## Weekend Holidays May Result In Many Fatalities

Austin, June 30.—The Fourth of July celebration will bring death or injury to a thousand Texans.

Nine hundred will be hurt in traffic accidents during the long week end from Saturday through Monday. Twenty-seven will be killed in auto accidents. A dozen will be drowned. Twenty-five will die as suicides or murder victims. Fifteen more will die in plane crashes, fires and other accidents. That's a total of 79 violent deaths.

These predictions were announced today by Chas. A. Miller, President of the Texas Safety Association, following a holiday accident prevention conference with officials of the Texas Department of Public Safety.

"Speed, more than anything else, will account for the traffic fatalities," Miller said. Emphasizing that extra caution is needed to overcome holiday hazards created by heavy traffic, Miller pointed out that speed control is the personal responsibility of each driver.

"Safe speeds," he declared, "have little if any relationship to legal speed limits. You are permitted to drive 60 miles an hour on an open highway in the daytime, but only if the road is in good condition, traffic is sparse, weather clear, driver and car in good condition, and so on. When a hazard occurs, the driver must compensate for it, the stupid driver doesn't. That's why we bury so many stupid drivers."

Since traffic law violations will be involved in virtually all the fatal accidents occurring during the holiday period, Miller said, the Texas Highway Patrol and local traffic officers are expected to be out in full force in an effort to hold down on accidents with strict enforcement.

High Schools at Olden, Morton Valley, Desdemona and Scranton have been fully accredited by the State Department of Education for the coming school year, according to information received by County School Supt. Carl Elliott.

In a letter, Gordon Worley, head of the accrediting department of the State Department of Education, told Elliott that on June 17 the accrediting committee at Austin had unanimously approved the four high schools as fully accredited high schools for the school year of 1949-1950.

Elliott pointed out that this means work done in the schools will be accepted anywhere for credit.

Earlier, the schools had been warned that they might not be accredited another year if they did not show attendance in "reasons during the next school year."

**KA'LEEN NORRIS** **Wor Needs Women**

NOT LONG AGO I said in one of these articles that an important element in a successful marriage was the quality all good wives have, the quality of apparently accepting what is presented then by the different members of the family, apparently agreeing to it, and then gradually and gently breaking it down. This process is entirely familiar to all intelligent women. It is dimly visualized by some men, but not clearly. That the little woman, without crossing them or starting a row, does somehow manage to keep things going with a maximum of happiness for all concerned, is what they want to know.

Men's way is to do a thing at once, do it twice over if necessary, hammer and nail it down. And then they show an innocent surprise, and have been showing it for hundreds of years, that somehow it all comes unstuck. Some years ago a national magazine asked me to answer a provocative article by Albert Wiggin. The article was entitled "Where Are the Women Geniuses?" and it contended, and truly, that there aren't any.

No Real Genius No, no woman has ever written a great literary classic, a play, an opera, a symphony. *Rico Bonheur*, *Sappho*, *Chaminade*, *Jane Austen* and *George Eliot* usually are rushed to the fore when the question is raised, but having sampled or seen the works of all of them, I am obliged to agree with Professor Wiggam. Perhaps *Miss Austen* comes closest to genius, but it



... show an innocent surprise... "Women... in a... stand dazed place her works beside those of Dante, Goethe, Shakespeare, Milton, Dickens or the great company of the Russians. Of *Sappho* I know nothing, and I don't think the people who cite her as a genius do, either.

"*Bride and Prejudice*," I re-read last year. It's a fine tense story, but musty in its household morosity as genius never becomes musty, stiff in language. It's a book in which the lives of several helpless, love-hungry, marriage-awarding girls are described, but what the *Bennetts* were, or wanted to be, what they ate at any single meal, or what furnished any one of their rooms, *Miss Austen* does not deign to say. They don't take walks or ratse flowers or read books or get jobs; they languish about suffering at every slight from indifferent and godlike males, and are thrown into ecstasies at every smile. But yet it's good reading. I recommend it.

Different Interpretation What I said in my countering article in defense of women was this. That men's interpretation of the word "genius" ought to be entirely different from that of women. Unfortunately it isn't. Unfortunately we have followed like sheep their proud designation of their fellow-women as geniuses, when half of them—nine-tenths of them—are't geniuses at all. *Genius* lives. Most of the "geniuses" of our childhood are as forgotten as the roses of yesterday.

The genius of women goes far deeper than that of men, and real geniuses are almost as rare. But while the man wants the imitation, the copy, the superficial thing that is art, woman wants the real thing. She doesn't spend her energy on the physical composition that drains her dry, or the look that exhausts her physically as well as mentally, or the great statue that steeps her in plaster dust for years.

No, her masterpiece is the living thing. The clean and happy children about the supper table. The tired man, rested and content at the end of the day, among those who love him. The delicious seven-pound bundle that her hands are the first to touch is her poetry. The acid little wail of the new born is her music, or the sound of the children shouting in a Saturday backyard. Her marble is touched by her own lips as she stoops over the coffin of some loved old companion who has gone home.

**How It Started...**

The word "echo" has its origin in Greek mythology. It was the name of a nymph who, because her love for Narcissus was not returned, pined away until nothing was left of her but a voice that only repeated what it heard.

Sailors were called *Jack Tars* in Victorian times because they used to wear their hair long and tied into a stumpy pigtail, bound with string into a tarry-looking stump of rope.

The phrase "up the spout," indicating that something is irrevocably gone, originated in the days when pumpbrokers had a sort of tubular passageway, like a flue, connecting the shop and the storeroom. When something was hauled to the pumpbroker he would fasten a ticket on it and pass it up the spout.

The first Sunday schools, founded in 1780 in the slums of Gloucester, England, gave lessons in reading and writing and received their name because they were obliged to hold their classes on Sunday as it was the one day the poor children were free from work.

**AROUND THE HOUSE**

If lower part of a window shade is soiled, shade can be reversed to bring clean part into prominence; untack shade from roller; reverse; cut off any damaged edges near the pull-cord and tack back onto roller. Then stitch a new hem, slip stick through this hem and reinsert the pull-cord.

If woolen socks get soaping while on a camping trip, fill the toes with small pebbles before hanging them up to dry; this helps keep them from shrinking.

Dip a cloth in household ammonia and place over the rusted spot in the broiler of your range; close the range door for a few minutes and chances are you will be able to wash spot off easily.

Fasten that left-over piece of linoleum to the floor of the trunk of your car; wax it liberally, and see how easily grips and trunks slide in and out.

To avoid stirring up dust when sweeping a rug, sprinkle rug with bits of dampened newspapers; papers will absorb the dust preventing it from flying around the room.

Save your orange peels in the spring and fall, and when they have dried toss them into the fireplace on coolish nights; they kindle quickly and burn with a pleasant aroma.

Brush top of loaves with 1/2 cup water. Cover. Bake in moderate hot oven (350° F.) 35 minutes. Makes 4 loaves.

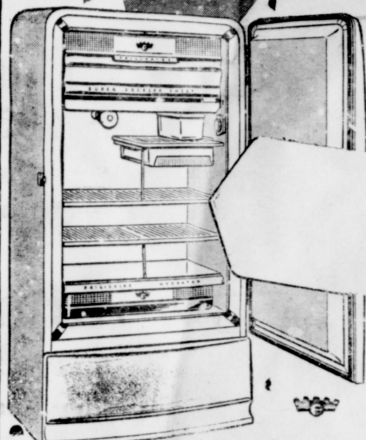

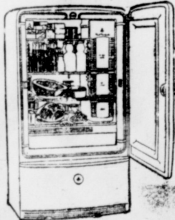
