## Gorman Hospital Fund On Way to Its \$100,000 Goal

### Several from Carbon Attend Dinner

The Gorman Hospital Fund is well on its way to its \$100,000 goal, following the hospital benefit dinner which raised another \$1,025 Friday evening.

### Trustee Election Held Saturday

In the annual election held Saturday, Duncanson and Victor were re-elected trustees. L. McDaniel was elected trustee. Leonard Bledsoe was elected to fill the unexpired term of Bob Carlton who died from the school board several weeks ago.

Burleson remembered the poverty of his family, "I don't know we were poor," before going on to praise the hospital project which reassured him when he became "somewhat fearful that we have fallen into apathy, waiting for others to do something for us."

Named Outstanding Farmer was D. B. Warren, who with his wife, Idell, and sons Jerry and Wesley have more than tripled the crop yield from 603 acres of peanuts between Kokomo and Gorman. The family was honored by the Eastland Chamber of Commerce in January.

So far \$50,000 has been raised and the Friday night benefit dinner took a giant step toward the needed second \$50,000 it was said. The dinner was held at the High School Gym and a reception followed in the new office buildings of the Southwestern Peanut Growers Association.

The state hospital bill will be a permissive one, allowing the setting of taxes of up to 75 cents per \$100 property valuations and not an automatic imposition of a maximum tax rate. Building the hospital would also depend upon a grant from the Hill-Burton Foundation, but the Foundation has set a cutoff date of May 31 for new applications and the new district will have to be voted and organized between April 14 (date on which the bill will be presented to the Texas House) and May 31.

Charge, Jack Brown, Lions Clubs president, was arrangements chairman.

Reminiscing briefly over his early days in the community,

"It's not a simple matter of knowing what is right, but of practicing it," he said. He reminded his audience that "we take our freedoms for granted," saying that "in recent years we have become so preoccupied with trivia that what is wrong and what is right with the country has been forgotten."

Explaining that for a change he was to explain "what are our rights?" with a formula based on the ABC's, he led in with "A—the right to Advance, not to annihilate; B—the right to build, not to bury our talents, to Create, not to coerce."

"The right to Defend our freedom — not to destroy its foundation." "We have people chipping away under the foundation, misunderstanding what is right."

Continuing via "the right to produce but not to plunder," and "the right to question but not to quibble increasingly about trivia that hinders progress," he finished a "re-echo" marking "with all the misakes of the past," and "the right to zig-zag our responsibilities as fulltime citizens."

## 16th County Pecan School To Be April 18th In Cisco

The 16th Annual Eastland County Pecan Budding and Grafting School will be held at Cisco, April 18, according to an announcement today by DeMarquis Gordon, Eastland County Agricultural Agent.

The school will be co-sponsored by the Eastland County Pecan Growers Association and the Cisco Chamber of Commerce. The morning session of the school will begin at 9:30 a.m. in the new auditorium of Cisco Junior College. This session will be devoted to discussions, pictures and demonstrations on budding and grafting.

After lunch, the afternoon session will be held at a local pecan orchard near Cisco. Field demonstrations will be given and everyone will have

an opportunity to practice the patch budding and inlay grafting techniques.

Dr. J. W. Worthington, Texas A&M Extension Service Horticulturist, will be the instructor. Pecan producers and county agent will assist with the demonstrations.

Anton White, President of the Eastland County Pecan Growers Assn., said the association will have bud wood, graft wood, as well as budding and grafting supplies for sale. This will include budding and grafting wood of most of the new USDA varieties.

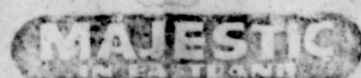
White invites everyone to attend. He said over 1,000 men and women from central and West Texas have attended the school during the last 15 years and learned to propagate pecans.

## Lueders Encampment To Be Managed By Rev. Shepherd

For the last two and a half years the Rev. Mr. Shepherd has served as pastor of Calvary Baptist Church at Brownwood. Prior to that he served at Rotan's Hillcrest Baptist Church and at West Side in Sweetwater. Before becoming a pastor he was in the construction business.

Rev. Shepherd succeeds N. I. (Doc) Williams who resigned as manager after serving 11 years. During this period, ma-

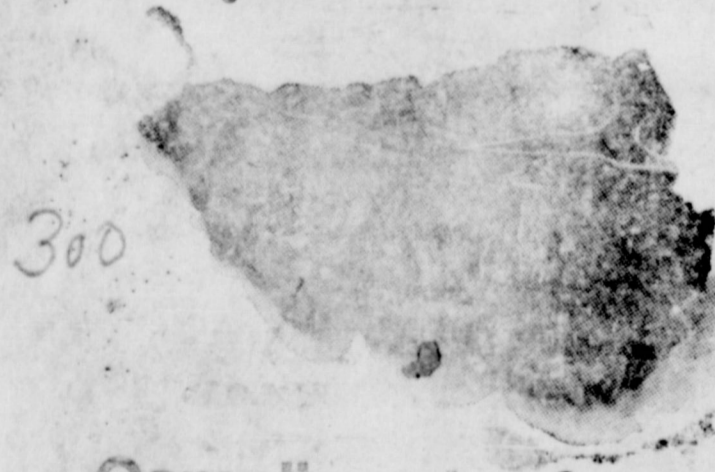
