FRIENDS IN NEED AND DEED

Helpful Service Is Watchword Of Camp Fire Girls' Program

"Youth must be served," say the oldsters. "Youth serves," reply the Camp Fire Girls. By spreading a spirit of friendliness, by being more neighborly, Camp Fire Girls across the country are going forward extending the right hand of friendship to those in need.

In Sherman, Tex., an enviable record of service is being made by Camp Fire Girls, who are making four trips a month to the Veterans' hospital in McKinney, Tex. More than 63 girls have wheeled ambulatory cases to water pagetas, picnics, baseball games, dances and camp shows. In this way these young people have accumulated more than 947 service hours. Each girl pays her own transportation in an army bus to and from the hospital. The older girls wheel the patients; others provide musical entertainment, set up croquet, archery, dart boards and other sports equipment. Still other groups prepare picnic lunches and roast weiners over an open fire.

Brighten Invalid's Life
 Another example of friendly service is illustrated in Portland, Ore., where Camp Fire Girls are active in the "Chin-Upper," an organization composed of people who, by reason of physical disability, are barred from many activities. The Alhambra Horizon club (Camp Fire's senior group) has adopted one "Chin-Upper" as its own special project. Club members pay regular visits, bringing gifts and flowers, thus helping to make her tedious hours of invalidism brighter.

Aid Polio Drive
 Young members of the Reading-Berks county council of Camp Fire Girls, participate in a project aimed to bring cheer to patients in a Reading, Pa., hospital. The girls furnish tray favors which gladden meals at the institution.

During this year's financial campaign of the Silver Bow chapter of the National Foundation for Infantile Paralysis in Butte, Mont., Camp Fire Girls in that city did their bit to combat polio by addressing March-of-Dimes folders.

When fire completely destroyed the home of a Battle Creek, Mich., veteran and his wife, a few hours after the birth of their child, the Camp Fire Girls made a house-to-house canvass in the community and collected \$181.27 for the homeless family.

During the Christmas season Santa received a helping hand from Tulare, Calif., Camp Fire Girls, who made puppets for the Children's hospital in San Francisco. One hundred puppets were made, enough for each patient in the hospital, and each gift was accompanied by a personal greeting card from the young puppet maker.

Entertainment for students in at the Camp Fire agenda too, as is shown by a project of a Fargo, N. D., group. The girls visit the Jamestown Crippled Children's Home and put on a program of solos, dancing, readings and songs. The group also presented the patients with 63 baskets of candy and a donation of \$5 from the group treasury.

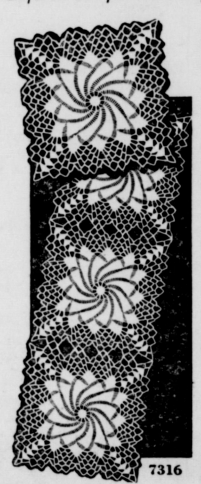

Pressure Saucepan Saves Time and Fuel

IN A comparatively short time the
pressure saucepan has won an
assured place in farm kitchens, ac-
cording to Laura Dailey, in an article
in *Casper's Farmer*, one of the
best known farm magazines.
It saves time and fuel. Many
different foods may be prepared in
a pressure saucepan. It is particu-
larly good for those which need long
cooking. "Pressure cooking," Miss



Dailey says, "preserves food value,
color and flavor."

A few rules of operation are im-
portant:

- 1.—Never fill the pan more than
two-thirds full.
 - 2.—Be sure that steam flows
steadily from vent before you close
it.
 - 3.—Wait until weight or pressure
control jiggles or hisses or cooking
indicator is at right position to your
directions before you start count-
ing time. Then reduce the heat and
let cook for specified time.
 - 4.—Reduce the pressure as each
recipe indicates.
 - 5.—After pressure is reduced, be
certain to remove the weight, or
lift the pressure control, before re-
moving cover.
- Some farm women are doing a
limited amount of canning in their
pressure saucepans, Miss Dailey
points out.

World Mission of Church

Lesson for February 29, 1918

JOHN WESLEY said, "The world is my parish." Many another Christian has entertained this great concept, and that is precisely what Jesus wants us to understand concerning the scope and scope of his Kingdom.

Sunday's lesson brings us to consider three great passages — Acts 10:8-10; Romans 10:8-15; Ephesians 3:8-12. Read these carefully, and you will find a message of God lifting up the flaps of the tent of your small habitations until you will catch glimpses of the far horizon.

AROUND THE HOUSE

Skim milk is a good cleaner for paper lamp-shades. Apply the milk by sponging it up with a soft cloth. If the cloth roughens the paper, avoid this method. If the lampshade will stand a sponging with soap and water it will stand the skim milk cleaning.

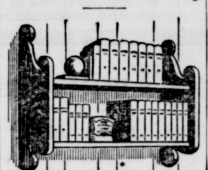
Iron a monogram or embroidery by placing it face down on a Turkish towel, pressing dry on the wrong side. This method tends to raise the pattern and permits the background material to be ironed satisfactorily.

Use old worn-out blankets to cover your ironing board. The heavy pile makes a fine pad for ironing.

If foods spill and stain the oven of your range, rub the stain with household ammonia and leave a cloth saturated with ammonia on the bottom of the oven for several hours. Wash the stained area with warm, soapy water, then with clear water, and wipe dry.

Pull dangling threads to the inside of the garment and tie them securely inside.
