### Farm Operators Must Ask Refund Gas Tax Soon

Farm operators have until September 30 to claim a refund of the federal gasoline tax on all gasoline used on the farm, according to information here.

The refund applies to the three cents per gallon federal tax on gasoline which was purchased from July 1, 1958, through June 30, 1959. Those who filed a claim for refund in 1958 will receive form 2240 through the mail. Others who wish to make a claim should ask the Internal Revenue Service to send them one.

The claim should be sent to the Office of the District Director, Internal Revenue Service, Austin or Dallas, Texas, depending on whether you live in the southern or northern part of Texas. Claims made after September 30 will not be paid and no more than one claim can be filed for the twelve months period, states the economist.

Farmers who file claims for refund should keep sufficient records to certify the accuracy of the refund claimed. The records should show the purchase dates, the gallons bought and the gallons used on the farm during the twelve months period. Also the gasoline used by custom operators doing custom work for a farmer should be recorded and can be included in the claim for refund.

Excise taxes paid on diesel fuel or special motor fuels for farm purposes can also be recovered to repay the taxes on the fuel bought. The dealer should be furnished a signed statement, showing the name and address of the purchaser, the date of purchase and gallons purchased.

## HOME MAKERS Views and News

Are some of your varnished pieces dull looking, sticky or soiled? If so, here's a "face-lifting" and cleaning suggestion:

In a double boiler combine  
1 qt. hot water  
1 tablespoon gum turpentine (to cut the dirt)  
3 tablespoons boiled linseed oil or lemon oil (to lubricate, feed and polish the wood).

Keep the mixture hot in the double boiler while you work. Dip a soft cloth in the solution, wring out excess moisture and apply to furniture doing only one part of the piece at a time. Rub the wood, keeping moisture away from the joints as much as possible. Fine steel wool may be used to rub the solution on badly soiled surfaces. Wipe the surface immediately with a dry cloth. Polish with a woolen cloth.

Summer may call for a "fresh-up" paint job in the kitchen or bathroom on walls or woodwork. Paints flow on smoothly and dry quickly today. They are designed for specific purposes, for ease of maintenance and years of lasting attractiveness.

Some paints are even heat re-

sistant. For areas where moisture is present much of the time, such as bath and kitchen, an alkyd semi-gloss or alkyd gloss enamel is recommended. Both of these are designed to resist moisture and abrasion so they can be scrubbed.

Color is no problem since the new paints come in many tints and shades. For areas where white is desired, there are non-yellowing white alkyd flat, semi-gloss and gloss enamels available.

There is one thing about paint that hasn't changed. That's the fact that it must be applied to a clean, smooth surface for best results. If old paint has not chipped, wash it down with a solvent before applying the new paint. Study directions on label.

Here's a good party nibble. Combine a small package cream cheese with a quarter cup chopped ripe olives and season with grated onion and Worcestershire sauce. Spread on thin slices of large bologna. Roll tightly, wrap in waxed paper and chill. Cut into half inch slices and serve on toothpicks.

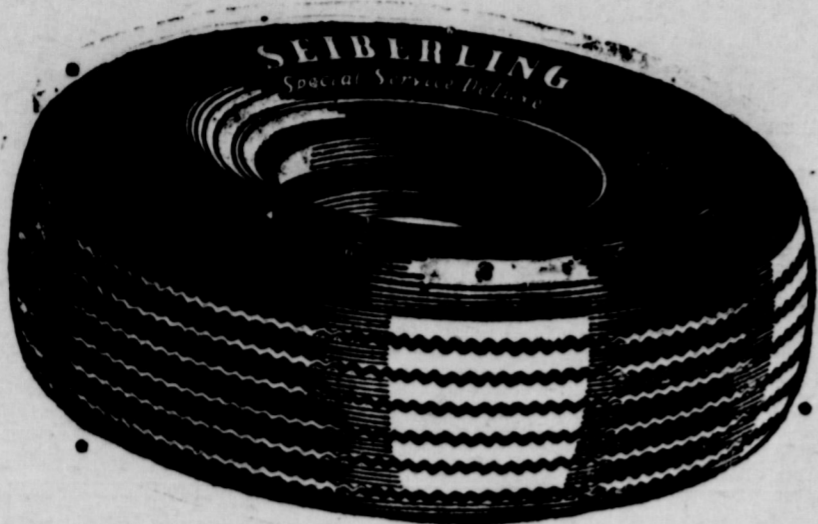

## World War II Vets Enter Last Year For Loans

DALLAS — World War II veterans have entered the final year in which application may be made for a GI home, farm or business loan.

Congress has set July 25, 1960, as the cut-off date in the post-war program that has already seen nearly 5 million World War II veterans take advantage of the GI Bill loan provisions since June 22, 1944.

The law allows an additional year, or until July 25, 1961, for the processing and actual closing of loans.

These dates do not pertain to Korean veterans who have until January 31, 1965, to make loan applications. World War II veterans who also served in Korea are considered Korean veterans for loan purposes.

Under the GI loan program, qualified World War II veterans are offered the opportunity to obtain VA guaranteed or insured loans to (a) purchase, build or

## Post Office Dept. To Issue Special SCS Stamp Soon

The Upper Leon Soil Conservation District is one of more than 2800 such districts throughout the country being honored by the issuance of a commemorative soil conservation stamp by the Post Office Department according to Clint McCain.

The stamp is to be issued August 26 at Rapid City, South Dakota at the annual meeting of the Soil Conservation Society of America. It will go on sale at local post offices the following day. Mr. McCain stated, the stamp is in three colors, depicts a modern conservation farm, and is of four cent denomination.

The Upper Leon Soil Conservation District was organized by local farmers and ranchers on

Since the program was launched and up through May 31 1959, a total of 4,955,300 World War II veterans have made GI loans for a total face value of \$39,220,608,200.

Of this total 4,657,100 loans of were made for dwellings; 228,400 for business ventures and 69,800 for farms and equipment.

In all, 35 percent of the eligible World War II veterans have taken advantage of the loan program. An exceptionally low record of defaults has won the approval of the nation's financial leaders and an extremely high percentage of the loans have already been repaid in advance of the final due dates.

March 20, 1941. The District now has 3125 cooperators of whom 2310 have basic conservation plans. The District is governed by a board consisting of B. B. Hickman of Rising Star; Clint McCain of Eastland; Henry W. Turney of Dublin; Wade George of De Leon; and W. J. Fritts of Comanche.

Technical assistance is provided to the District by the Soil Conservation Service. E. E. McAlister is in charge of the local S.C.S. Work Unit at Eastland. Other S.C.S. men working with the District out of Eastland are W. L. Garner and Guy Hertson.

Here are some of the accomplishments made by the District and its cooperators in the past year: 175 basic farm plans developed, 205 land owners became new cooperators, 159 miles of terraces constructed, 63542 acres of proper use on rangeland, 39479 acres of rangeland deferred from grazing for grass improvement, and 290 farm ponds constructed. District cooperators received Federal Cost Share payments on many of the above practices through local A.S.C. County Committees.

The Soil Conservation Stamp, McCain said, is a salute to progress in our own district and other such districts across the country.
