In Prime, Jeffries Had No Equal

A FEW DAYS AGO big Jim Jeffries celebrated his 78th birthday at Burbank, California. Quite bald, with his left side partially paralyzed from a stroke, big Jim is still quite a hucky citizen. How good was he? He must have been pretty tough on June 9, 1899, when he knocked out Bob Fitzsimmons at Coney Island, for this was Jeffries' 11th fight. He had been Corbett's sparring partner two years before when Jim was training for Fitzsimmons, and he was only 24 when he stopped Red Robert of Cornwall.

Just where is Jeffries' place in the ranking list of heavyweights? It is on record that by 1905 he outclassed the field so far that he had to retire. It was a joke to suggest any challenge.

It is also on record that he was a bald-headed fat man when he tried to come back against Johnson. Jim weighed 265 pounds when he started training for this fight. The first time I saw Jim Jeffries was in 1903 in Atlanta. He had just come from under a shower and I thought I was in the same room with a grizzly bear. He was 6 feet 2—weighed 215 pounds—and thick, black hair covered his legs and body. He was then one of the finest athletes I've ever seen. He could high jump around six feet and he could run the 100 in 10 flat. I saw him work out one afternoon and he gave a remarkable exhibition of foot, and hand speed.

"What few people know," Jim Corbett told me one day, "is that by the time of our second fight Jeffries had become as good a boxer as I was. I have never seen a fighter improve as he did. You couldn't hurt him with two axes, he was dead game and he could punch. Jim Jeffries was a great fighter when he retired in 1905, as great a fighter as I have ever seen. Maybe the best of them all. I couldn't name anyone to even hurt him, much less beat him."

And Corbett saw Jack Dempsey wreck Jess Willard. Corbett had a deep and profound respect for Jeffries as a fighter—before he retired.

There are few left who saw Jeffries work in his prime. To most of the modern experts he was lumbering, floundering giant who

knew little about boxing. But you can write it down that from 1900 through 1905, Jim Jeffries was a great fighter who certainly doesn't deserve to be shoved as far down the list as many have placed him.

Greasy Neale Reports
It seemed rather logical that the best man to interview about this professional football situation was the coach of the best National League team the last two years. His name is Greasy Neale. He doesn't answer to Earl. Greasy won the big title with his Philadelphia Eagles in 1948 and 1949.

He won the first in a ranging snow tornado and the second in the middle of a California cloudburst with a team that was at its best on a fast field. There may be smarter coaches around than the often querulous Mr. Neale, but I can't remember their names at the moment.

Greasy qualifies as a typical member of the coaches guild, since he is just about as pessimistic as Frank Leahy of Notre Dame or Red Blaik of Army. To these two, every silver lining has a cyclone cloud, and the only light, frivolous tune they enjoy is Chapin's Funeral March.

For some unknown reason Greasy Neale is always frowning. He even frowns at his best pal, Steve Owen, who gave Greasy more football trouble than anyone else when Steve had a few players.

"What about 1950 for the pros?" I asked Greasy. "I could only draw the 13th man in the draft," Neale said. "I have to stand pat."

Baseball has two managers this season who happen to be carrying the heaviest burdens upon their broad backs. These two overburdened men are Joe McCarthy of the Red Sox and Burt Shotton of the Dodgers. They have been credited by the majority with the best teams in their two leagues and they have been picked to win far and wide.

McCarthy is the one that has the heaviest load.

the war I was qualified to resign my position as head of the ready-to-wear department with Higginbotham Bros. and Company in Gorman, where I lasted 19 days of working 8 years, and to go into supervisory work in Fort Worth. That job was with Montgomery Ward and Company's mail order department, and I took it because they wanted women to take jobs to release the men holding jobs for military service. We were actually doing men's work, and the 2 years I worked there I had under my supervision from 3 to 55 people—both young men and women.

"Since coming back to Gorman, I set up my own office which took

care of the work of public stenographer, notary public, map service, news service, general contact and information work, and leasing work during our little oil flurry in the Kirk Field near Gorman. You may have read my oil news column.

"I may be somewhat slow in getting to all areas of the county, because I am having to work to pay for this campaign as I go, but it is my intention to see each of you before the Democratic primary, and regardless of the outcome of the election, I hope to number you as my friends when this is over.

"Now, I think you can see that I can handle this office, and this is to tell you that I want this office more than anything I have ever asked any group or person for. And again, I thank you."
