**STUDY IN CONTRASTS Lush Tropics, Frozen Arctic Embraced in Overseas Parks**

Two of the great national parks, which belong to the people of the United States, lie in our territories overseas — Hawaii National park on the islands of Hawaii and Maui in the Hawaiian archipelago and Mount McKinley National park in Alaska. These two parks present a study in contrasts. Hawaii, within the tropics, basks in perpetual spring. Its forests were lush ferns 400 feet high are gay with birds of brilliant plumage. McKinley, on the other hand, enjoys a brief summer season of warmth, and during most of the year sleeps in Arctic silence. Here in winter some of the birds and small animals even don white habits to travel like spectres over the snowy landscape.

Hawaii National park was established by act of congress on August 1, 1916, and was placed under administration of National Park service when it was created in the same month. Main features in the park are two spectacular volcanoes, frequently active, Kiluaea and Mauna Loa on the island of Hawaii, and one of the world's largest dormant volcanoes, Haleakala on the island of Maui. The total area within the two sections of the park is about 275 square miles. Kiluaea, probably older than its neighbor, towering Mauna Loa, creates the impression of being a crater in the side of the higher mountain, although it is itself a mountain with an altitude of 4,000 feet. This illusion is the result of a broad depression at its top and of its gentle slopes, caused by lava flows from many lateral vents. Within the depression is a vast pit, Halemaumau or "House of Fire," which often contains a boiling, bubbling mass of molten lava whose surface fluctuates from bottom to rim.

Until 1924 molten lava was usually visible at any time in Halemaumau, but activity since then has been spasmodic. Its rises are accompanied by brilliant fountains and inflows of liquid lava, and its lowerings by tremendous avalanches which send up enormous dust clouds.

To the west of Kiluaea rises the vast dome of Mauna Loa whose mountain craters, Mokuaowao, is included in the national park. Included also is a broad connecting belt between the two volcanoes, Mauna Loa thrusts its great bulk 13,680 feet above the surrounding Pacific. By eruptions in its summit crater and by flank outbreaks it is constantly adding to its mass.

In action Mauna Loa is even more spectacular than Kiluaea, and steam vents continually send feathery clouds into the air. Extending northeast and southwest from the summit are volcanic rifts with many deep rents formed by earthquake and eruption as well as many brilliantly colored spatter cones, some 200 feet in height. Twice since 1860 the City of Hebes at the base of the volcano has been threatened by great rivers of lava which have flowed down the sides of the mountain.

HALEAKALA SECTION OF Hawaii National park is on the island of Maui. This volcano derives its name, which means "House of the Sun," from a legend about the Polynesian demigod Maui, who climbed to the top of Haleakala, ensnared the rays of the sun, and forced it to travel more slowly in its course so that his mother might have sufficient time to complete her day's work. Haleakala, now rising more than 10,000 feet above sea level, was once a much higher mountain. A collapse of the dome, many years ago, formed a great crater 7 1/2 miles long and 3 miles wide, with walls over 1,000 feet high.

Both sections of the park are reached from Honolulu by island boat or airplane. From Hilo, port of Hawaii island, one may rent an automobile for the trip to Kiluaea or take the regular bus.

MOUNT MCKINLEY NATIONAL park, situated in south-central Alaska, was created by act of congress in 1917. It contains an area little more than 3,000 square miles. Principal scenic feature of the park is mighty Mount McKinley, highest peak on the North American continent. This majestic mountain rears its snow-covered head high into the clouds, reaching an altitude of 20,300 feet above sea level, and rises 17,000 above the timber line. On its north and west sides McKinley springs abruptly from a plateau only 2,500 to 3,000 feet high.

For two-thirds of the way down from its summit Mount McKinley is enveloped in snow throughout the year. Denali, "home of the sun," was the name given to this impressive mountain by the early Indians.

Near Mount McKinley are Mount Foraker, with an elevation of 17,000 feet; Mount Hunter, 14,900 feet; and Mount Russell, 11,500 feet. Great glaciers fed by the high snow fields of this mountain range flow many miles both to the north and to the south.

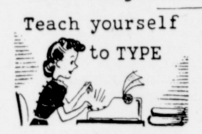
During the park season, which extends from June 10 to September 10, with more than 13 hours of daylight each day, there is a wealth of flowering plants. The park is also the home of many interesting animals and birds.

Prospective visitors to Mount McKinley National park probably will make the trip to Alaska by steamer from Seattle. To use the war constructed Alaska highway through Canada requires a special permit from the Canadian government, and permits are not yet granted to motor tourists. Business men, settlers and bus passengers may apply for permits to L. E. Drummond, Traffic Control Division, Alaska Highway, Edmonton Alberta.

**AROUND THE HOUSE**

- Split awnings often can be neatly patched with a piece of matching canvas and the rubber cement commonly used to repair inner tubes.
- To clean soiled wallpaper quickly, dip a clean cloth into dry powdered borax and rub it all over the soiled parts.

**SUNDAU SCHOOL LESSON**

**Purity of Heart and Life**

LESSON TEXT FOR AUGUST 10.—Prov. 2:1-10; 11:17; 14:21; 15:14; 31:10-12; James 1:13-15.

MEMORY SELECTION.—Keep thy heart with diligence; for out of it are the issues of life.—Prov. 4:23.

IT IS well for us to face squarely such a topic as the one assigned. It is particularly necessary to review the biblical standards with regard to holiness of life, since the day in which we live is one of lowered conceptions.

We need to spend time with the precious gems of the Word of God that we may clearly understand how he would have us live.

**I. True Wisdom Involves The Fear of Jehovah (Prov. 2:1-5)**

IN THE opening chapters of Proverbs, Wisdom is personified. Anyone who believes in Jesus Christ cannot help understanding something of his relationship to wisdom. In him "are hid all the treasures of wisdom and knowledge" (Col. 2:3). To those of us who trust him, he has been made unto us wisdom (1 Cor. 1:30).

In this passage in Proverbs the point is that if we observe his commandments, if we incline our ear unto wisdom, if we apply our hearts to understanding, if we long for discernment, as earnestly as we would seek for silver and hidden treasures, we shall understand the fear of the Lord and find the knowledge of God.

God will meet every individual who really wants to know him. Says the Lord, "If any will eth to do his will, he shall know . . ." (John 7:17).

**II. True Wisdom Involves Holiness of Life (Prov. 2:10-17; 4:14-17; 5:1-3).**

TO truly know God is, of course, to be spared the heartache which results from being deceived by sin and Satan. When wisdom enters the heart, the result is discretion and understanding (Prov. 2:10, 11). Thus God delivers us from the way of evil and from the way of death.

Attention should be given to the description of these evil men in verses 12-15; they speak perverse things; they forsake the paths of uprightness; they walk in the ways of darkness; they rejoice to do evil; they delight in the perverseness of evil; their paths are crooked and wayward. Deliverance from the strange woman is likewise vouchsafed, as we have true wisdom. The description of these women is informative—flattering, forgetful of both friends and God; their lips drop honey, their mouths are smoother than oil. Notice the conclusion of the matter: In the end they are bitter as wormwood, sharp as a dagger, their feet go down to death, and their steps take hold on Sheol.

How much we need God's wisdom in this world. It is easy to be deceived.

**III. True Wisdom Means Peace at the End (Prov. 4:18-27).**

TO walk with God, to walk in wisdom, is indeed as the dawning light, shining more and more unto the perfect day. If there were no other reward for living for God (and there are many, many others), the benediction at eventide would be enough to cause us to think seriously before we flout the ways of God.

**IV. A Representative of True Wisdom (Prov. 31:10-12).**

THIS passage describes the wise woman. She is indeed to be extolled. The worthy woman, the woman who loves God, the woman who is therefore wise, is in price far above rubies.

V. Sir's History (James 1:13-15). THE wise man, the man who will be pure in heart and life, ought to understand something of the history of sin in his individual life. The history of personal evil is, that because of our lust we are enticed. Thus when lust has conceived (that is to say, we have succumbed to the enticement), sin is born, and sin, when it is finished—but it is never finished; it goes on and on; no power on earth can arrest it—bringeth forth death.

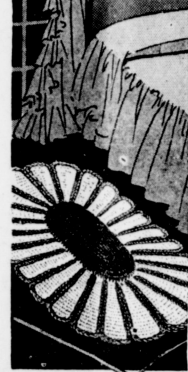

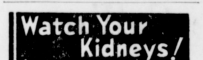
