It is these men who see to it that such national programs are properly adapted to conditions in Eastland County and to your farm. And it is the background and experience of these same men that will be mingled with that of the other 135,000 farmer-committee men in the United States in the formulation of any new programs that developments in the coming year may require.

You are eligible to vote if you have an interest as owner, operator, tenant, or sharecropper on a farm that is participating in any program administered during the current calendar year.

Voting boxes will be in the Cloo Chamber of Commerce, the Eastland Post Office, the Ranger City Hall, Gorman Higginbotham Brothers, the Carbon Trading Company, and the Rising Star City Hall.

Polls will be open from 8:00 a. m. until 5:00 p. m. Be sure to vote and elect the 1936 committee men of your choice.

Wingless Chickens Cause Speculation

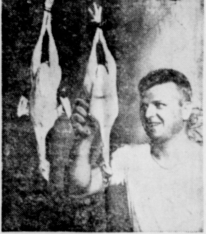
Impact on Industry Studied by Growers

Poultrymen and consumers throughout the United States are still speculating on the degree impact on the poultry industry of the development of wingless chickens.

Peter Baumann, Des Moines, Iowa, a veterinary-supply salesman, has raised a flock of 400 such chickens and has proclaimed loudly that they are the "mearest thing" alive to famed cartoonist Al Capp's "shmoos."

Baumann said he had spent 10 years developing the wingless flocks, and that he expects the breed to set a new trend in chicken raising. He pointed out that the wingless chicken has a thick layer of white meat, where ordinary chickens have wings.

Baumann said he had kept his

chicken breed a "frak" because he wanted to be sure it was a success. He studied animal husbandry at Iowa State college and asserts his wingless chickens are not a "frak." A frak does not reproduce, he argued.

The ancestors of this new breed of chicken, Baumann said, came from Texas. He was traveling through that state in the '30's when he acquired a light Brahma rooster and a white Minorca hen. Each bird had only stubs for wings.

He bred them, he said, and was astounded when the hen hatched wingless chickens. He then began experimenting and breeding. Baumann reported that at first he got only three or four wingless birds out of 100 eggs. Now, he said, about 95 of every 100 chicks have no wings at all. Some of the others, he said, have stubs or a stub on one side and a wing on the other.

Eases Farm Chores



Wagon unloaders are among the latest electrical devices to be developed for farm chore use. Most types are still in the experimental stage, but many sections of the country already are using them to a large extent. In Wisconsin, for example, 50 per cent of the farmers who have tractor harvesters also have electric wagon unloaders.

Under ordinary circumstances, a three-ton load can be handled with an electric unloader by one man in five minutes. Cost of operation is low, with power provided by a 1/2 horsepower portable motor, which can be used on other farm machines when not connected to the unloader.

Pressure Saucepan Saves Time and Fuel

IN A comparatively short time the pressure saucepan has won an assured place in farm kitchens, according to Laura Dailey, in an article in Capper's Farmer, one of the best-known farm magazines. It saves time and fuel. Many different foods may be prepared in a pressure saucepan. It is particularly good for those which need long cooking. "Pressure cooking," Miss



Dailey says, "preserves food value, color and flavor."
A few rules of operation are important:
1.—Never fill the pan more than two-thirds full.
2.—Be sure that steam flows steadily from vent before you close it.
3.—Wait until weight or pressure control jiggles or hisses or cooking indicator is at right position to your directions before you start counting time. Then reduce the heat and let cook for specified time.
4.—Reduce the pressure as each recipe indicates.
5.—After pressure is reduced, be certain to remove the weight, or lift the pressure control, before removing cover.
Some farm women are doing a limited amount of canning in their pressure saucepans, Miss Dailey points out.

THE BIBLE SPEAKS
 By DR. KENNETH J. FOREMAN

SCRIPTURE: Isaiah 55, 56-62
 DEVOTIONAL READING: Romans 10:1-13

God's Open House
 Lesson for November 20, 1949

IT IS A WARM chapter, this 55th of Isaiah. Some false ideas about God melt away fast when they are brought close to it. Let us take a look at some of these notions and see how they will in the light of God's word. Sometimes these notions are held sincerely, sometimes they are mere excuses to keep from facing God. One of these mistaken notions is the idea that God has two lists; one is a list of people on whom the Dr. Foreman intends to have mercy, and will save; the other list being a private one, of those on whom he intends to have no mercy and will not save. If your name is on the first list, fine; but if it is on the second list, you are in a hopeless fix; for if God is not going to help you, who can't?

This is a terribly wrong notion. It confuses the true God with some sort of sultan in the sky who has a "social register" of persons he will admit to his palace. "Use this invitation as your card of admittance." No, it is not at all like that.



If you really think that admission to heaven is by invite, then cut out Isaiah 55 and present it at the gate. Cut out any verse in the Bible that says "Whosoever,"—John 3:16 for example—and present that. God keeps open house, he does not employ butlers or strong-arm men to keep out the crowds, he wants all to come who will.

No Waiting
THERE IS ANOTHER notion that keeps people away from God. It is a kind of shyness. It is the feeling that maybe it isn't any use hunting for God. It is the feeling a boy has when he is lost in the woods and has about made up his mind that there is no use in walking any more, he will just sit down and wait till somebody finds him.

It is the feeling that God may be sensitive and doesn't want people coming bothering him. It is the notion that if God wants me, he will knock me down and drag me where he wants me to be. A man with a notion like that, of course, isn't likely to meet with God.

He spends his life paying God no attention whatever, not even thinking about him, perhaps. He may even go so far as he can from the Father's house, believing that God's long arm, like the long arm of the F.B.I. or the Mounties, will reach after him and get him in case God ever wants him.

Now this is a ridiculous idea and a bad one too. Isaiah would not think it true for a minute. "Seek ye the Lord," he says. "Call on God . . . return to the Lord." "Incline your ear and come!" This means you—if you will. But if you won't, God will not force you.

No House Of Horrors

ANOTHER WRONG NOTION, for which, alas, many a church member is partly responsible, is the notion that the nearer we get to God, the gloomier we shall be. All the talk about sacrifice and suffering for others, such as we were thinking of last week, all the emphasis in the church on the death of Christ, all the solemnity of most church services, make people think: "God may be all right for solemn people, but not for me; I like life with a smile."

Now that is just another mistaken notion. The very persons who know the deeper meanings of sacrifice are just the persons who don't like to use that word about themselves.

In fact, it could be said that in general it is only Christians who have a right to be gay. Jesus himself, on the same night in which he was betrayed, spoke to his friends about sharing his joy to the full.

Do you really want to find out what goes on there? Don't be content to hear others say, "It's wonderful!" God's door stands open.
