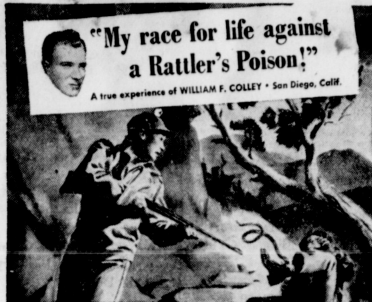

To Nath H. Hooe, his heirs, his unknown heirs and the unknown heirs of such unknown heirs defendants, Greeting:
You are hereby commanded to appear before the Honorable 91st District Court of Eastland County at the Court House thereof, in Eastland, Texas, at or before 10 o'clock A. M. of the first Monday next after the expiration of forty-two days from the date of the issuance of this citation, same being the 30th day of October, A. D. 1949, then and there to answer Plaintiff's First Amended Original Petition filed in said court, on the 24th day of August, A. D. 1943, in this cause, numbered 20,595 on the docket of said court and styled D. Henry Limbocker and wife, Mamie L. Limbocker Plaintiffs, vs. Nath H. Hooe, his heirs, his unknown heirs and the unknown heirs of such unknown heirs defendants.

A brief statement of the nature of this suit is as follows, to-wit: This is suit to trespass to try title on the following described land, to-wit: Being a part of the N. H. Hooe Survey, Abstract No. 319, and particularly described as follows: TRACT 1: Beginning at the W. Corner of Survey made by C. Devenport for S. E.
