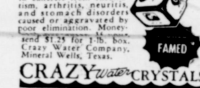

Record Browne

Official confirmation of a new world's record for an Alaskan Brown Bear has been given to Bob Reeve of Anchorage, Alaska, for a giant Browne he killed on May 26, 1948, near Cape Bay. Weighing 1,800 pounds, with a pelt 12 feet 4 inches in width and 10 feet 4 inches in length, the Browne was killed with a Model 95 Winchester lever action in .405 caliber. Reeve took two shots at approximately 270 yards with 300-grain soft point bullets to bring down his record breaker. Reeve's first shot broke the animal's left hip and his second penetrated both shoulders and killed the bear instantly.

Apathetic Citizens

I HAD A BIT of an argument, or at least a conversation, with a retired school superintendent on the subject of teaching American government, its concept, practice and operation in the American schools beginning in the grades and continuing through to high school graduation.

That argument, or conversation, aroused my curiosity. I wanted some idea as to what portion of Americans—youngsters and older—were, or were not familiar with the operation of government, and BY the people."

As opportunity offered, I talked informally with a dozen people. I formulated no set of questions to ask, but whenever I could I would turn a conversation around to the subject of government, and inject some question, as if for my own enlightenment. In age, my 12 people ranged from late teens to those on the down hill of life.

In all of the run-of-the-mill 12 I found only one who could tell me, in an intelligent way, the fundamentals of our government's operations, local, county, state and national. As for the teen-agers, boys from good families, I found their knowledge of interest in government began and stopped with the cops. To them the policeman was government, and they were against him.

A prominent doctor asked me what determined the amount of taxes he was to pay to the city, county and state. When I told him that insofar as the country is concerned the board of supervisors determined how much money they would need and the assessor made a tax list to produce that amount. He did not know what the board of supervisors was, or what its job was. He knew nothing of his local, county, state or national governments.

A young woman, state university student, working as a secretary, thought I was talking about congress, but she said she didn't know what it consisted of. The only senators she knew of were those connected with her state government.

A young man, some 22 years, thought the name of the White House was all there was to government. He was a high school graduate. Of the two school teachers, the woman was, I think, the best informed, but she knew nothing of the details of the governmental operations. The man, of pronounced leftist tendencies, said frankly that he knew nothing of its operations, and would not be interested until it became a government of the proletariat. Neither the man or the woman would have been competent to teach the subject of government.

There was the condition, Out of a dozen run-of-the-mill, supposedly self-sufficient Americans, I had found not one less than 10 per cent, who had any real idea what government is all about, that in the freest, most prosperous, country on earth, whose government is "of, for and BY the people."

Over the years our government has grown into a stupendous and complex institution. We are the owners of that institution. We are responsible for its operation, and we hire the workmen who keep its wheels turning. My little investigation would indicate that by far the greater number of us know little or nothing about that which ours, and for which we are responsible. Why should we know, or how can we?

To the three R's of our public school education we have added many items to the curriculum, but no one of those additions touches the most important of all subjects for all of us—government.

If our free government BY the people is to continue the people must know the fundamentals and the details of that government. The place they should learn of it is in the schools.

To teach the concept, the practical purpose and the details of the operations of government to the youth of the land will mean, for them, a greater respect for law, more appreciation of the responsibilities and obligations as citizens, and should do much to reduce the youthful delinquency that worries all parents and law officials.

FIRST AID to the AILING HOUSE by Roger C. Whitman

Stick With Paint QUESTION: I would like to take the screws off my door hinges. I am unable to use a screwdriver because the heads of the screws are covered with paint. What is the best way to take the paint off the screws so I may remove them?

ANSWER: First stick masking tape all around the screws to protect the adjacent painted surfaces. Then cover each nail head with a dab of paste paint remover, and give it time to soften the paint. Then rub off the paint with steel wool moistened with turpentine. If you do not wish to buy paint remover for such a small job, moisten a little trisodium phosphate and put sand on the screw heads, letting it stay there until the paint softens.

**New Tack in Health War**  
While the American Medical Association in national convention and otherwise continuing to bombard the administration's national health insurance program as socialized medicine, administration leaders in charge of the program took a new tack before house and senate committees by asserting that the national health insurance program would prevent, not cause, socialized or state medicine.

And the testimony of J. Donald Kingsley, assistant federal security administrator, speaking for Oscar Ewing, the administrator, who is ill, at least gives you something to think about in mulling over this much-debated subject. Here's what Kingsley told the committees.

The problems confronting the people insofar as the medical field is concerned are not medical problems, but economic problems; that the first is the manpower or doctor shortage and the hospital or facility shortage; second, the manpower and facility distribution, in that hospitals and doctors are not distributed where they are needed and, third, that another economic question is one of inadequate medical purchasing power.

He declared the doctor is doing his part of the job of preventive and curative medicine magnificently and the results they achieve in those areas where they are given a chance are proof of that, but a common financial problem underlies, which is not the problem of the doctor, but for the economist and the statesman.

The thing that national health insurance is expected to cure, according to Kingsley, is the fact that today a substantial proportion of our population must depend upon public or private charity or go without the type of medical care that modern medicine knows how to provide.

And here are some statistics. The federal government is today providing medical care for some 24 million citizens; government owns and operates three-fourths of all hospital beds, government already employs directly thousands of American doctors and pays fees to many hundreds more, the taxpayer's money finances full medical care for all members of the armed forces and their dependents and for all disabled veterans.

It provides hospital care for needy veterans, for merchant seamen and complete care for tubercular, mental and other chronic patients. It pays the cost of limited medical care for those on public relief rolls. It gives members of the congress free medical service and free hospital and doctor service in government hospitals such as the naval hospital at Bethesda, Md., and Walter Reed hospital in Washington.

In addition the taxpayers carry the load on that vast field of medical service such as public health. For all this the taxpayers are paying millions upon millions of dollars.

**GE Head Optimistic**  
One of the top business executives, Charles E. Wilson, of General Electric, sees no drastic depression ahead, not more than a 15 per cent decline all along the line by the second quarter of 1950 with the high level of 1948 again reached by the end of 1951.

This is a bright picture painted by Mr. Wilson. But government economists and some members of congress are taking no chances. Even today they are dusting off the full employment act of 1946 and its provisions for bolstering the economy and what's more, a new bill is in the offing.

The thought behind this new proposed plan is that if unemployment goes as high as five million it's dangerous and something should be ready, so a drastic plan will be attempted with government playing a leading role. The proposed plan of expansion is backed by Senators Murray, Montana; Pepper, Florida; Kilgore, West Virginia; Kefauver, Tennessee; Humphrey, Minnesota; McMahon, Connecticut; Sparkman, Alabama; Thomas, Utah and many congressmen.

**Marching Songs**  
Lesson for July 10, 1949

WE did not win all the battles we fought with Japan. The day of a certain naval defeat near the Philippines, an American "baby" carrier, left to its fate, was doing its best to get away from the pursuing Japanese. All afternoon it dodged and twisted. Enemy destroyers and planes were in its trail, and it was a "sitting duck" in case they Dr. Foreman really got off to a fine start. No one on board expected to live. The only question in anybody's mind was: How soon will they get us? But late in the afternoon, for some reason never explained, the enemy gave up the chase, and the American ship slipped off into the protecting night. The next day, as the men gathered for a special service of thanksgiving, the chaplain read the 125th Psalm. It came as a new Psalm altogether to those men, even to those who had known it by heart:

"If it had not been the Lord who was on our side, when man rose up against us, then they had swallowed us up quick, when their wrath was kindled against us; that the proud waters had gone over our soul. Blessed be the Lord, who hath not given us as a prey to their teeth."

**"Let Me Write A Nation's Songs"**  
THE POWER to thrill has not been lost by the Psalmist as the men on that carrier found out. The group numbered 120 through 134 in the Bible are known as the "Psalms of David" and were originally used by the Hebrews as they went year by year up to their capital city of Jerusalem; and to the Temple which was the center of their religion. Then as now, the Hebrews were a singing people. A nation that cannot sing, a nation without songs, is a dismal country indeed.

Difference among various countries is symbolized by their songs, or the lack of them. The Chinese, for instance, have no song that draws them all together in the same way that Englishmen are united in "God Save the King" or as Frenchmen once were by the "Marseillaise."

When it comes to pass, as once it did in the United States, that one part of the nation will sing one song ("John Brown's Body") while another part will not sing that song but another one (say, "Dicke"), then civil war is at the gates. Only people who will sing together can be trusted to live together.

**Singing Church**  
IN the long caravans, marching up the rocky hillside trails to Jerusalem, the ancient Hebrews put their faith into stirring words set to music. So it is always. All over the Christian world, wherever and whenever the singing is good, religion is warm and vigorous.

It is not an accident that the Moravian church is at the same time the church that makes more of Easter than some other churches, it is the church where at funerals the music is never sad but joyous, not mourning songs but triumphant hymns of Christian faith.

**Patriotism and Religion**  
READ these marching Psalms through—the reading time is only a few minutes—and see yourself how the ancient Hebrew men of God united their praise of Him with love for their country. To this day, in our Christian hymns, patriotism and religion are often combined. The English national anthem, "God Save the King" is a prayer; so is "America the Beautiful." National hymns have a rightful place in a book of public worship.

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**How It Started...**  
WHEN IN ROME DO AS THE ROMANS DO... The story is told that back in the fourth century the Romans fasted on Saturday, while the citizens of Milan feasted on that day. St. Augustine was puzzled by these practices. He consulted St. Ambrose of Milan. "When I am here in Milan," St. Ambrose said, "I don't fast on Saturday; when I'm in Rome, I do." Thus, when in Rome, he did as the Romans did.

"O.K."... At Urbane during the Harrison campaign of 1840, an enthusiastic supporter joined the Whig procession driving a platform wagon on which seats were arranged for his friends. Suspended over the wagon bed a crudely painted banner proclaimed: "The People I Oll Koves!" When the opposing party seized on this misquoting as an evidence of ignorance, the Ohio Whigs made the most of the situation by adopting abbreviation "O.K." as a favorite slogan.

SCUTTLE... This word is derived from the French "escouille" (bathtub). A scuttle is a small opening in the deck, side or bottom of a ship. Thus the verb refers to the act of cutting such holes and has come to mean specifically the sinking or attempt to sink a vessel by cutting holes in the bottom.
