Ranger Offers Prize For First 10,000 lbs. Peanuts Marketed There

Ranger, Texas, Sept. — The Ranger Chamber of Commerce is offering a cash prize of \$50.00 for the first load of 10,000 pounds or over of 1949 peanuts marketed in Ranger which grade 70 or better, less than 9 per cent moisture, and sound, mature vermas.

The first load to arrive at the grading point will be the first tested and the test will be made by a federal-State approved grader who is stationed in Ranger.

Some peanut harvesting is now under way and in three or four weeks the marketing will be in full swing, with the best prospects for a bumper crop since 1942.

The Carbon Wolverines played the Moran Bulldogs in their first conference Class-B game of the season at Maverick stadium in Eastland last Friday night, where the game ended 12 to 0 in Moran's favor.

Moran had two touchdowns in the first half on a line play and in the second quarter intercepted a pass for their second score. Neither team could score in the second half but the game ended 6-0 with the Wolverines on the Moran 11 yard line.

The Wolverines showed more power through the line than did the Moran Bulldogs, with Charles McDaniel, carbon halfback, ripping off long runs. The outstanding player in the line was Fred Brown, Carbon center. Also John Kent, Carbon, and Gene Clark shared honors with McDaniel in the back field. Coach R. L. Brandt

was well pleased with the performance of the team.

SCRIPTURE: Psalms 23: 4; DEVOTIONAL READING: Psalm 138

The Psalms We Sing

Lesson for September 25, 1949

IT WOULD be a most unusual person who in his dying bed would turn to the 32nd chapter of I Chronicles and not to the 23rd Psalm.

Poetry's Power WHY the appeal of poetry? For one thing, it is vivid. It is in colors, and it breathes, at times it sings, and it always sings.

It is true to say "The provincial oversight of the creator continues and unremitting." It is more effective to say, "The Lord is my shepherd."

Another secret of poetry's power is that it is the language of emotion. Professors and theologians may be saying the same things as the poet, and maybe even saying them more completely and accurately; but what they say is less so to remember.

It is no wonder the Psalms have been loved and sung all the centuries. We are perhaps the only nation that has made so much use of another religion's hymn books.

For centuries it was the hymnal of the Christian church. Indeed, up to recent years some large denominations would allow in public worship the singing of no other songs than the Psalms.

Many of our best hymns and popular gospel songs, as we have already seen, are based on Psalms. "Rock of Ages, cleft for me," "A Shelter in the Time of Storm," "Hiding in Thee"—they all go back to the Psalmist's picture of God as a Rock (Ps. 42:9). The Psalmist was not thinking of a little rock in a field. He was thinking of some tall crag in the fiercest landscape of his country.

So God is the landmark of life, he gives direction to our ways; he is the shelter on life's weary journey, he is our safe dwelling.

So with many other pictures of God in the Psalms—he is light, he is shade, he is the guard on duty at night watching over the sleeping city (Ps. 121); he is a shepherd, he is water for the thirsting soul (Ps. 42).

A Model Hymnal It is true that few Christians today depend on in worship all of the Psalms, without omission or changes. It is also true that practically all Christian churches find that the Psalms, by themselves, are inadequate to express all there is in Christian experience, faith and ideals.

This should be the ideal of all Christian hymn and song books. Some of our modern "hymns" as well as some older ones, are bad because they are no better than jingles,—doggerel, not poetry, and often sung to tunes either suited to a jake box; and some are bad because they convey either nonsense or downright falsehood.

By the way, our hymns, and our best hymns, are those which like the Psalms of old, combine profound truths about God and man, duty and destiny with safety, stirring and singable music.

How It Started ..

PUPIL IN THE EYE—The word "pupil" is from the Latin "Pupilla" meaning a very little girl. Hence the word pupil is an apt term for a young school child.

NOT WORTH A REP—Because a "rep" was a counterfeit 17th coin during the reign of George I, to designate something as not "worth a rep" was to depreciate it, indeed.

INFANTRY—There are two theories as to why foot soldiers are called infantry. One has it that a foot soldier of feudal times was the warrior, or follower, of a mounted nobleman, and was called a boy, or infant. The other holds that infantry means a collection of talents, or talents, so called by contrast with the professional veterans of the country.

QUESTION: Is there anything I could put on my aluminum outdoor clothes line so that black smudges can be kept off the clothes? Even after thorough wiping it is possible to rub "black" off the line.

ANSWER: After thorough cleaning, rinsing and drying, give the line a coat of good spar varnish. To get an even coat, saturate a piece of cheesecloth with the varnish and wipe it on in care.
