9,242,000 Farm Workers

The number of farm workers in America today is estimated at 9,242,000, compared with 9,121,000 at this time last year and 12,052,000 before the first world war, the Department of Agriculture says. Of this number about 7,500,000 are designated as family workers and about 1,700,000 as hired hands. The average wage, not counting board, today is \$4.77 a day compared with \$1.44 during the 1935-39 period.

War Launched On Tsetse Fly

Conquest of Dread Bug That Carries Sleeping Death Is Aided by DDT.

LONDON.—The only thing standing in the way of a mammoth project for early colonization and agricultural development of the African territories of Tanganyika, Kenya and southern Rhodesia is the sleep death carried by the bite of a dread tsetse fly.

Airplane spraying of DDT and use of other modern methods give the British government confidence that the deadly insect can be conquered and the immense natural resources of the territory can be opened up.

Plans recently announced and partially launched call for expenditure of 100 million dollars on conversion of 3,317,000 acres to agriculture, with a first huge planting of peanuts, to relieve the world-wide famine of edible fats.

Heavy duty tractors and earth-shifting machinery are being shipped from America by the African Development subsidiary of Unilever, Ltd., which is undertaking management for the British Labor government.

Clearance of the bush and extermination of the tsetse fly is the first important step in the project, which will yield 600,000 tons of peanuts annually.

Once the land has been cleared, it is believed that the tsetse fly can be eliminated or at least fully controlled by use of DDT.

When a human is infected by the tsetse fly the first stage is not discernible, except by a microscopic blood examination.

After about two months the patient suffers from convulsions and pains in the chest. Loss of weight and strength follows, after which death comes in state of exhaustion.

DDT Found Effective.

South African scientists have found after lengthy tests that the powerful insecticide, DDT, has a very great effect on the tsetse fly, and in most cases causes death of the germ carrier.

Spraying the bush from the air is one method that is being considered. This can be accomplished with use of airplanes and would be similar to pest control as practiced in the United States.

One disadvantage, however, that may rule out possibility of airplane "dusting" is the fact that the fly resides in bush that is protected by large trees.

Until now any bush clearance has been the result of native clearing teams organized by the department of small health.

The teams made up of 80 to 100 natives cut all the grass, shrubs and branches, which are later burned just before the rainy season.

The sleeping sickness service during the past 10 years has examined millions of Africans and treated several thousands of cases revealed by examination.

U. S. Sells 4,313 Vessels; 2,192 Still Remain Unsold

WASHINGTON.—The foreign liquidation commission announced that it had sold 4,313 surplus vessels, mostly to private individuals and commercial concerns.

So far, an announcement said, 6,505 small craft had been declared surplus by the armed forces. Of the 2,192 remaining to be sold, 1,585 are now at Manila.

Stations in Arctic Assigned to U. S.

Canada Cooperates in Moving Development Plan.

OTTAWA, ONT.—United States and Canadian cooperation in development of the arctic for defense and commercial purposes moved an important step forward with a joint announcement that nine weather stations are to be jointly built in the northern Canadian wastelands within the next three years.

Two of the stations are to be finished this year, one of them at Eureka sound on Ellesmere island, barely 600 miles from the north pole. The other three are to be at the west at Winter Harbor on Melville island. The other seven will be south of these.

Both governments confined their announcements to the advantages of improving the weather reporting system, but strategists noted the military value of constantly maintaining installations athwart the air routes over the polar ice cap.

American military forces will undertake virtually all of the construction, it is understood. The Ellesmere island station, for instance, is to be built by Americans operating from the joint U. S.-Canadian weather station at Thule, Greenland.

Announcement of the weather reporting project coincided with tabling in parliament of the Canadian government's financial estimates for the fiscal year beginning April 1.

Defensive expenditures are reduced by \$2 per cent, from \$501,345,000 to \$339,741,000.

Atomic energy expenses are to be cut out from \$85,000 to \$5,838,000, of which \$5,573,000 is for the top secret plutonium producing plant at Chalk River, Ont.

Find Pockets of Walking Like a Boy's

NEW YORK.—The average boy—trustees of the Madison Square Boys Club found out—is a walking 5-and-10-cent store.

The club pulled a surprise pocket census of its 250 guests, and 18-year-old Thomas Belmonte won with a couple of items to spare.

His bulging pockets coughed up 42 different items, including two picture holders, a calendar, four bits of wood, two keys, a toy whip, four medals, a deck of cards and a pair of dice.

New Device Doubles Power of Engine and Eliminates Valves

WASHINGTON.—The commerce department displayed a device which its German inventor said was capable of doubling the power output of the conventional automobile engine.

A department report credited the invention to Dr. Adolph Schuerle and described it as a "loop scavenging" system of blowing out exhaust gases from combustion engines.

Schuerle told a department investigator, the report said, that it eliminates need for intake valves.

It could be used, the department added, on an automobile engine or any other of internal combustion type.

Dr. Schuerle claims, the report continued, that tests had shown a two-stroke, two-cycle engine with loop scavenger could produce twice as much power per cylinder as a conventional four-cycle engine.

The loop-scavenging system has parts in the cylinder walls arranged in such positions and at such angles that the blast of scavenging air makes a loop inside the cylinder, cleaning out the burned gases.

The device probably will be turned over to American engineers for further research.

Rubber Goods Output Soars To Double Prewar Peak of '40

NEW YORK.—Rubber manufacturers, employing 300,000 workers, produced a whopping 2.3 billion dollars worth of finished goods in 1946, more than double the peak growth total of 1940.

In a relatively strike-free year, marked by only one five-week shutdown (General Tire & Rubber company, Akron), the industry responded with 88 million tires—66 for automobiles and 22 for trucks and other vehicles.

"In 1947 we'll produce 80 million more and get the whole country back on a 32 million for passenger cars, the rest for other vehicles," Herbert E. Smith, president of the United States Rubber company, predicted.

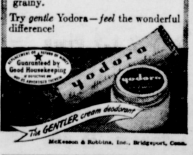
