Five Orchards On Tour Route For Eastland Pecan Growers

Those attending the fourth annual tour of the Eastland County Pecan Growers Association on Sept. 29 will see five orchards on the all day affair, according to Oscar Schaefer, Cook, president of the sponsoring organization.

Plans for the tour call for those attending to leave from the Rock Market Building at Rising Star at 9 a. m. on the above date with the first stop to be at the C. E. Smith orchard just a short distance southwest of that city. Smith, incidentally, serves as a director in both the county organization as well as the Texas Pecan Growers Association.

Near Gorman, the orchards of D. J. Jobe and Charley Underwood will be inspected just prior to lunch and a business session at the Brown Jug Cafe there.

In the afternoon the orchards of Sheriff J. B. Williams on Nash Creek, between Staff and Gorman as well as the orchard and nursery of B. B. Freeman in the Cheaney Community, 10 miles south of Ranger, will be visited. Freeman is Secretary-Treasurer of the county group.

According to County Agricultural Agent J. M. Cooper, other officers and directors of the sponsoring group who helped to plan the affair at a recent meeting in Cisco included the following, besides those mentioned above, Pete Manning, Cisco, vice president; C. E. Barton, Gomer; Wayne Thurman, Cisco and Frank Hightower of Eastland.

Cooper said that all of the orchards except one was on deep sandy soil.

Moss Control In Tank Will Be Topic Of Nimrod, Cisco Meeting

The A&M Specialist will discuss weed and moss control in detail at the meeting as well as stocking rates of fish, fertilization and other management practices according to the County Agricultural Agent, J. M. Cooper.

HOME MAKERS

Views and News

ALUMINUM — Never leave food in an aluminum pan any longer than necessary. Wash with a mild soap and water or a mild detergent soon after using them. Leaving food in them causes the formation of pits or holes, thus making them harder to clean. Use steel wool to scour or a mild abrasive such as whit-

ing. Rinse well with hot water and dry carefully. Never use soda, lye, strong soaps or other strong alkalis in aluminum pans. If an aluminum pan becomes slightly discolored, boil it in something that is acid, such as vinegar and water or cream of tartar.

ENAMELWARE — Treat as you would for glass. Usually this can be cleaned simply by washing with mild soap and water. Soak in water before cleaning if something has been burned in it. Do not scrape it. easily cleaned. Take off food that sticks with a gritless clean-

ing powder such as whiting or extremely fine steel wool. Otherwise keep it clean with the usual washing with hot suds of mild soap, rinsing and careful drying.

IRON — is an old stand-by. Scour iron with steel wool and use a strong alkaline soap to remove grease. If food sticks on iron, soak the utensil in a hot water soda solution using 3 Tablespoons of soda to one quart of water. Bring this to a boil. Scrub with a stiff brush and scouring powder. Wash with hot soapy water, rinse and dry. Always keep iron thoroughly dry. Just a little moisture will

cause it to rust. If it does rust, remove the rust with scouring powder and steel wool.

SILVER — Remove any tarnish immediately. The best way to keep silver free from tarnish is to use it. Wash it regularly in a mild soap suds, rinse well and dry thoroughly. You should avoid soaking hollow handled silver pieces in hot water. The cement holding the handles may loosen. There are a number of methods and preparations which may be used satisfactorily for polishing silver.

Questions & Answers

Q — I'm confused about the term "Korea veteran." What are the official time limits that determine whether or not a former member of the armed forces is considered to be a veteran of the Korean Conflict?

A — The Korean Conflict, by official definition, extends from June 27, 1950, to January 31, 1955. Any veteran with all or part of his service between these two dates is considered a Korea veteran.

Q — As a veteran with a service-connected disability rated 50-percent I have been receiving extra compensation for a dependent daughter. Recently she passed age 18. Was I supposed to report this to VA?

A — Yes. As soon as your daughter reached age 18 she was no longer legally a dependent. VA is not permitted to pay you extra compensation for her, and money received for her after age 18 must be returned.

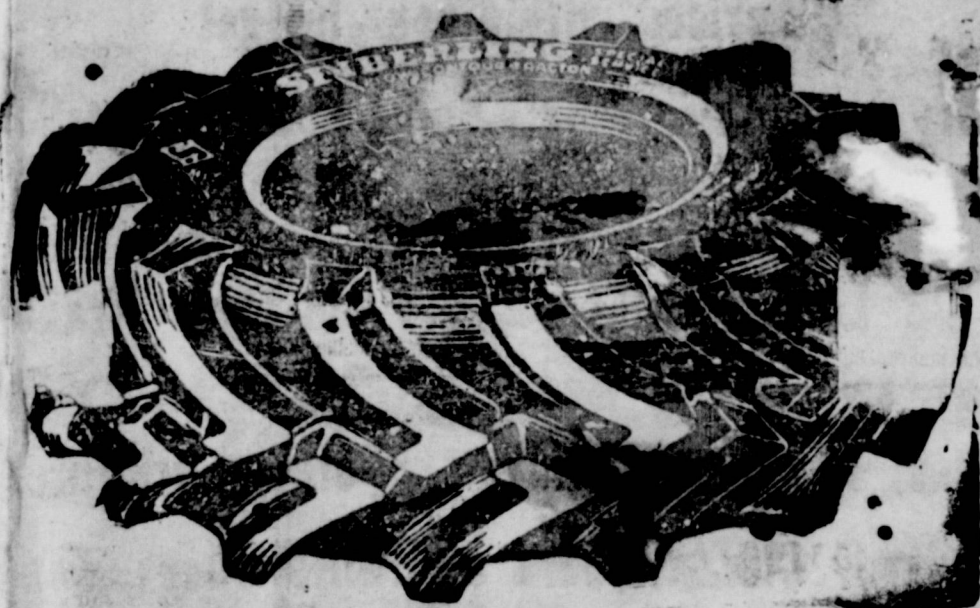
