagonally across the refrigerator tray in which pie is frozen.

The dessert which will be an ever-popular family favorite, serves 8, the Capper's Farmer expert advises.



**FROZEN LEMON PIE**  
4 eggs, separated 1 c. evaporated  
3 c. lemon juice milk, whipped  
1/2 c. lemon 1/2 c. graham crack-  
2 c. sugar er, cooky or  
cake crumbs

Beat egg yolks; add lemon juice and piece of rind sliced from lemon and all but 2 tablespoons of the sugar. Cook over low heat 15 minutes, stirring constantly. Remove rind and cool. Beat egg whites until stiff; add remaining sugar and fold into cooked mixture. Add whipped evaporated milk. Line refrigerator tray with waxed paper. Sprinkle with 1/4 cup of the crumbs. Pour in lemon mixture; sprinkle with remaining crumbs. Freeze with temperature at coldest. Serves 8.

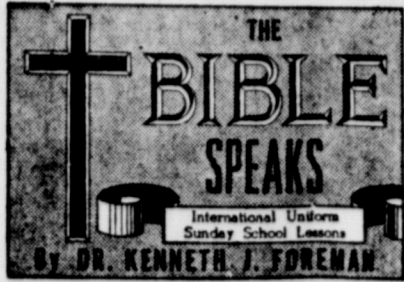

### The Good Must Fight

Lesson for January 21, 1951

YOU WOULD think that if ever there arrived on this planet a really good person, he would be popular with everybody. People are tired of meanness, they are sick of being lied to and cheated. They are tired of the sins of others, even tired of their own. So if a really good person should appear, one in whom was no shadow, completely transparent to the Eternal Light, wouldn't everyone flock to him, wouldn't he have the human race in the palm of his hand, as it were, in a short time?

Age-long War THE ANSWER is No. It is not well to be too optimistic about human nature. As a matter of fact, some of the best persons history has known met some of the bitterest opposition. Indeed, when One came who was completely good, whose life was all light and no shadow, he was no better treated and no more warmly welcomed than less good persons have been.

Jesus Christ had his enemies, strong and well-organized. The number of those who believed in him was comparatively small; the number who did not believe or ignored him altogether, was enormous.

The history of mankind is the history of a war, the age long war between good and evil, between God and his enemies. The story of Jesus is one chapter in this history.

Why Was Jesus Hated? THE READER should examine the record in the Gospels and try to think for himself who opposed Jesus, and why they did so. One striking fact is that Jesus' enemies were not what we call the "lower classes," much less the "criminal classes." His enemies were rather from out of the top drawer, as we might say.

If there had never been any one to contradict the records of the Sanhedrin, that high court of Jerusalem, and those records had become recognized as the truth, Jesus would have gone down in history, if remembered at all, as a trouble-maker, a lawless and worthless man, whose execution was a protection to society.

Why were these leading men, Jesus' "distinguished" contemporaries, so wrong about Jesus?

"As he is, so are we..." THE READER should think this out for himself. One reason can be mentioned here: It is very easy for wrong to be so long accepted and so strongly entrenched that it is universally taken for right.

Any one who tries to follow Jesus will find himself up against the same sort of opposition.

Any one who proposes to live as Jesus lived, or to change our accustomed patterns of society in the direction which Jesus pointed out, will be called (as he was) a crackpot, a dreamer, an impractical fellow who does not know enough to go in when it rains.

Our Divine Alliance CONSIDER one example of this. A Christian who makes up his mind to dedicate his body a "living sacrifice" to God, and therefore not to handicap himself with the drug of alcohol, is certain, in many places, to be considered a crank.

Instead of admiring a clean and free life, many people are not content unless they can soil that cleanness and break down that freedom. So to stand for Christ in any aspect of life is not easy. But we need to remember we fight no lonely fight; our cause is not forlorn.

Just as Jesus in Galilee was always on the side of those who were beaten and battered by sin and evil, but still fighting, so now the ever-living Christ is always on the side of those who in their hearts desire good and not evil, cleanness and not dirt, truth and not lies.
