Duck Population

According to current reports from Duck Unlimited, the duck population for 1950 is about the same as last year.

There was a steady migration of ducks and geese from the north and a pile-up of birds in the southern parts of the provinces where the weather was mild and small waterways were not frozen.

While there was a steady non-spectacular migration south across the border and some birds from the north going right through, there was still a heavy population of ducks and geese in the country.

Fields were mostly bare and where snow had fallen it had melted again, so ducks, chiefly mallards and pintails, were finding rich living at the expense of farmers.

Ducks Unlimited (Canada) have completed 23 new duck factories to the end of October.

For Pheasant Hunters... Pheasant hunters will be happy to know that North Dakota, one of the most productive areas for this bird, is reporting fair success for gunners.

Each year the state conservation and wildlife division takes advantage of the pheasant season to study hunter-birds and determine the old-young ratio of killed birds.

It is found that a ration of 2 young to 1 old bird exists, then the hatch would be about normal.

On the same basis, a 3 to 1 ratio would be exceptionally good, while 1 to 1 would be poor.

Studies of birds killed in the western part of the state, according to reports, are nearing completion, and thus far, the lowest ratio found was 3 1/2 young birds to 1 old bird killed.

It was said this can be attributed in part to the late hatch last spring; but regardless of that, the hatching season was one of the best in the history of the state.

Even should hunters prove not too successful this year, the outlook for pheasant hunting, of course, is a severe, killing winter - if exceptionally good.

Natural Habitat Best... Wild animals, as most everyone who has tried the experiment knows, seldom make satisfactory pets.

As an example, men in wildlife conservation work who handle a state conservation department specimens in exhibitions, have extremely difficulty keeping specimens healthy and in good condition, no matter how good is the care they receive.

Too, further proof that wildlife does not respond too well to domestic practices is afforded by the almost numberless examples of pet squirrels which suddenly turn on their owners and bite fingers, noses and ears of people feeding them.

Quail almost invariably succumb to domestic fowl diseases; bobcats never adjust to confinement, and even selfish and militant adult deer after being in captivity.

The best advice available is: Leave wildlife alone in the woods. Few animals, after having been tamed, or partially tamed, can ever make a successful readjustment to the wild.

Perhaps it's just as well to leave a young animal to die, than to bring them to sheltered maturity, only to abandon them, and then expect them to be properly equipped to survive in the wilds.

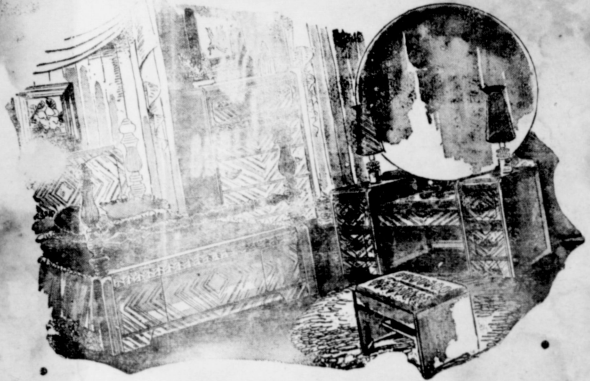

THE BIBLE SPEAKS
International Union of School Teachers

Sharing Our Faith

Lesson for December 10, 1950

SCRIPTURE: Acts 4:1-13; 18:1-7; 1 Corinthians 9:16-17; II Corinthians 1:3-7; Philippians 1:1-11; DEVOTIONAL READING: Romans 1:1-17.

A COMMON SIGHT in cities of ancient times was the "libation." Statues of gods or goddesses stood at every prominent corner in every yard; they were as numerous as billboards today. Before one of these statues some one would be pouring out wine from a cup or goblet, an offering of thanks, giving or dedication. Saint Paul Dr. Foreman even used the libation as a figure of speech to describe himself. My life, he said to his friend Timothy, is being poured out — there was not much left of it; but all of it, every drop, would be poured out as an offering to God.

Miser of Life or Spender? PAUL was no miser of life. If life was a full cup, it was not a cup with a tight lid, not like one of your grandmother's jars of very special preserve — he saved and saved but never used. Paul was a spender of life. Whatever God had given him was to be poured out, not to be saved.

There is something in every one's cup of life, something that spoils if kept too long, something fragrant and beautiful when poured out in service. The miser of life finds that his life at last turns sour on him. The spender of life finds that as he has given, in the same measure it will be given him.

Faith Can't Be Hoarded ONE very important part of the Christian's life is highlighted for us in this week's Scripture: his faith. Indeed, faith ought not to be a part of life for the Christian. Faith is no more a "part" of life than sunshine is a part of the outdoors. Without the sunshine there might as well not be any outdoors. So without faith the Christian's life would be mere existence.

The question is: What do we do with our faith? Do we keep it for ourselves alone or do we pass it on? Last summer a man tried to get a grocery store to take back 100 pounds of sugar which he had laid up during World War II. He had hoarded it till it was hard as rock and he could not use a pound of it. (The grocery would not take it back and it served him right.) Faith is like that: it is sweet and good — but only if we use it and share it, not if we keep it.

What Is Sharing Faith? SHARING your faith means helping others to have a faith at least as strong as your own. All around us there are persons who have no faith at all. They are discouraged, blue, bewildered, at loose ends — in the sad old phrase, they are lost. Sharing your faith means sharing it with just such people. With some things, the more you give away the less you have left; but the arithmetic of faith is different. The more you give away, the more you have. Shared faith is living faith. It talks about it. A person can "give a testimony" in a prayermeeting, and share faith that way; but this is not the only way. A person who merely talks about faith is a little like a gardener who is proud of his own garden and brags on it, but never helps his neighbors with theirs.

How Can We Do It Every Day? REMEMBER, what we are really trying to share when we "share the "gospel" or "share Christ" is not an argument, a set of propositions. The big thing is not arguing other people into becoming Christians. Very few persons have ever become Christians because someone talked them into it. Talk has its place, and every Christian should be eager to say a good word for Jesus Christ at every chance. But good words for Jesus have their best effect when they come from a life that is really His.
