Restriction of Army Enlistment Is Announced

Information has been received by S-Sgt. J. O. Hendrick, NCO in charge of the Eastland Recruiting Station that Secretary of Defense James Forrestal, has announced that "A Selective Service registrant may not be accepted for voluntary enlistment after he has been notified by his local board to report for pre-induction physical and mental examination."

In view of the fact that the first calls will be sent in the very near future, it is important that those registrants interested in volunteering to go to or call their nearest recruiting office, located at 311 West Main Street in Eastland or telephone 482 in Eastland immediately for full information.

Registrants who desire to volunteer for an Army Technical School should bring with them a transcript of their High School credits. Another important item is a birth certificate which is required for men under 21 years of age.

Machinery Arrives For Rock Crusher

Sales Barn Begins 2 Auctions Weekly

Over \$175,000 worth of stock moved through the Sig Faircloth Auction Barn in Eastland last week as the ring moved into a two sales per week schedule.

Sales hereafter will be held each Tuesday and Thursday, instead of just on Tuesdays as in the past, it was announced.

About 1000 head of cattle with a sales value of over \$100,000 moved through the ring last Tuesday and on Thursday about 650 head with a sales value of about \$75,000 were auctioned.

Cattle and other stock being sold in the ring are coming from far parts of Texas as the Eastland ring has taken on the aspect of a regional center for stock disposal.

Football Game

The Eastland and DeLeon high school football teams will meet in a game at Maverick field in Eastland Friday night at 8:00 o'clock. This is expected to be a good game since Eastland defeated Winters last Friday night by a score of 13-12 and Winters had previously won over De Leon. Friday night will be Eastland's first conference game of the year.

The Concrete Materials and Construction Company of Cedar Rapids, Iowa has moved in a large amount of machinery to the C. S. Eldridge farm one and one-half miles East of Carbon where they will put in a large rock crusher to be used in crushing rock for dams to be built in Texas. Mr. LeRoy Ramer, who has been here for several weeks, is superintendent of the work.

Jesse Collins, Elmo Heflin, Wilbur Blake, James Martin and Wilford Meyer, who have been employed by the company for some time, are here to help with construction of the equipment. A considerable amount of money will be spent in the construction of this equipment and will be in operation for several years which will mean a large payroll. From 60 to 100 men will be employed and it is expected to be in operation by December 1.

The daily production of rock will be from 80 to 100 carloads per day. All the crushed aggregates used in the concrete for the dams will be crushed at the quarry including the manufacture of the sand.

There will be an excess of finer material which will probably be available for agriculture limestone. All material will be shipped by the M. K. & T. railroad to the dam site. The Concrete Material and Construction Company will maintain and operate their own switch engine and crew.

Reed, Martin, and Grace, contractors of Clifton, are doing the railroad track and dump work under the supervision of R. M. Russell on track and C. J. Champ, iron superintendent of dump work. There will be about three and one-half miles of track laid to take care of the loading and shipping of the material.

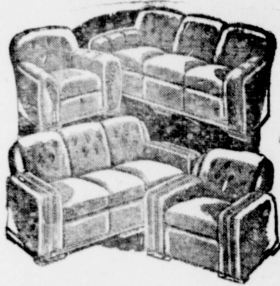
