In conjunction with the Pecan Show, the Eastland County Home Demonstation Club ladies will be sponsoring a concession stand which will feature homemade pies, cakes, and coffee during the two day show, announces Mrs. Janet Thomas and Judy Dedeck, Eastland County Hime Demonstration Agents.

All entries of 4-H Home Demonstration Club members in the youth and adult divisions of the Bake Show will be sold with proceeds going to the 4-H Council and Home Demonstration Council respect-

Who can enter the Bake Show (adult and youth divisions), or the centerpiece arrangments division? Any woman or man of youth in Eastland County or adjoining county. All entries will be welcomed, and ae due on Friday, December 13 by 11 a. m. when the judging will begin. Ribbons and cash awards will be presented to the top three winners in each division.

The rules and information

pertaining to the Bake Show and Centerpiece arrangements are the following:

EASTLAND COUNTY PECAN BAKE SHOW RULES

ADULT DIVISION 1. There shall be five divisions of products with a requirement for each: (a) Pies - must enter one whole pie. (b) Cakes — must enter one whole cake. (c) Candy — must enter at east 8 pieces. (d) Nut bread - must enter one whole loaf. (e) Cookies - must enter at lest 8 cookies.

2. All entries must contain Pecans.

3. Anyone, man or woman, may enter products in the

4. All entries must be entered and in place by 11 a. m. Friday, December 13, when the judging will begin. (5.) The three judges will be trained in Home Economics. (6.) Score cards will be used to judge entries in all 5 divisions and cash prizes and ribbons awarded according to score. Cash awards shall be as follows: 1st place, \$2.50; 2nd place, \$1.50; and 3rd place,

7. There will be a Grand Champion and Reserve Champion for the whole show. Cash awards shall be as follows Champion - \$5.00; Reserve Champion - \$4.00.

Great Plains Program Here Shows Results in Past Years

The Great Plains Conservation Program is making a big increase in Land treatment. The annual report of the Upper Leon Soil and Water Conservation District, 1968 fiscal year, reveals that 5% of the 2,305 district cooperators have G. P. contracts.

These contracts are based on a conservation plan that meets the needs of the land. In the Great Plains contracts all permanent type practices are written with cost-share, while the management practices are to be carried out at the land owners cost. Not only do these practices preserve the land, but it has been proven that land productivity has increased

from 25 to 100%. Of the present 5% District Cooperators with contracts, 80% of the total range seeding was done, 27% of the cropland that was converted to grass was done, 22% of the diversions, 20% of the brush control, 16% of t h e tame pasture planting, 14% of the stock ponds and 7% of the parallel terrace were establish-

All practices of the 25 contracts which expired during t h e last two or three years and landowners a r e contining are their management and t h e places look better than at t h e date of expiration.



COUNTY AX OFFICE IS BUSY YEA ..- AROUND

ticle VIII, Section 14: There shall be elected by the qualified electors of each county an Assessor and Collector of Taxes . . . who shall perform all the duties with respect to assessing property for the purpose of taxation and of collection taxes as may be prescribed by the Legislat-

Eastland County Tax Collector Edgar Altom was elected to the office in 1964 and reelected in the primary held in May of this year.

His office assesses and collects taxes: ad valorem es for the county and state and school taxes for two districts on the eastern edge of the county and one on the western edge of th county. (Putmm has a half mile strip of its eastern edge in this county, although the town itself is in another county.)

License plates are sold in

the office, and all title changes are handled there. Altom said this year the office will sell 9,300 passenger car licenses, 2,700 truck trailer and commercial, 1,450 farm venicle, more than a thousand for special trailers, (house trailers, etc.,) 150 for motor buses and truck tractors, and some 200 for motorcycles.

Tax collections, averaged for the years 1963 through 1967, were 92.61 percent of the amount assessed. Altom says "We collect delinquent taxes regularly, along with current taxes, which would raise the average slightly."

The office also handles voter registration, which is required for every voter. To be eligible to vote, anyone must register between Oct. 1, 1968 and Jan. 31, 1969.

The office occupies two large offices in the main floor space in a courthouse basement vault. A check of


