Ranger Junior College Advances With The Years

Ranger Junior College, with 24 years of progress in the field of education, looks forward to greater advancement in the coming years.

The college is situated 85 miles west of Fort Worth on highway 80 and has become recognized as one of the strongest junior colleges in the south west.

The courses of study offered at Ranger Junior College are accepted by other institutions of higher learning. There is a friendly atmosphere prevailing between the professors and the students. The college is situated in a town that is conducive for wholesome, democratic and efficient teaching.

The cost of attending this college is possibly the least of any college anywhere. The tuition is state adopted and textbooks are rented to the students at a very nominal fee. The physical plant has been greatly enlarged under the supervision of its president, Dr. G. C. Boswell, in the past 2 years, and is now housed in good buildings
