## Marketing Quotas Election To Be December 14

The Secretary of Agriculture has announced a Peanut Marketing Quota Referendum on peanuts for 1951, 1952 and 1953.

To be in effect two thirds of the peanut producers must vote in favor of the allotments and quotas. If quotas are voted the price of peanuts will be supported from 80 to 90 per cent of parity.

If quotas are not voted, the price of peanuts will be supported at 50 per cent of parity, which would be about \$120.00 per ton at the present price levels.

Texas lost the extra 48,000 acres of peanuts for 1950, and in addition received the regular state reduction, which makes Texas take a reduction of 25 per cent from the 1950 all tment.

All producers of peanuts in 1950 are eligible to vote. Husband and wife may vote. The voting will be held December 14, 1950. The voting box for Carbon will be at Carbon Trading Company.

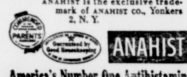

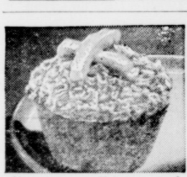

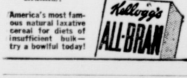

**CHILDREN ARE COMBUSTIBLE**

**Thousands of Children Die Each Year From Careless Home Fires**

One cold winter morning in Baltimore last January a young couple rose early, and after looking in on their children who were still sleeping, went a few doors down the road to open their filling station for the day.

The wife was cleaning around the office, the husband checking the cash when a terrified youngster burst in on them: "Your house is on fire," she shouted, "your house is on fire."

The woman gasped in disbelief. "My house, but..." That was impossible. She had left it just a few minutes before. Then in sudden horror she turned to her husband, "The children, John, the children."

They ran up to the house where smoke could be seen from the kitchen window. It was impossible to get through the door, the smoke was so thick. Frantically the wife ran around to the side windows where neighbors were hysterically tugging at storm shutters, the women hysterically calling to the four children still in the house. The mother rushed to the windows, started to claw at the shutters, managed to rip the wood off its hinges. She smashed the glass with her fist and pulled herself up into the smoke-filled room.

**Rescues Children**

Reaching the baby's crib, she crawled with the child in her arms to the window, lifted him out to a neighbor. The woman touched him and shivered. He was already dead.

In the meantime, the father had made his way into a rear room, carried out their five-year-old son. Together the husband and wife brought the two other children to the window, just got outside and collapsed themselves. The four children, ranging from eight months to five years, were dead. Smoke and fumes had suffocated them. Firemen found that a kerosene oil stove had caught fire in the kitchen, created the poisonous gases that filtered through the rooms.

One of the youngsters apparently had tried to use the telephone but had lost consciousness, a neighbor reported later. The woman found the party line open when she tried to call the fire department.

The deaths were a cruel blow to the mother and father. But a fact that is more cruel is that it is not an unique accident. It is duplicated in many American homes every year. Thousands of children die in home fires every year. The National Board of Fire Underwriters reports at least 2,000 fire deaths are of children under five years of age, when it is unlikely that they can help themselves in an emergency.

Seeking the causes of fires in which most young children die, the U. S. Office of Education selected at random 800 cases reported in the newspapers.

Their findings: 185 were caused by stove explosions; 100 by people who tried to quicken a fire with kerosene or gasoline; some 31 children were burned to death while playing with matches.

In 300 of the fires the cause was never found, and the remaining 204 started in various ways, from defective electric cords to spontaneous ignition of oily rags and paint cloths.

Of these 800 children, more than half were under five. The survey showed, too, that in at least 250 cases the children were alone in the house.

**Instructions for Sitters**

A tragic fire broke out recently when six children were left alone in their upstate New York home overnight. All six children died in the blaze that spread so quickly neighbors couldn't get to their rescuers. The parents had been visiting relatives just two miles away.

Children left alone need very few minutes in which to crawl into trouble, the National Board warns. There should always be an adult to

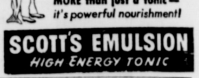

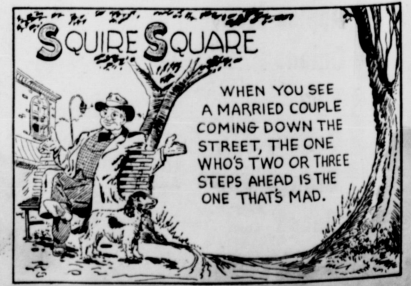

**Stewardship of Life**  
Lesson for December 3, 1950

"WHAT'S the death rate here?" asked the stranger. "Same as everywhere," retorted the native son, "one to a person." Only one to a person, because there is only one life to a person. If you had nine lives or even two, you might afford to waste one (though it's doubtful). But with only one life you simply cannot afford to waste it. Of course you do waste it, in thousands of little ways; and some of these cannot be helped. But if a faucet leaks, that's no excuse for turning the water on full blast.

God Wants You  
WITH all due respect to the arrangers of these lessons, the lesson for last week and this one seem to be in the reverse order from what is logical. It is very doubtful whether any one ever understood stewardship of money who did not understand stewardship of life first. Now in almost any church you may hear people singing,

"Were the whole realm of nature mine,  
That were a present far too small;  
Love so amazing, so divine,  
Demands my soul, my life, my all!"

Very good; wonderful. Surely these are a devoted brotherhood! But wait, what is this coming down the aisle? A man with a collection plate! Now we shall see. . . There's a man putting in a quart, and there's a prosperous-looking lady laying out a five dollar bill. (She bought a \$50 cat last week!) But who is putting in his soul, his life, his all?

The whole realm of nature is not yours to give; but you do have a life; and God wants it.

Not for Preachers Only  
A COMMON mistake is to think that a Christian has a choice between a preacher and not being one. If he decides to give his life to God then he will be a preacher; otherwise he keeps his life for himself.

This is absurd, when you think about it. God has the first claim on every man's life. To be a Christian is to recognize this claim. He has not a bit more claim on the preacher or the missionary than he has on the grocer or the farmer's wife.

"Who sweeps a room as if Thy laws  
Makes that and the action fine."  
sang a poet long ago. God certainly does not want all his children to be preachers. But he does want his children to live AS his children; and that means stewardship of life.

Stewardship of Time  
PICKING up again a thought from last week: Time is the raw material of life. Stewardship of life means spending each day as if God had personally said to you: "Here are 24 fresh, new, unused hours. I shall want them back. You cannot keep them. I shall look at them to see what you have done with them."

What do you do with your time? Does it count for God or against him? As yet — how many Christians there are who if asked to do some kind thing, —how many will say, "Sorry, I'm busy, haven't the time!"

Gift Without the Giver is Bare  
JUST put together four sentences from the four sections of the Scripture for this week, and you have the whole business of stewardship of life in a nutshell: "Having gifts, let us use them." "First they gave themselves to the Lord." "Honor such men." "My God will supply every need of yours." No one ever used for God in the service of man any gift which God did not more than repay. The gift without the giver is bare — and so is the gift. But giver and gift, devoted in love to God and man, are rich indeed.


